## HOUSE BILL NO. 938

- AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE ANY GOVERNMENTAL ENTITY TO ESTABLISH A
  FIRST RESPONDERS INCENTIVE PROGRAM; TO REQUIRE A GOVERNMENTAL

  SENTITY ELECTING TO ESTABLISH AN INCENTIVE PROGRAM TO ADOPT A
  RESOLUTION OR ORDINANCE OR REGULATION SETTING FORTH CERTAIN
  REQUIREMENTS FOR THE PROGRAM; TO AUTHORIZE THE PAYMENT OF A SALARY
  SUPPLEMENT TO EMPLOYEES SELECTED FOR RECOGNITION UNDER THE
  PROGRAM; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 9 **SECTION 1.** (1) Any governmental entity in its discretion,
- 10 may establish a First Responders Incentive Program to recognize
- 11 police officers, firefighters and other workers for exemplary
- 12 performance and achievement.
- 13 As used under this act, "first responders" means state and
- 14 local law enforcement personnel, fire department personnel,
- 15 emergency medical personnel, emergency management personnel and
- 16 public works personnel who may be deployed to bioterrorism
- 17 attacks, terrorist attacks, catastrophic or natural disasters and
- 18 emergencies.
- 19 (2) A governmental entity electing to establish a First
- 20 Responders Incentive Program authorized under this section shall

21	adopt a	resolution	or	ordinance	creating	the	program,	which	mus

- 22 be spread upon the minutes of the governmental entity. The
- 23 resolution or ordinance or regulation must include, at a minimum,
- 24 provisions addressing the following:
- 25 (a) Which department or office of the governmental
- 26 entity is responsible for the administration of the program;
- 27 (b) An explanation of how the program works, including
- 28 how employees may be identified for recognition under the program;
- 29 (c) A description of how decisions will be made on
- 30 whether or not an employee recommended for recognition qualifies
- 31 for the recognition, and if so, the amount of any salary
- 32 supplement to be granted to that employee;
- 33 (d) A clear description of which employment positions
- 34 are entitled to receive recognition under the program;
- 35 (e) Examples of employee achievements which merit
- 36 recognition under the program, including, but not limited to:
- 37 (i) Successful completion of additional academic
- 38 college coursework that is relevant to the person's job while that
- 39 person is employed by the county or municipality or state as a
- 40 police officer, firefighter or other essential worker;
- 41 (ii) Attainment of certification through a
- 42 nonmandatory professional class or program offered to police
- 43 officers, firefighters or other workers;
- 44 (iii) Exemplary job performance, supported by
- 45 employee performance evaluations;

- 47 beyond the requirements of the job during a public emergency or
- 48 disaster; and
- (v) Such other acts or achievements described in
- 50 the resolution or ordinance;
- 51 (f) Rules establishing limitations, if any, on the
- 52 number of times a person may be recognized under the program, and
- 53 if allowed, specific rules relating to the maximum number of times
- or frequency that an employee may be selected for recognition; and
- (g) Any other rules that the governmental entity
- 56 determines is essential to creating a program that is able to be
- 57 operated in a fair, unbiased manner for all employees qualified
- 58 for recognition.
- 59 (3) In order to incentivize employees to perform at their
- 60 highest ability, the governmental entity, in its discretion, may
- 61 authorize the awarding of a salary supplement to employees
- 62 selected for recognition under the First Responders Incentive
- 63 Program. A salary supplement awarded to an employee under the
- 64 program may be paid from any funds available to the governmental
- 65 entity other than state funds; provided, however, if the
- 66 governmental entity is the state, then state funds may be used. A
- 67 salary supplement may not exceed an amount equal to five percent
- 68 (5%) of that employee's annual salary in effect on the date the
- 69 employee is granted recognition under the program. The
- 70 governmental entity shall establish the terms of payment of the

- 71 salary supplement, which, in its discretion, may be made as a lump
- 72 sum payment or over a period of time. A supplement paid to an
- 73 employee under this section may not be considered earned
- 74 compensation for purposes of participation in the Public
- 75 Employees' Retirement System.
- 76 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 77 and after July 1, 2022.
