HOUSE BILL NO. 1319

AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE COMMISSION ON WILDLIFE, FISHERIES AND 2 PARKS, ACTING THROUGH THE DEPARTMENT OF WILDLIFE, FISHERIES AND PARKS, TO PROMULGATE RULES AND REGULATIONS NEEDED TO PROTECT MISSISSIPPIANS' RIGHT TO HUNT IN THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, 5 INCLUDING STILL HUNTING AND HUNTING DEER WITH DOGS; TO PROVIDE THAT THERE SHALL BE NO EXEMPTION FROM THE REQUIREMENT TO ADHERE TO 7 SUCH RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR ANYONE OTHERWISE NOT REQUIRED TO POSSESS A HUNTING LICENSE; TO BRING FORWARD SECTIONS 49-7-1.1 AND 8 9 49-5-75, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, WHICH RELATE TO THE POWERS AND 10 DUTIES OF THE COMMISSION ON WILDLIFE, FISHERIES AND PARKS, FOR 11 PURPOSES OF POSSIBLE AMENDMENT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 12 WHEREAS, Section 49-7-1.1, Mississippi Code of 1972, declares 13 that it is the public policy of the State of Mississippi to

- 14 protect and preserve hunting, trapping and fishing. It further
- 15 charges the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks, acting
- 16 through the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks to
- 17 regulate those activities accordingly.
- 18 WHEREAS, Section 12A, Mississippi Constitution of 1890,
- 19 enshrines the people's right to hunt, fish and harvest wildlife,
- 20 including by the use of traditional methods.
- 21 WHEREAS, where those methods come into conflict so as to be
- 22 mutually exclusive, it shall be incumbent upon the commission,

- 23 acting through the department, to enact and enforce regulations
- 24 that protect the rights of all Mississippians under Section 12A,
- 25 Mississippi Constitution of 1890; NOW THEREFORE,
- 26 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 27 **SECTION 1.** (1) The Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and
- 28 Parks, acting through the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and
- 29 Park, shall promulgate rules and regulations needed to protect
- 30 Mississippians' right to hunt in the State of Mississippi,
- 31 including still hunting and hunting deer with dogs, consistent
- 32 with its powers and duties under the law.
- 33 (2) There shall be no exemption from the requirement to
- 34 adhere to these regulations for anyone otherwise not required to
- 35 possess a hunting license, such as people over the age of
- 36 sixty-five (65), or under the age of sixteen (16), or landowners
- 37 hunting on their own land.
- 38 (3) Any person who violates the provisions of this section
- 39 is quilty, upon conviction, of a Class II offense, as provided in
- 40 Section 49-7-143.
- 41 **SECTION 2.** Section 49-7-1.1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 42 brought forward as follows:
- 43 49-7-1.1. Hunting, trapping and fishing are vital parts of
- 44 the heritage of the State of Mississippi. It shall be the public
- 45 policy of the State of Mississippi to protect and preserve these
- 46 activities. The Mississippi Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and
- 47 Parks, acting by and through the Mississippi Department of

- 48 Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks, may regulate hunting, trapping and
- 49 fishing activities in the State of Mississippi, consistent with
- 50 its powers and duties under the law. No court of this state may
- 51 enjoin, suspend, curtail or abrogate any hunting, trapping or
- 52 fishing activity which is otherwise lawful under the laws of this
- 53 state or the regulations of the commission, except upon a showing,
- 54 by clear and convincing evidence, of an immediate threat to the
- 55 public health, safety and welfare, or other imminent peril. It
- is, and shall be, the public policy of this state to promote
- 57 hunting, trapping and fishing and other outdoor recreational
- 58 opportunities and to preserve these activities for all generations
- 59 to come.
- SECTION 3. Section 49-5-75, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 61 brought forward as follows:
- 49-5-75. The commission may make such rules and regulations,
- 63 inaugurate such studies and surveys and establish such programs as
- 64 it may deem necessary to carry out the provisions and purposes of
- 65 Sections 49-5-61 through 49-5-85.
- 66 **SECTION 4.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 67 and after July 1, 2022.
