HOUSE BILL NO. 884

1 AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE "ACCELERATE MISSISSIPPI SCHOLARSHIP 2 PROGRAM" FOR THE PURPOSE OF ESTABLISHING AND MAKING SCHOLARSHIPS 3 AVAILABLE TO STUDENTS WHO BECOME ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN THE 4 PROGRAM FOR COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH DUAL-CREDIT AND DUAL-ENROLLMENT 5 OPTION, CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION COURSES THAT LEAD TO 6 INDUSTRY CERTIFICATION AND OVERLOAD COURSES; TO ESTABLISH THE 7 MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS FOR EACH SUBSIDIARY SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM, TO PROVIDE THAT THE PROGRAMS SHALL BE RESPECTIVELY ADMINISTERED BY 8 9 THE MISSISSIPPI COMMUNITY COLLEGE BOARD AND THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION; TO AMEND SECTIONS 37-71-7 AND 37-71-9, MISSISSIPPI CODE 10 OF 1972, TO CLARIFY PROVISIONS OF THE "MISSISSIPPI LEARN TO EARN 11 12 ACT" PERTAINING TO APPLICATION PROCEDURES IN A MANNER CONSISTENT 13 WITH THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE "ACCELERATE MISSISSIPPI SCHOLARSHIP 14 PROGRAM"; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

16 **SECTION 1.** This act shall be known, and may be cited as the

17 "Accelerate Mississippi Scholarship Program."

18 **SECTION 2.** There is created the Accelerate Mississippi

19 Scholarship Program, which such program shall consist of:

20 (a) The Accelerate College Scholarship Program provided

21 for under Section 3 of this act;

22 (b) The Accelerate Opportunity Scholarship Program

23 provided for under Section 4 of this act; and

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24 (c) The Accelerate Graduation Scholarship Program25 provided for under Section 6 of this act.

26 Dual-credit courses at a Mississippi public SECTION 3. (1)27 community or junior college shall be funded by the Accelerate 28 College Scholarship Fund, which shall be administered by the 29 Mississippi Community College Board. The board shall develop rules and regulations to implement the program for participating 30 31 public community and junior colleges that provide dual-credit and 32 dual-enrollment opportunities to students in Grades 9 through 12 who meet certain qualifications. The Mississippi Community 33 34 College Board shall create a platform for interested students to 35 apply online for the scholarships. Funding from approved 36 scholarships shall be awarded to the credit of the public 37 community or junior college providing the dual-credit instruction. Public community and junior colleges shall be the sole provider of 38 39 dual credit for students participating in the program. Funding 40 for this program will be administered through a special fund established at the Mississippi Community College Board. 41

(2) Subject to appropriation, for the 2022-2023 academic
year, each academic dual-credit student scholarship shall be
funded at One Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$150.00) per semester hour of
credit, and for each academic year thereafter, the public
community and junior colleges shall adjust the per semester credit
hour rate based on system-wide actual tuition costs.

student must pay for and successfully earn credit or complete one
(1) like course before being eligible for additional course

75 Career technical education and workforce SECTION 4. (1)76 training courses at a Mississippi public community or junior 77 college shall be funded by the Accelerate Opportunity Scholarship 78 Fund, which shall be administered by the Mississippi Community College Board. The board shall develop rules and regulations to 79 80 implement the program for participating public community and 81 junior colleges that provide dual-credit and dual-enrollment opportunities to students in Grades 9 through 12 who meet certain 82 83 qualifications. The Mississippi Community College Board shall create a platform for interested students to apply online for the 84 85 scholarships. Funding from approved scholarships shall be awarded to the credit of the public community or junior college providing 86 the dual-credit instruction. Public community and junior colleges 87 88 shall be the sole provider of dual credit for students 89 participating in the program. Funding for this program will be administered through a special fund established at the Mississippi 90 91 Community College Board.

92 (2) Subject to appropriation, each career and technical
93 dual-credit student scholarship shall be funded at Two Hundred
94 Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) per semester hour of credit beginning in
95 the 2022-2023 academic year.

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96 (3) All eligible public high school students shall be 97 approved for participation in the Accelerate Opportunity Scholarship Program, subject to the following criteria: 98 99 All dual-credit standards including, but not (a) 100 limited to, career and technical eligibility requirements, course 101 requirements, faculty and institutional qualifications and 102 Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on 103 Colleges (SACSCOC) accreditation criteria as provided in the 104 Procedures Manual for the State of Mississippi Dual-enrollment and 105 Accelerated Programs, jointly adopted by the Board of Trustees of 106 State Institutions of Higher Learning and the Mississippi 107 Community College Board, or a subsequent document, must be adhered 108 to. 109 In addition, eligible courses must: (b) 110 (i) Lead to an industry-recognized certificate, 111 license or degree as approved by the Mississippi Office of 112 Workforce Development; (ii) Be courses that are not otherwise available 113 114 at the student's high school; and 115 (iii) Allow high school-aged students to 116 participate. 117 Laboratories designed for providing instruction in (C) 118 career and technical courses must meet community and junior

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(e) Students participating in the program areresponsible for books, tools, supplies and transportation costs.

