HOUSE BILL NO. 840

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 8, CHAPTER 46, LAWS OF 2021, TO
 2 REVISE THE FISCAL YEAR 2022 APPROPRIATION TO THE STATE TREASURER'S
 3 OFFICE TO CHANGE THE AMOUNT THAT IS AVAILABLE IN THE SUPPORT
 4 PROGRAMS BUDGET; TO AMEND SECTION 2, CHAPTER 51, LAWS OF 2021, TO
 5 REVISE THE FISCAL YEAR 2022 APPROPRIATION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF
 6 AGRICULTURE AND COMMERCE TO CORRECT THE NAME OF AN EVENT FOR WHICH
 7 THE DEPARTMENT MAY PROVIDE FINANCIAL SUPPORT; TO AMEND SECTION 11,
 8 CHAPTER 82, LAWS OF 2021, TO REVISE THE FISCAL YEAR 2022
 9 APPROPRIATION TO THE MISSISSIPPI NATIONAL GUARD TO AUTHORIZE THE
 10 MISSISSIPPI ADJUTANT GENERAL TO TRANSFER CAPITAL EXPENSE FUNDS
 11 WITHIN THE MILITARY DEPARTMENT TO FACILITATE FEDERAL GRANT
 12 MATCHING REQUIREMENTS; TO AMEND SECTION 20, CHAPTER 100, LAWS OF
 13 2021, TO REVISE THE FISCAL YEAR 2022 APPROPRIATION TO THE
 14 MISSISSIPPI DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY TO CLARIFY THE NAME OF A
 15 RECIPIENT OF PROJECT FUNDS FROM THE GULF COAST RESTORATION FUND;
 16 TO AMEND SECTION 29, CHAPTER 102, LAWS OF 2021, TO REVISE THE
 17 FISCAL YEAR 2022 APPROPRIATION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND
 18 ADMINISTRATION TO CLARIFY AND CORRECT THE NAMES AND PURPOSES OF
 19 SEVERAL PROJECTS FUNDED FROM THE CAPITAL EXPENSE FUND; AND FOR
 20 RELATED PURPOSES.

21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

22 **SECTION 1.** Section 8, Chapter 46, Laws of 2021, is amended
 23 as follows:

24 Section 8. Of the funds appropriated to the State Treasury
 25 under the provisions of Section 1, the following amounts shall be
 26 available for expenditure in the following program budgets:



27 (a) Mississippi Prepaid Affordable College Tuition
 28 program \$ 1,854,655.00.
 29 (b) Mississippi Affordable College Savings
 30 program \$ 177,860.00.
 31 (c) Treasury Office - Support
 32 programs \$ * * * 3,681,196.00.

33 Further, no funds to the credit of the Mississippi Prepaid
 34 Affordable College Tuition Administrative Fund shall be expended
 35 for purposes related to any program other than the Mississippi
 36 Prepaid Affordable College Tuition program.

37 **SECTION 2.** Section 2, Chapter 51, Laws of 2021, is amended
 38 as follows:

39 Section 2. The following sums, or so much thereof as may be
 40 necessary, are appropriated out of any money in the State General
 41 Fund, not otherwise appropriated, to the State Department of
 42 Agriculture and Commerce as follows:

43 (a) For the support of annual roundup shows for junior
 44 exhibitors of junior steers, junior breeding cattle, beef cattle,
 45 dairy cattle, hogs, sheep and goats, for the fiscal year beginning
 46 July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022.....\$ 54,066.00.

47 (b) To supplement the funds paid by the State
 48 Department of Agriculture and Commerce for livestock premiums at
 49 the State Fair, all livestock premiums to be paid on the American
 50 system of judging (1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, etc.) on all classes



51 entered in the senior division for the fiscal year beginning July
52 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022\$ 18,565.00.

53 (c) For the county livestock shows in offering and
54 paying prizes or awards to competitors in the approved county
55 livestock shows of Mississippi, for the fiscal year beginning July
56 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022\$ 12,644.00.

57 Provided, however, that of the amount herein appropriated in
58 paragraph (c), not more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00)
59 shall be expended or used in any one (1) county of the state
60 during each fiscal year. Provided, further, that none of the
61 monies herein appropriated in paragraph (c) shall be used in
62 offering or paying prizes or awards for any livestock show that is
63 not held where there are adequate barns, pens and other facilities
64 available for such a show.

65 Provided, further, in paragraph (c) that the management of
66 such shows shall be in the hands of a county livestock
67 association, and such association shall guarantee a minimum amount
68 of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) to be used in the paying of
69 prizes, premiums or awards, and after said county show has been
70 held and premiums paid, fifty percent (50%) of the amount, not
71 exceeding One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), shall be paid upon
72 requisition to the State Department of Agriculture and Commerce.

73 Provided, further, in paragraph (c) that in any county which
74 has two (2) shows with proper facilities, and a contiguous county
75 has no such fair and desires to participate in a fair to be held



76 in an adjoining county, each of the two (2) fairs in one (1)
77 county may receive an equal proportion of the funds hereby
78 appropriated, provided, both shows shall not receive an aggregate
79 sum of more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00).

80 (d) For the purpose of offering awards and prizes to
81 competitors in the five (5) district livestock shows, for the
82 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022
83\$ 54,585.00.

