HOUSE BILL NO. 842

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 17-23-1, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE AN ADDITIONAL ROUND OF FIRE TRUCKS FOR COUNTIES AND MUNICIPALITIES UNDER THE RURAL FIRE TRUCK ACQUISITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 SECTION 1. Section 17-23-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 7 amended as follows:

8 17-23-1. (1) There is established the Rural Fire Truck 9 Acquisition Assistance Program to be administered by the 10 Department of Insurance for the purpose of assisting counties and 11 municipalities in the acquisition of fire trucks.

12 (2)There is created in the State Treasury a special fund to be designated as the "Rural Fire Truck Fund." The Legislature may 13 14 appropriate that amount necessary to fulfill the obligations created under this section by the Department of Insurance, from 15 the State General Fund to such special fund, which sum shall be 16 17 added to the remainder of the money transferred on July 1, 1995, and during the 1996 Regular Session to the Rural Fire Truck Fund. 18 19 Unexpended amounts remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal H. 20 year shall not lapse into the State General Fund, and any interest 21 earned on amounts in the fund shall be deposited to the credit of 22 the fund. Unobligated amounts remaining in the Rural Fire Truck 23 Fund, Fund No. 3507, or in any fund created for funds appropriated 24 or otherwise made available for this program, may be used as 25 matching funds by any county with remaining eligibility as provided herein. It is the intent of the Legislature that the 26 27 Department of Insurance continue to accept applications from the counties for fire trucks as provided in subsection (3) of this 28 29 section.

30 (3) (a) A county that meets the requirements provided herein may receive an amount not to exceed *** * *** One Million Ten 31 32 Thousand Dollars (\$1,010,000.00) as provided in subparagraphs (i), 33 (ii), (iii), (iv), (v), (vi), (vii), (viii), (ix), (x), (xi), 34 (xii), (xiii) * * *, (xiv) and (xv) of this paragraph, and such 35 amount shall be divided as follows: an amount of not more than 36 Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) per fire truck for the first six (6) trucks and not more than Seventy Thousand Dollars 37 38 (\$70,000.00) per fire truck for the seventh, eighth, ninth, tenth and eleventh trucks, and not more than Ninety Thousand Dollars 39 40 (\$90,000.00) per fire truck for the twelfth, thirteenth * * *, fourteenth and fifteenth truck. Monies distributed under this 41 42 chapter shall be expended only for the purchase of new fire trucks and such trucks must meet the National Fire Protection Association 43 (NFPA) standards in the 1900 series. 44

61 (iii) Any county that has received two (2) fire 62 trucks under this section is eligible to submit an application 63 for *** * *** thirteen (13) fire trucks as follows: four (4) fire trucks at not more than Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) per 64 65 truck and five (5) fire trucks at not more than Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000.00) per truck, and *** * *** four (4) fire trucks at 66 67 not more than Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$90,000.00) per truck or a total of not more than * * * Nine Hundred Ten Thousand Dollars 68 69 (\$910,000.00).

70 (iv) Any county that has received three (3) fire 71 trucks under this section is eligible to submit an application 72 for *** * *** twelve (12) fire trucks as follows: three (3) fire 73 trucks at not more than Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) per 74 truck and five (5) fire trucks at not more than Seventy Thousand 75 Dollars (\$70,000.00) per truck, and *** * *** four (4) fire trucks at 76 not more than Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$90,000.00) per truck or a 77 total of not more than * * * Eight Hundred Sixty Thousand Dollars 78 (\$860,000.00).

79 (v) Any county that has received four (4) fire 80 trucks under this section is eligible to submit an application for *** * *** eleven (11) fire trucks as follows: two (2) fire trucks 81 82 at not more than Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) per truck and five (5) fire trucks at not more than Seventy Thousand Dollars 83 (\$70,000.00) per truck, and * * * four (4) fire trucks at not more 84 85 than Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$90,000.00) per truck or a total of 86 not more than *** * *** Eight Hundred Ten Thousand Dollars 87 (\$810,000.00).

(vi) Any county that has received five (5) fire
trucks under this section is eligible to submit an application
for * * <u>ten (10)</u> fire trucks as follows: one (1) fire truck at

97 (vii) Any county that has received six (6) fire 98 trucks under this section is eligible to submit an application 99 for * * * <u>nine (9)</u> fire trucks as follows: five (5) fire trucks 100 at not more than Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000.00) per truck, 101 and * * <u>four (4)</u> fire trucks at not more than Ninety Thousand 102 Dollars (\$90,000.00) per truck or a total of not more than * * * 103 Seven Hundred Ten Thousand Dollars (\$710,000.00).

(viii) Any county that has received seven (7) fire trucks under this section is eligible to submit an application for * * * <u>eight (8)</u> fire trucks as follows: four (4) fire trucks at not more than Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000.00) per truck, and * * <u>four (4)</u> fire trucks at not more than Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$90,000.00) per truck or a total of not more than * * * Six Hundred Forty Thousand Dollars (\$640,000.00).

(ix) Any county that has received eight (8) fire trucks under this section is eligible to submit an application for * * * <u>seven (7)</u> fire trucks as follows: three (3) fire trucks at not more than Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000.00) per truck, and * * <u>four (4)</u> fire trucks at not more than Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$90,000.00) per truck or a total of not more than * * <u>Five Hundred Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$570,000.00)</u>.

A committee composed of the Commissioner of Insurance, the State Fire Coordinator, the Director of the Rating Bureau and 147 148 the Director of the State Fire Academy shall review the requests 149 by the boards of supervisors and shall determine whether the 150 county or municipality for which the board of supervisors has 151 requested a truck meets the requirements of eligibility under this 152 chapter.

153 (c) To be eligible to receive monies under this154 chapter:

155 (i) A county or municipality must pledge to set 156 aside or dedicate each year as matching funds, for a period not to 157 extend over ten (10) years, local funds in an amount equal to or not less than one-tenth (1/10) of the amount of monies for which 158 159 it is requesting distribution from the Rural Fire Truck Fund, 160 which pledged monies may be derived from local ad valorem tax authorized by law or from any other funds available to the county 161 162 or municipality, except for those funds received by municipalities 163 or counties from the Municipal Fire Protection Fund or the County 164 Volunteer Fire Department Fund, as defined in Sections 83-1-37 and 165 83-1-39.

(ii) A municipality must provide adequate documentation of its contract with the county that requires the municipality to provide fire protection in rural areas. The term

H. B. No. 842 22/HR26/R842 PAGE 7 (BS\KW) "rural areas" means any area within the county located outside the boundaries of an incorporated municipality or any incorporated municipality with a population of two thousand five hundred (2,500) or less.

173 The Department of Insurance shall maintain an (d) 174 accurate record of all monies distributed to counties and municipalities and the number of fire trucks purchased and the 175 176 cost for each fire truck, such records to be kept separate from 177 other records of the Department of Insurance; notify counties and municipalities of the Rural Fire Truck Acquisition Assistance 178 179 Program and the requirements for them to become eligible to participate; adopt and promulgate such rules and regulations as 180 181 may be necessary and desirable to implement the provisions of this 182 chapter; and file with the Legislature a report detailing how 183 monies made available under this chapter were distributed and 184 spent during the preceding portion of the fiscal year in each 185 county and municipality, the number of fire trucks purchased, the counties and municipalities making such purchases, and the cost of 186 187 each fire truck purchased.

188 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 189 and after July 1, 2022.
