HOUSE BILL NO. 971

- AN ACT TO BRING FORWARD SECTION 63-1-49, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, WHICH REGULATES RENEWAL OF DRIVER'S LICENSES AFTER
- 3 EXPIRATION, FOR PURPOSES OF POSSIBLE AMENDMENT; AND FOR RELATED
- 4 PURPOSES.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 6 **SECTION 1.** Section 63-1-49, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 7 brought forward as follows:
- 8 63-1-49. (1) An expired license issued pursuant to this
- 9 article may be renewed at any time within eighteen (18) months
- 10 after the expiration date of the license upon application and
- 11 payment of the required fee, and the payment of a delinquent fee
- 12 prescribed in Section 63-1-43, in lieu of a driver examination,
- 13 unless the holder of the expired license is required to be
- 14 examined, or unless the department has reason to believe the
- 15 licensee is no longer qualified to receive a license.

- 16 (2) (a) Any person in the Armed Services of the United
- 17 States, who holds a valid license issued pursuant to this chapter
- 18 and is out of state due to military service at the time the
- 19 license expires, may renew the license by mail or by online

- 20 renewal services while out of state due to military service or at
- 21 any time within ninety (90) days after being discharged from
- 22 military service or upon returning to the state without payment of
- 23 any delinquent fee or examination, unless the department has
- 24 reason to believe that the licensee is no longer qualified to
- 25 receive a license. The person shall make proof by affidavit of
- 26 the fact of the person's current military service or of the time
- 27 of discharge or return. The expiration of the license of a
- 28 military person under the provisions of this paragraph (a) shall
- 29 not affect the validity of the license, but the license shall
- 30 continue to be valid and permit the person to operate a motor
- 31 vehicle in this state for a period of ninety (90) days after
- 32 discharge from military service or return to the state or until
- 33 renewal of the license, whichever occurs first.
- 34 (b) The provisions of paragraph (a) of this subsection
- 35 (2) also apply to a dependent of a person in the Armed Services of
- 36 the United States who is out of state due to military service if
- 37 the dependent resides out of state with the Armed Services member
- 38 and the license of the dependent expires during the family
- 39 member's absence from the state. The Commissioner of Public
- 40 Safety may adopt such rules and regulations under the
- 41 Administrative Procedures Act as may be necessary to implement the
- 42 provisions of this paragraph.
- 43 (3) Any person holding a valid license issued pursuant to
- 44 this article who is going overseas for two (2) to four (4) years

- 45 and whose license will expire during the stay overseas may renew
- 46 the license for four (4) years or eight (8) years before leaving.
- 47 The person shall make proof by affidavit of the fact of the
- 48 overseas travel.
- 49 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 50 and after July 1, 2022.
