HOUSE BILL NO. 1394

1 AN ACT TO CREATE THE DUAL CREDIT COMMUNITY COLLEGE 2 SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM, WHICH SHALL CONSIST OF THE ACADEMIC DUAL 3 CREDIT COMMUNITY COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM AND THE CAREER AND 4 TECHNICAL DUAL CREDIT COMMUNITY COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM; TO 5 REQUIRE THE MISSISSIPPI COMMUNITY COLLEGE BOARD TO ADMINISTER THE 6 SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) There is created the Dual Credit Community College Scholarship Program. The program shall consist of the Academic Dual Credit Community College Scholarship Program provided for under subsection (3) and the Career and Technical Dual Credit Community College Scholarship Program provided for under subsection (4).

The Mississippi Community College Board shall administer 14 (2)15 the Dual Credit Community College Scholarship Program. The board shall develop rules and regulations to implement the program for 16 participating public community and junior colleges that provide 17 18 dual credit and dual enrollment opportunities to high school 19 students who meet certain qualifications. 21 students to apply online for the scholarships. Funding for 22 approved scholarships must be awarded to the credit of the public 23 community or junior college providing the dual credit instruction. Public community and junior colleges shall be the sole provider of 24 25 dual credit for students participating in the program. Funding 26 for this program will be administered through a special fund at the Mississippi Community College Board and is subject to 27 28 appropriation.

29 The Academic Dual Credit Community College (3) (a) 30 Scholarship Program is limited to one hundred thirty thousand 31 (130,000) semester hours of credit in the 2022-2023 academic year. Subject to appropriation, for the 2022-2023 academic year, each 32 33 academic dual credit student scholarship must be funded at One Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$150.00) per semester hour of credit, and 34 35 for each academic year thereafter, the public community and junior 36 colleges shall adjust the per semester credit hour rate based on 37 system-wide actual tuition costs.

The Career and Technical Dual Credit Community 56 (4) (a) College Scholarship Program is limited to twenty thousand (20,000) 57 58 semester hours of credit in the 2022-2023 academic year. Subject to appropriation, each career and technical dual credit student 59 60 scholarship must be funded at Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) 61 per semester hour of credit beginning in the 2022-2023 academic 62 year.

(b) All eligible public, private and homeschooled high
school students must be approved for participation in the Career
and Technical Dual Credit Community College Scholarship Program,
subject to the following criteria:

(ii) Laboratories designed for providing
instruction in career and technical courses must meet community
and junior colleges' standards of quality.

80 (iii) Students participating in the program must81 reside within the State of Mississippi.

82 (iv) Students participating in the program are 83 responsible for books, tools, supplies and transportation costs.

(5) The Mississippi Community College Board shall set
application deadlines for dual credit students applying for Dual
Credit Community College Scholarship Program funds. If funds are
insufficient to fully fund scholarship awards for eligible
students, scholarship awards must be prorated among all eligible
students to the credit of public community and junior colleges.

90 (6) The Legislature may appropriate funds annually to 91 implement, administer and make awards under the programs provided 92 for in this section. The Mississippi Community College Board may 93 seek, accept and expend funds from any source, including private 94 business, industry, foundations and other groups as well as any 95 federal or other governmental funding available for this purpose.

No. 1394 22/HR12/R173 PAGE 4 (RKM\AM) 96 (7) At the end of the fiscal year, any unexpended balances 97 appropriated by the Legislature for the implementation or 98 administration of programs provided for in this section do not 99 lapse into the State General Fund but must carry over and be 100 available for expenditure in the succeeding fiscal year for the 101 same purpose.

102 (8) The Dual Credit Community College Scholarship Program103 must be suspended if funding is not provided.

104 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 105 and after July 1, 2022.

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
