HOUSE BILL NO. 842 (As Sent to Governor)

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 17-23-1, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE AN ADDITIONAL ROUND OF FIRE TRUCKS FOR COUNTIES AND MUNICIPALITIES UNDER THE RURAL FIRE TRUCK ACQUISITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM; TO CREATE A SPECIAL FUND TO BE DESIGNATED THE "RURAL FIRE 5 TRUCK MATCHING ASSISTANCE FUND" WHICH SHALL BE USED TO ASSIST 6 COUNTIES AND MUNICIPALITIES WITH REMAINING ELIGIBILITY UNDER THE 7 RURAL FIRE TRUCK ACQUISITION PROGRAM; TO PROVIDE THAT THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF MATCHING ASSISTANCE SHALL NOT EXCEED 80% OF THE PURCHASE 8 9 PRICE OF THE RURAL FIRE TRUCK; TO PROVIDE THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF 10 INSURANCE MAY PROVIDE SUCH MATCHING ASSISTANCE TO COUNTIES AND 11 MUNICIPALITIES UPON MEETING CERTAIN CRITERIA; AND FOR RELATED 12 PURPOSES. 13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: **SECTION 1.** Section 17-23-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

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- amended as follows: 15
- 16 17-23-1. (1) There is established the Rural Fire Truck
- 17 Acquisition Assistance Program to be administered by the
- 18 Department of Insurance for the purpose of assisting counties and
- municipalities in the acquisition of fire trucks. 19
- 20 (2) There is created in the State Treasury a special fund to
- 21 be designated as the "Rural Fire Truck Fund." The Legislature may
- 22 appropriate that amount necessary to fulfill the obligations

23 created under this section by the Department of Insurance, from

- 24 the State General Fund to such special fund, which sum shall be
- 25 added to the remainder of the money transferred on July 1, 1995,
- 26 and during the 1996 Regular Session to the Rural Fire Truck Fund.
- 27 Unexpended amounts remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal
- 28 year shall not lapse into the State General Fund, and any interest
- 29 earned on amounts in the fund shall be deposited to the credit of
- 30 the fund. Unobligated amounts remaining in the Rural Fire Truck
- 31 Fund, Fund No. 3507, or in any fund created for funds appropriated
- 32 or otherwise made available for this program, may be used as
- 33 matching funds by any county with remaining eligibility as
- 34 provided herein. It is the intent of the Legislature that the
- 35 Department of Insurance continue to accept applications from the
- 36 counties for fire trucks as provided in subsection (3) of this
- 37 section.
- 38 (3) (a) A county that meets the requirements provided
- 39 herein may receive an amount not to exceed * * * One Million Ten
- 40 Thousand Dollars (\$1,010,000.00) as provided in subparagraphs (i),
- 41 (ii), (iii), (iv), (v), (vi), (vii), (viii), (ix), (x), (xi),
- 42 (xii) \star \star and (xiii) \star \star of this paragraph, and such amount
- 43 shall be divided as follows: an amount of not more than Fifty
- 44 Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) per fire truck for the first six (6)
- 45 trucks and not more than Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000.00) per
- 46 fire truck for the seventh, eighth, ninth, tenth and eleventh
- 47 trucks, and not more than Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$90,000.00) per
- 48 fire truck for the twelfth, thirteenth * * *, fourteenth and

- 49 <u>fifteenth</u> truck. Monies distributed under this chapter shall be
- 50 expended only for the purchase of new or used fire trucks and such
- 51 trucks must meet the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA)
- 52 standards in the 1900 series and be approved by the Rural Fire
- 53 Truck Review Committee.
- 54 (i) Any county that has not applied for a fire
- 55 truck under this section is eligible to submit applications
- 56 for * * * fifteen (15) fire trucks as follows: six (6) fire
- 57 trucks at not more than Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) per
- 58 truck and five (5) fire trucks at not more than Seventy Thousand
- 59 Dollars (\$70,000.00) per truck, and * * * four (4) fire trucks at
- 60 not more than Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$90,000.00) per truck or a
- total of \star \star One Million Ten Thousand Dollars (\$1,010,000.00).
- 62 (ii) Any county that has received one (1) fire
- 63 truck under this section is eligible to submit applications
- 64 for * * * fourteen (14) fire trucks as follows: five (5) fire
- 65 trucks at not more than Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) per
- 66 truck and five (5) fire trucks at not more than Seventy Thousand
- 67 Dollars (\$70,000.00) per truck, and * * * four (4) fire trucks at
- 68 not more than Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$90,000.00) per truck or a
- 69 total of * * * Nine Hundred Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$960,000.00).
- 70 (iii) Any county that has received two (2) fire
- 71 trucks under this section is eligible to submit an application
- 72 for * * * thirteen (13) fire trucks as follows: four (4) fire
- 73 trucks at not more than Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) per