84 (e) For the purpose of offering awards and prizes to
85 competitors in the five (5) state dairy shows as provided in
86 Section 69-5-101 et seq., Mississippi Code of 1972, for the fiscal
87 year beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022.....
88\$ 7,066.00.

89 Provided, further, that no part of the money herein
90 appropriated under the provisions of paragraphs (d) and (e) shall
91 be used for any other purpose than to pay premium awards at said
92 shows and state shows and expositions receiving legislative
93 appropriation shall not conflict in dates in order that livestock
94 exhibitors may make the circuit of shows. Provided, further, that
95 none of the above-mentioned funds shall be paid to any district
96 shows unless shows are held prior to roundup.

97 Not less than seventy-five percent (75%) of the funds herein
98 appropriated under the provisions of paragraphs (d) and (e) shall
99 be used in awarding prizes or premiums to 4-H Club members and



100 Smith-Hughes School members and other boys and girls having
101 entries in said shows.

102 All funds herein appropriated under the provisions of
103 paragraphs (d) and (e) for the five (5) district livestock shows
104 and the five (5) fall state dairy shows shall be distributed in
105 such manner that the livestock exhibitors will each draw equal
106 premium awards for comparable grades and placings at each of the
107 said five (5) district spring shows and the five (5) fall state
108 shows. The management of each district spring show and each state
109 fall show shall submit to the State Department of Agriculture and
110 Commerce, within fifteen (15) days after the close of each said
111 show, a full report on the number of exhibitors at each said show,
112 with the grades and placings of the different classes of livestock
113 exhibited.

114 The State Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce, together
115 with a committee of three (3) to be named by the President of the
116 Mississippi Livestock Council from that organization, shall
117 summarize and prepare a unified list of awards for like classes in
118 all spring district livestock shows and fall state dairy shows
119 receiving state premium money, as authorized in paragraphs (d) and
120 (e). The State Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce shall
121 approve and present a requisition to the State Fiscal Officer for
122 the payment of the amount of funds in paragraphs (d) and (e) due
123 each show and said State Fiscal Officer shall issue his warrant
124 thereon, and it shall be paid by the State Treasurer.



125 Provided, however, as a condition of expenditure of the funds
126 appropriated in paragraphs (d) and (e), that the board of
127 directors of any district livestock show may, in its discretion,
128 choose to hold its show in the fall instead of the spring. If
129 district shows are held in both spring and fall, then all funds
130 herein appropriated for the five (5) district livestock shows
131 shall be distributed in such a manner that the spring livestock
132 exhibitors will each draw equal premium awards for comparable
133 grades and placings at each district spring show, and the fall
134 livestock exhibitors will each draw equal premium awards for
135 comparable grades and placings at each district fall show.

136 (f) For promotion and expenses of the winners of the
137 Mississippi High School Rodeo for attending the national finals,
138 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021, and ending
139 June 30, 2022 \$ 11,884.00.

140 (g) For the support of the * * * Southern Cutting
141 Futurity Championship, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021,
142 and ending June 30, 2022
143\$ 42,730.00.

144 **SECTION 3.** Section 11, Chapter 82, Laws of 2021, is amended
145 as follows:

146 Section 11. The Adjutant General of Mississippi is hereby
147 authorized to transfer any part of appropriated funds, including
148 general funds and capital expense funds, to special funds, within
149 the Mississippi Military Department, to facilitate federal grant



150 matching requirements. Prior written notification of transfer
151 shall be provided to the Legislative Budget Office and the
152 Department of Finance and Administration.

153 **SECTION 4.** Section 20, Chapter 100, Laws of 2021, is amended
154 as follows:

155 Section 20. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
156 of Section 2, Fifty-two Million Seven Hundred Ninety-three
157 Thousand Dollars (\$52,793,000.00), or so much thereof, shall be
158 derived out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of
159 the Gulf Coast Restoration Fund, as created in Section 57-119-1,
160 Mississippi Code of 1972. These funds are provided for projects
161 as outlined in Section 57-119-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, for
162 assistance to local units of government, nongovernmental
163 organizations, institutions of higher learning, community
164 colleges, ports, airports, public-private partnerships, private
165 for-profit entities, private nonprofit entities and local economic
166 development entities. These funds will be reappropriated each
167 year until the project is completed.

168 Of the funds appropriated in this section the following sums
169 are provided for projects:

170 (a) To assist the Mississippi State

187 (f) To assist the Pascagoula Redevelopment

188 with downtown revitalization project\$ 3,000,000.00.

189 (g) To assist Long Beach High School with

190 the Long Beach High School Career and Technical

191 Education Center\$ 2,500,000.00.

192 (h) To assist the City of Diamondhead with

193 the Town Center District - Commercial District

194 Project\$ 2,000,000.00.

195 (i) To assist Stone County School District

219 **SECTION 5.** Section 29, Chapter 102, Laws of 2021, is amended
220 as follows:

221 Section 29. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
222 of Section 2, Ninety-seven Million Five Hundred Sixty-eight
223 Thousand Eight Hundred Dollars (\$97,568,800.00) or so much
224 thereof, shall be derived out of any money in the State Treasury



225 to the credit of the Capital Expense Fund, as created in Section
226 27-103-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, and allocated in a manner as
227 determined by the Treasurer. These funds are provided for such
228 purposes as follows:
