## HOUSE BILL NO. 1065 (As Sent to Governor)

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 49-7-31.5 AND 49-7-140, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROHIBIT THE TRANSPORTATION, IMPORTATION AND
- 3 RELEASE OF WILD HOGS, AND IMPOSE PENALTIES FOR SUCH VIOLATIONS;
- 4 AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 6 **SECTION 1.** Section 49-7-31.5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 7 amended as follows:
- 8 49-7-31.5. (1) The hunting, trapping and taking of nuisance
- 9 animals shall be regulated by the commission. The commission may
- 10 adopt regulations to regulate the hunting, trapping and taking of
- 11 nuisance animals and to control the population of nuisance
- 12 animals.
- 13 (2) (a) Landowners, agricultural leaseholders or their
- 14 designated agents may take predatory and nuisance animals
- 15 year-round on lands owned or leased by them.
- 16 (b) Landowners, agricultural leaseholders or their
- 17 designated agents may take nuisance animals with any type of
- 18 weapon and may take nuisance animals during the night after legal

- 19 hunting hours on lands owned or leased by them with a permit
- 20 issued by the department.
- 21 (c) No license is required for a resident landowner
- 22 hunting or trapping nuisance animals on his own land. An
- 23 agricultural leaseholder, designated agent and any other person
- 24 must possess either an all-game hunting license or trapping
- 25 license, unless otherwise exempt.
- 26 (d) No license is required for a recipient of the
- 27 Purple Heart Medal for wounds suffered in combat, to hunt nuisance
- 28 animals on private lands. Persons exempt from purchasing a
- 29 hunting license under this paragraph shall have in their
- 30 possession and on their person a copy of their DD-214 discharge
- 31 form indicating the receipt of the Purple Heart Medal and any
- 32 proof as may be required by the commission or the Department of
- 33 Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks, while engaged in such activities.
- 34 (3) The taking of any animal or animals other than nuisance
- 35 animals by the use of a trap or traps is unlawful except during
- 36 the time the season is open for the taking of fur-bearing animals.
- 37 (4) Nuisance animals may be run, chased or pursued with
- 38 dogs, except as provided in Section 49-7-32, year-round by
- 39 licensed hunters.
- 40 (5) Nuisance animals may be hunted with the aid of
- 41 electronic calls.

- 42 (6) Nuisance animals may be hunted or trapped with the aid
- 43 of bait and lures, on private lands, according to regulations
- 44 adopted by the commission.
- 45 (7) Any part of a nuisance animal may be bought and sold
- 46 year-round.
- 47 (8) (a) Wild hogs may not be caught or trapped and released
- 48 into the wild at a location different from the location where the
- 49 wild hog was caught or trapped, or otherwise transported live in
- 50 the State of Mississippi.
- 51 (b) A violation of this subsection is a Class I
- 52 violation and is punishable as provided under Section 49-7-141.
- 53 (9) When hunting wild hogs during any open gun season on
- 54 deer, a hunter must wear in full view at least five hundred (500)
- 55 square inches of solid unbroken fluorescent orange.
- SECTION 2. Section 49-7-140, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 57 amended as follows:
- 58 49-7-140. (1) No person may import into the state or
- 59 release into the wild, any live feral hog, wild swine or Russian
- 60 Boar.
- 61 (2) No person may transport on public roads or off of the
- 62 property of record where captured or relocate within the state any
- 63 live feral hog, wild swine or Russian Boar \* \* \*.
- 64 (3) For the purposes of this section, "feral hogs, wild
- 65 swine or Russian Boar" are defined as any hog that is not a
- 66 domesticated pet or livestock.

- 67 (4) A violation of this section is a Class I violation
- 68 punishable as provided in Section 49-7-141.
- 69 \* \* \*
- 70 ( \* \* \*5) Nothing in this section shall be construed to
- 71 prohibit the lawful transport of domestic swine for customary and
- 72 ordinary purposes of intrastate or interstate commerce, or
- 73 agricultural practices.
- 74 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 75 and after July 1, 2022.