- 74 truck and five (5) fire trucks at not more than Seventy Thousand
- 75 Dollars (\$70,000.00) per truck, and * * * four (4) fire trucks at
- 76 not more than Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$90,000.00) per truck or a
- 77 total of not more than * * * Nine Hundred Ten Thousand Dollars
- 78 (\$910,000.00).
- 79 (iv) Any county that has received three (3) fire
- 80 trucks under this section is eligible to submit an application
- 81 for \star \star twelve (12) fire trucks as follows: three (3) fire
- 82 trucks at not more than Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) per
- 83 truck and five (5) fire trucks at not more than Seventy Thousand
- 84 Dollars (\$70,000.00) per truck, and * * * four (4) fire trucks at
- 85 not more than Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$90,000.00) per truck or a
- 86 total of not more than * * * Eight Hundred Sixty Thousand Dollars
- 87 (\$860,000.00).
- 88 (v) Any county that has received four (4) fire
- 89 trucks under this section is eligible to submit an application
- 90 for * * * eleven (11) fire trucks as follows: two (2) fire trucks
- 91 at not more than Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) per truck and
- 92 five (5) fire trucks at not more than Seventy Thousand Dollars
- 93 (\$70,000.00) per truck, and * * * four (4) fire trucks at not more
- 94 than Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$90,000.00) per truck or a total of
- 95 not more than * * * Eight Hundred Ten Thousand Dollars

- 96 (\$810,000.00).
- 97 (vi) Any county that has received five (5) fire
- 98 trucks under this section is eligible to submit an application

- 99 for * * * $\underline{\text{ten (10)}}$ fire trucks as follows: one (1) fire truck at
- 100 not more than Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) per truck and
- 101 five (5) fire trucks at not more than Seventy Thousand Dollars
- 102 (\$70,000.00) per truck, and * * * four (4) fire trucks at not more
- 103 than Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$90,000.00) per truck or a total of
- 104 not more than * * * Seven Hundred Sixty Thousand Dollars
- 105 (\$760,000.00).
- 106 (vii) Any county that has received six (6) fire
- 107 trucks under this section is eligible to submit an application
- 108 for * * * nine (9) fire trucks as follows: five (5) fire trucks
- 109 at not more than Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000.00) per truck,
- 110 and * * * four (4) fire trucks at not more than Ninety Thousand
- 111 Dollars (\$90,000.00) per truck or a total of not more than * * *
- 112 Seven Hundred Ten Thousand Dollars (\$710,000.00).
- (viii) Any county that has received seven (7) fire
- 114 trucks under this section is eligible to submit an application
- 115 for * * * eight (8) fire trucks as follows: four (4) fire trucks
- 116 at not more than Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000.00) per truck,
- 117 and * * * four (4) fire trucks at not more than Ninety Thousand
- 118 Dollars (\$90,000.00) per truck or a total of not more than * * *
- 119 Six Hundred Forty Thousand Dollars (\$640,000.00).
- 120 (ix) Any county that has received eight (8) fire
- 121 trucks under this section is eligible to submit an application
- 122 for * * * seven (7) fire trucks as follows: three (3) fire trucks
- 123 at not more than Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000.00) per truck,

- 124 and * * * four (4) fire trucks at not more than Ninety Thousand
- 125 Dollars (\$90,000.00) per truck or a total of not more than * * *
- 126 Five Hundred Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$570,000.00).
- 127 (x) Any county that has received nine (9) fire
- 128 trucks under this section is eligible to submit an application
- 129 for * * * six (6) fire trucks as follows: two (2) fire trucks at
- 130 not more than Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000.00) per truck,
- 131 and * * * four (4) fire trucks at not more than Ninety Thousand
- 132 Dollars (\$90,000.00) per truck or a total of not more than * * *
- 133 Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00).
- 134 (xi) Any county that has received ten (10) fire
- 135 trucks under this section is eligible to submit an application
- 136 for * * * five (5) fire trucks as follows: one (1) fire truck at
- 137 not more than Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000.00) per truck,
- 138 and * * * four (4) fire trucks at not more than Ninety Thousand
- 139 Dollars (\$90,000.00) per truck or a total of not more than * * *
- 140 Four Hundred Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$430,000.00).
- 141 (xii) Any county that has received eleven (11)
- 142 fire trucks under this section is eligible to submit an
- 143 application for * * * four (4) fire trucks at not more than Ninety
- 144 Thousand Dollars (\$90,000.00) per truck.
- 145 (xiii) Any county may apply for * * * four (4)
- 146 fire trucks at not more than Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$90,000.00)
- 147 per truck as provided in subparagraph (xii), provided that the
- 148 county agrees to forego any previous fire truck under

