COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 971

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 63-1-49, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO
 INCREASE THE TIME PERIOD DURING WHICH AN EXPIRED DRIVER'S LICENSE
 MAY BE RENEWED WITHOUT EXAMINATION; TO PROVIDE THAT THE DEPARTMENT
 OF PUBLIC SAFETY SHALL BE THE STATE AGENCY WITH RESPONSIBILITY FOR
 REGULATING CERTAIN DIGITAL WALLETS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
 SECTION 1. Section 63-1-49, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

8 amended as follows:

63-1-49. (1) An expired license issued pursuant to this 9 10 article may be renewed at any time within * * * sixty (60) months after the expiration date of the license upon application and 11 12 payment of the required fee, and the payment of a delinquent fee prescribed in Section 63-1-43, in lieu of a driver examination, 13 unless the holder of the expired license is required to be 14 15 examined, or unless the department has reason to believe the 16 licensee is no longer qualified to receive a license.

17 (2) (a) Any person in the Armed Services of the United
18 States, who holds a valid license issued pursuant to this chapter
19 and is out of state due to military service at the time the

20 license expires, may renew the license by mail or by online 21 renewal services while out of state due to military service or at 22 any time within ninety (90) days after being discharged from military service or upon returning to the state without payment of 23 24 any delinquent fee or examination, unless the department has 25 reason to believe that the licensee is no longer qualified to 26 receive a license. The person shall make proof by affidavit of 27 the fact of the person's current military service or of the time 28 of discharge or return. The expiration of the license of a 29 military person under the provisions of this paragraph (a) shall 30 not affect the validity of the license, but the license shall continue to be valid and permit the person to operate a motor 31 32 vehicle in this state for a period of ninety (90) days after discharge from military service or return to the state or until 33 34 renewal of the license, whichever occurs first.

35 (b) The provisions of paragraph (a) of this subsection 36 (2) also apply to a dependent of a person in the Armed Services of the United States who is out of state due to military service if 37 the dependent resides out of state with the Armed Services member 38 39 and the license of the dependent expires during the family 40 member's absence from the state. The Commissioner of Public Safety may adopt such rules and regulations under the 41 42 Administrative Procedures Act as may be necessary to implement the provisions of this paragraph. 43

The person shall make proof by affidavit of the fact of the overseas travel.

50 <u>SECTION 2.</u> The Department of Public Safety shall be the 51 state agency with responsibility for regulating a digital wallet 52 for state agency credentials. The Commissioner of Public Safety 53 may promulgate rules and regulations regarding such digital wallet 54 technology.

55 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from 56 and after July 1, 2022.
