HOUSE BILL NO. 1144

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 59-21-81, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO REQUIRE ALL INDIVIDUALS ON BOARD CERTAIN VESSELS TO WEAR A 3 PERSONAL FLOTATION DEVICE WHILE SUCH VESSEL IS UNDERWAY; AND FOR 4 RELATED PURPOSES. 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 SECTION 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the 7 "Gunner Palmer and Zeb Hughes Act." SECTION 2. Section 59-21-81, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 8 amended as follows: 9 10 59-21-81. (1) Every vessel shall have on board a Coast Guard approved personal flotation device for each person aboard 11 12 such vessel, and every person \* \* \* on board a motorboat, 13 sailboat, or vessel which measures less than twenty-six (26) feet 14 in length shall wear a type I, II, or III Coast Guard approved personal flotation device while such motorboat, sailboat, or 15 vessel is underway. For the purpose of this section "underway" 16 17 shall mean at all times except when a motorboat, sailboat, or vessel is anchored, moored, or aground. 20 regulations applicable to vessels of its classification. Such 21 vessel shall not be operated unless in a safe and seaworthy 22 condition; the owner and operator shall employ such safety devices 23 as may be necessary for the safe operation of such vessel, 24 including an efficient natural or mechanical ventilating system 25 when necessary for safe operation. In addition to the requirements imposed by this section, all vessels shall comply 26 27 with all federal regulations applicable to vessels of such 28 classification.

29 (2) For purposes of this subsection, "personal watercraft" 30 means a vessel which uses an inboard motor powering a water jet pump and which is designed to be operated by a person sitting, 31 32 standing or kneeling on the vessel, rather than the conventional manner of sitting or standing inside the vessel. A person shall 33 34 not operate a personal watercraft unless each person on board or 35 being towed behind is wearing a type I, type II or type III, 36 personal flotation device approved by the United States Coast 37 Guard.

38 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 39 and after July 1, 2022.
