HOUSE BILL NO. 898

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 9-13-19, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 INCREASE THE SALARIES FOR CIRCUIT AND CHANCERY COURT REPORTERS; 3 AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4 SECTION 1. Section 9-13-19, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 5 amended as follows: 6 7 9-13-19. (1) Court reporters for circuit and chancery courts may be paid an annual salary payable by the Administrative 8 9 Office of Courts not to exceed * * * Fifty-nine Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$59,500.00) for court reporters with five (5) 10 years' experience or less; not to exceed * * * Sixty-eight 11 12 Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$68,500.00) for court reporters who have more than five (5) years' experience but less than ten (10) 13 14 years; and not to exceed * * * Seventy-four Thousand Dollars 15 (\$74,000.00) for court reporters who have ten (10) years or more 16 experience. No amount of the increase in the maximum salary authorized by this section shall be paid from the State General 17

Fund. The board of supervisors of any county is authorized to pay

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- 19 its court reporters the applicable amount of the maximum salary
- 20 authorized by this section. In addition, any court reporter
- 21 performing the duties of a court administrator in the same
- 22 judicial district in which the person is employed as a court
- 23 reporter may be paid additional compensation for performing the
- 24 court administrator duties. The annual amount of the additional
- 25 compensation shall be set by vote of the judges and chancellors
- 26 for whom the court administrator duties are performed, with
- 27 consideration given to the number of hours per month devoted by
- 28 the court reporter to performing the duties of a court
- 29 administrator. The additional compensation shall be submitted to
- 30 the Administrative Office of Courts for approval.
- 31 (2) The several counties in each respective court district
- 32 shall transfer from the general funds of those county treasuries
- 33 to the Administrative Office of Courts a proportionate amount to
- 34 be paid toward the annual compensation of the court reporter,
- 35 including any additional compensation paid for the performance of
- 36 court administrator duties. The amount to be paid by each county
- 37 shall be determined by the number of weeks in which court is held
- 38 in each county in proportion to the total number of weeks court is
- 39 held in the district. For purposes of this section, the term
- 40 "compensation" means the gross salary plus all amounts paid for
- 41 benefits, or otherwise, as a result of employment or as required
- 42 by employment, but does not include transcript fees otherwise
- 43 authorized to be paid by or through the counties. However, only

- 44 salary earned for services rendered shall be reported and credited
- 45 for retirement purposes. Amounts paid for transcript fees,
- 46 benefits or otherwise, including reimbursement for travel
- 47 expenses, shall not be reported or credited for retirement
- 48 purposes.
- 49 For example, if there are thirty-eight (38) scheduled court
- 50 weeks in a particular district, a county in which court is
- 51 scheduled five (5) weeks out of the year would have to pay
- 52 five-thirty-eighths (5/38) of the total annual compensation.
- 53 (3) The salary and any additional compensation for the
- 54 performance of court administrator duties shall be paid in twelve
- 55 (12) installments on the last working day of each month after it
- 56 has been duly authorized by the appointing judge or chancellor and
- 57 an order duly placed on the minutes of the court. Each county
- 58 shall transfer to the Administrative Office of Courts one-twelfth
- 59 (1/12) of the amount required to be paid pursuant to subsection
- 60 (2) of this section by the twentieth day of each month for the
- 61 salary that is to be paid on the last working day of the month.
- 62 The Administrative Office of Courts shall pay to the court
- 63 reporter the total amount of salary due for that month. Any
- 64 county may pay, in the discretion of the board of supervisors, by
- 65 the twentieth day of January of any year, the amount due for a
- 66 full twelve (12) months.

- 67 (4) From and after October 1, 1996, all circuit and chancery 68 court reporters will be employees of the Administrative Office of
- 69 Courts.
- 70 (5) No circuit or chancery court reporter shall be entitled
- 71 to any compensation for any special or extended term of court
- 72 after passage of this section.
- 73 (6) No chancery or circuit court reporter shall practice law
- 74 in the court within which he or she is the court reporter.
- 75 (7) For all travel required in the performance of official
- 76 duties, the circuit or chancery court reporter shall be paid
- 77 mileage by the county in which the duties were performed at the
- 78 same rate as provided for state employees in Section 25-3-41. The
- 79 court reporter shall file in the office of the clerk of the court
- 80 which he serves a certificate of mileage expense incurred during
- 81 that term and payment of such expense to the court reporter shall
- 82 be paid on allowance by the judge of such court.
- 83 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 84 and after July 1, 2022.