(4) Scholarship funds shall be dispersed on a first-come, first-served basis with minimum funding for each student being sufficient to take at least one (1) semester course per academic year.

(5) If a student fails to successfully complete a course paid for by the Accelerate Opportunity Scholarship Program, the student must pay for and successfully earn credit or complete one (1) like course before being eligible for additional course participation. Repeated and remedial courses or examinations are not eligible for funding through the program.

134 SECTION 5. Public school personnel shall assist parents in 135 the process of enrolling students in such courses. Each 136 participating student's high school transcript at the public 137 school at which the student is enrolled shall include the credits 138 earned and grades received by the student for any dual-credit 139 courses taken pursuant to this section. For an eligible course to 140 be transcribed as meeting the requirements of a core subject as 141 identified in administrative rule, the course must meet the 142 approved content standards for the applicable subject and grade 143 level.

- 161 Overload courses; (a)

162 Challenge courses; (b)

163 Learn to Earn courses, including apprenticeships, (C) 164 internships, and alternative learning courses;

- 165 College entrance examinations; (d)
- 166 (e) Preliminary college entrance examinations;

167 Career technical certificate and licensing (f) examinations that lead to an industry-recognized certificate, 168

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169 license or degree as approved by the Mississippi Office of 170 Workforce Development;

(g) Postsecondary credit-bearing examinations, including advanced placement (AP); international baccalaureate (IB); Cambridge International; and college-level examination program (CLEP).

Each local school board shall set forth criteria by 175 (4) 176 which a student may take an overload course. A student must take 177 and successfully be completing a full credit load within a given 178 school year to be eligible for funding of an overload course. An 179 overload course must be taken for high school credit to be 180 eligible for funding. The scholarship distribution for an 181 overload course may not exceed Two Hundred Twenty-Five Dollars 182 (\$225.00) per overload course. To qualify as an eligible overload 183 course for the program, the course must:

184

(a) Be offered by an accredited provider; and

185 (b) Be taught by an individual certified to teach the186 grade and subject area of the course in Mississippi.

(5) Each local school board shall set forth criteria by which a student may challenge a course. If a student successfully meets the criteria set forth by the board of the public school, then the student shall be counted as having completed all required coursework for that course. The public school shall be funded for such students based upon either actual hours of attendance or the course that the student has successfully passed, whichever is more

194 advantageous to the public school, up to the maximum of one (1) 195 full-time student.

196 The State Department of Education shall maintain a list (6) of eligible college entrance examinations and preliminary college 197 198 entrance examinations and costs, provided that a student may not 199 use funds provided under this section to take the same examination 200 more than once. Eligible costs include the cost of the 201 examination, proctor fees, and administrative fees. Eligible 202 examinations include the SAT, PSAT, ACT and other similar 203 examinations identified by the department.

204 (7) Accelerate Graduation Scholarships may not be used to 205 pay an amount that exceeds the price to the student of such 206 courses and examinations pursuant to the limitations stated in 207 These monies shall not supplant existing program this section. 208 funds. No later than December 1, 2022, the State Department of 209 Education shall annually report to the Education Committees of the 210 Senate and the House of Representatives details regarding the number of students benefiting from assistance with the cost of 211 212 overload courses, challenge courses, Learn to Earn courses and 213 examinations. The report shall include the number of credits 214 awarded and amounts paid pursuant to this section during the 215 previous school year. The report also shall be provided to the 216 other members of the Legislature upon request and posted on the 217 department's website for the general public to view.

(10) If a student fails to successfully complete a course paid for by the Accelerate Graduation Scholarship Program, the student must pay for and successfully earn credit or complete one (1) like course before being eligible for additional course participation. Repeated and remedial courses or examinations are not eligible for funding through the program.

(11) If a student fails to take an examination paid for by
the Accelerate Graduation Scholarship Program, the student must
pay for and pass the test before being eligible for additional
participation in the program.

(12) Public school personnel shall assist parents in the process of enrolling students in overload, challenge and Learn to Earn courses. Each participating student's high school transcript at the public school at which the student is enrolled shall include the credits earned and grades received by the student for

For an eligible course to be transcribed as meeting the requirements of a core subject as identified in administrative rule, the course must meet the approved content standards for the applicable subject and grade level.

248 <u>SECTION 7.</u> The State Board of Education shall promulgate 249 rules to implement the provisions of this chapter so as to 250 maximize participation in the Accelerate Mississippi Scholarship 251 Program.

252 SECTION 8. Public schools shall establish timelines and 253 requirements for participation in the Accelerate Mississippi 254 Scholarship Program, including implementing procedures for the appropriate transcription of credits, reporting of program 255 256 participation and financial transaction requirements. Public 257 schools shall make reasonable efforts to ensure that any student 258 who considers participating in the program also considers the 259 challenges and time necessary to succeed in the program, and 260 schools shall make reasonable efforts to include quidance on how 261 the student's participation in the program contributes to 262 prospective college and career pathways. Such efforts shall be 263 performed prior to a student's participation in the program and 264 throughout the student's involvement in the program.

265 SECTION 9. Section 37-71-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