149	subparagraphs	(i)	through	(xi)	for	which	the	county	has	not

150 previously applied, and that the county has received approval from

151 the Rural Fire Truck Acquisition Assistance Program Committee to

152 apply for and receive a truck under subparagraph (xii).

153 (b) The board of supervisors of the county shall submit

154 its request for the receipt of monies to the Department of

155 Insurance. A committee composed of the Commissioner of Insurance,

156 the State Fire Coordinator, the Director of the Rating Bureau and

157 the Director of the State Fire Academy shall review the requests

158 by the boards of supervisors and shall determine whether the

159 county or municipality for which the board of supervisors has

160 requested a truck meets the requirements of eligibility under this

161 chapter.

162 (c) To be eligible to receive monies under this

163 chapter:

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164 (i) A county or municipality must pledge to set

aside or dedicate each year as matching funds, for a period not to

extend over ten (10) years, local funds in an amount equal to or

167 not less than one-tenth (1/10) of the amount of monies for which

168 it is requesting distribution from the Rural Fire Truck Fund,

169 which pledged monies may be derived from local ad valorem tax

170 authorized by law or from any other funds available to the county

171 or municipality, except for those funds received by municipalities

172 or counties from the Municipal Fire Protection Fund or the County

173 Volunteer Fire Department Fund, as defined in Sections 83-1-37 and 83-1-39.

(ii) A municipality must provide adequate

documentation of its contract with the county that requires the

municipality to provide fire protection in rural areas. The term

"rural areas" means any area within the county located outside the

boundaries of an incorporated municipality or any incorporated

municipality with a population of two thousand five hundred

(2,500) or less.

The Department of Insurance shall maintain an (d) accurate record of all monies distributed to counties and municipalities and the number of fire trucks purchased and the cost for each fire truck, such records to be kept separate from other records of the Department of Insurance; notify counties and municipalities of the Rural Fire Truck Acquisition Assistance Program and the requirements for them to become eligible to participate; adopt and promulgate such rules and regulations as may be necessary and desirable to implement the provisions of this chapter; and file with the Legislature a report detailing how monies made available under this chapter were distributed and spent during the preceding portion of the fiscal year in each county and municipality, the number of fire trucks purchased, the counties and municipalities making such purchases, and the cost of each fire truck purchased.

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197	(4) There is created in the State Treasury a special fund to
198	be designated as the "Rural Fire Truck Matching Assistance Fund,"
199	which shall consist of funds appropriated by the Legislature from
200	the State General Fund or any other special source fund. The
201	Department of Insurance shall use the funds for matching
202	assistance to counties and municipalities with remaining
203	eligibility in accordance with the provisions of subsection (5) of
204	this section. Unexpended amounts remaining in the fund at the end
205	of a fiscal year shall not lapse into the State General Fund, and
206	any interest earned on amounts in the fund shall be deposited to
207	the credit of the fund.
208	(5) Subject to appropriation by the Legislature, the
209	Department of Insurance may provide funds to counties and
210	municipalities out of the Rural Fire Truck Matching Assistance
211	Fund in an amount exceeding the amount authorized in subsection
212	(3) of this section. However, the total amount of funds allowed
213	under this subsection combined with the funds provided in
214	subsection (3) of this section shall not exceed eighty percent
215	(80%) of the purchase price of the rural fire truck. A county or
216	municipality is eligible for such matching assistance upon meeting
217	the following criteria:
218	(a) The county or municipality's application is
219	approved for funding in accordance with the criteria in subsection
220	(3) of this section;

221	(b) The department determines that the county or
222	municipality does not have sufficient funds available for the
223	purchase of a rural fire truck with the funds authorized in
224	subsection (3) of this section; and
225	(c) The county has received funding for no more than
226	eight (8) rounds from the Rural Fire Truck Acquisition Assistance
227	Program.
228	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
229	and after July 1, 2022.
