## HOUSE BILL NO. 1090

1 AN ACT TO WAIVE TUITION AND MANDATORY STUDENT FEES FOR ANY UNDERGRADUATE OR GRADUATE PROGRAM OF ANY MISSISSIPPI PUBLIC POSTSECONDARY INSTITUTION FOR A MISSISSIPPI FOSTER OR ADOPTED CHILD; TO PRESCRIBE THE REQUIREMENTS FOR ELIGIBILITY TO RECEIVE A 5 WAIVER; TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT OF CHILD PROTECTION SERVICES TO 6 CONFIRM THE APPLYING STUDENTS' ELIGIBILITY STATUS UPON REQUEST OF 7 THE POSTSECONDARY INSTITUTION; TO REQUIRE THE STUDENT TO COMPLETE THE FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID TO DETERMINE THE 8 9 LEVEL OF NEED AND ELIGIBILITY FOR STATE AND FEDERAL FINANCIAL AID 10 PROGRAMS; TO PROVIDE THAT A STUDENT'S WAIVER SHALL BE REDUCED BY 11 THE AMOUNT EXCEEDING THE TOTAL COST OF ATTENDANCE WHEN COMBINED 12 WITH OTHER STUDENT FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE; TO STIPULATE REQUIREMENTS 13 FOR CONTINUED ELIGIBILITY; TO REQUIRE THE MISSISSIPPI POSTSECONDARY STUDENT FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE BOARD TO REPORT DATA ON 14 1.5 GRADUATION RATES OF STUDENTS PARTICIPATING IN THE TUITION WAIVER 16 PROGRAM BY NOVEMBER 30 EACH YEAR TO PEER; AND FOR RELATED 17 PURPOSES. 18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 19 SECTION 1. (1) Tuition and mandatory student fees for any 20 undergraduate or graduate program of any Mississippi public 21 postsecondary institution, including all two-year community 22 colleges and four-year universities and colleges, shall be waived 23 for a Mississippi foster or adopted child who is a full-time or 24 part-time student if the student meets all entrance requirements

- 26 postsecondary institution, and if:
- 27 (a) The student's family receives supplemental adoption
- 28 benefits under Section 93-17-57;
- 29 (b) The student is currently placed within the custody
- 30 of the Department of Child Protection Services and placed in a
- 31 family foster home or is placed in accordance with the provisions
- 32 of Section 43-15-13;
- 33 (c) The student is in an independent living program and
- 34 the placement is funded by the Department of Child Protection
- 35 Services;
- 36 (d) The student who is an adopted child was in the
- 37 permanent legal custody of and placed for adoption by the
- 38 Department of Child Protection Services. A student who meets the
- 39 eligibility criteria of this paragraph and lives outside of
- 40 Mississippi at the time of application to a Mississippi
- 41 postsecondary institution may apply for the waiver up to the
- 42 amount of tuition for a Mississippi resident; or
- 43 (e) The Department of Child Protection Services was the
- 44 student's legal custodian on his or her eighteenth birthday.
- 45 (2) Upon request of the postsecondary institution, the
- 46 Department of Child Protection Services shall confirm the
- 47 eligibility status under subsection (1) of this section of the
- 48 student seeking to participate in the waiver program. Release of

- this information shall not constitute a breach of confidentiality required by Section 43-21-261.
- 51 (3) The student shall complete the Free Application for
- 52 Federal Student Aid to determine the level of need and eligibility
- 53 for state and federal financial aid programs. If the sum of the
- 54 tuition waiver plus other student financial assistance, except
- loans and the work study program under 42 USCS 2751-2756b, from
- 56 all sources exceeds the student's total cost of attendance, as
- 57 defined in 20 USCS 108711, the tuition waiver shall be reduced by
- 58 the amount exceeding the total cost of attendance.
- 59 (4) Except when extended in accordance with subsection (5)
- of this section, the student shall be eligible for the tuition
- 61 waiver:
- 62 (a) For entrance to the institution for a period of no
- 63 more than four (4) years after the date of graduation from high
- 64 school or obtaining a high school equivalency diploma; and
- 65 (b) For one hundred fifty (150) consecutive or
- 66 nonconsecutive credit hours earned, after first admittance to any
- 67 Mississippi institution if satisfactory progress is achieved or
- 68 maintained up to age twenty-eight (28).
- 69 (5) The expiration of a student's eligibility under
- 70 subsection (4)(a) of this section shall be extended by the number
- 71 of academic terms the institution determines the student was
- 72 unable to enroll for or complete due to serving:

- 75 (b) As an officer in the Commissioned Corps of the
- 76 United States Public Health Service; or
- 77 (c) On active service in the Peace Corps Act or the
- 78 AmeriCorps.
- 79 The original age limitation under subsection (4)(b) of this
- 80 section shall be extended by the total number of years during
- 81 which the student was on active duty status. The number of months
- 82 served on active duty status shall be rounded up to the next
- 83 higher year to determine the maximum length of eligibility
- 84 extension allowed.
- 85 (6) The Mississippi Postsecondary Student Financial
- 86 Assistance Board shall report nonidentifying data on graduation
- 87 rates of students participating in the tuition waiver program by
- 88 November 30 each year to the Joint Legislative Committee on
- 89 Performance Evaluation and Expenditure Review (PEER).
- 90 (8) Nothing in this section shall be construed to:
- 91 (a) Guarantee acceptance of or entrance into any
- 92 postsecondary institution for a foster or adopted child;
- 93 (b) Limit the participation of a foster or adopted
- 94 student in any other program of financial assistance for
- 95 postsecondary education;
- 96 (c) Require any postsecondary institution to waive
- 97 costs or fees relating to room and board; or

98	(d) Restrict any postsecondary institution or the
99	Department of Child Protection Services from accessing other
100	sources of financial assistance, except loans, that may be
101	available to a foster or adopted student.
102	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
103	and after July 1, 2022.
