HOUSE BILL NO. 1408

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 25-3-25, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO INCREASE THE ANNUAL SALARIES OF SHERIFFS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 5 **SECTION 1.** Section 25-3-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 6 amended as follows:
- 7 25-3-25. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsections
- 8 (2) through (9), the salaries of sheriffs of the various counties
- 9 are fixed as full compensation for their services.
- 10 The annual salary for each sheriff shall be based upon the
- 11 total population of his county according to the latest federal
- 12 decennial census in the following categories and for the following
- 13 amounts; however, no sheriff shall be paid less than the salary
- 14 authorized under this section to be paid the sheriff based upon
- 15 the population of the county according to the most recent federal
- 16 decennial census:

17 (a) For	counties	with a	total	population	. of	more	than
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- one hundred thousand (100,000), a salary of \star \star One Hundred Nine
- 19 Thousand Dollars (\$109,000.00).
- 20 (b) For counties with a total population of more than
- 21 forty-five thousand (45,000) and not more than one hundred
- 22 thousand (100,000), a salary of \star \star One Hundred Thousand Dollars
- 23 (\$100,000.00).
- 24 (c) For counties with a total population of more than
- 25 thirty-four thousand (34,000) and not more than forty-five

- 27 (\$95,000.00).
- 28 (d) For counties with a total population of more than
- 29 fifteen thousand (15,000) and not more than thirty-four thousand

- 31 (e) For counties with a total population of not more
- 32 than fifteen thousand (15,000), a salary of * * * Eighty-five
- 33 Thousand Dollars (\$85,000.00).
- 34 (2) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1)
- 35 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Leflore County, in
- 36 its discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the
- 37 county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars
- 38 (\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual
- 39 supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such
- 40 county for the following reasons:

41 (a) The Mississippi Department of Corrections opera	ates
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- 42 and maintains a restitution center within the county;
- 43 (b) The Mississippi Department of Corrections operates
- 44 and maintains a community work center within the county;
- 45 (c) There is a resident circuit court judge in the
- 46 county whose office is located at the Leflore County Courthouse;
- 47 (d) There is a resident chancery court judge in the
- 48 county whose office is located at the Leflore County Courthouse;
- 49 (e) The Magistrate for the Fourth Circuit Court
- 50 District is located in the county and maintains his office at the
- 51 Leflore County Courthouse;
- 52 (f) The Region VI Mental Health-Mental Retardation
- 53 Center, which serves a multicounty area, calls upon the sheriff to
- 54 provide security for out-of-town mental patients, as well as
- 55 patients from within the county;
- 56 (g) The increased activity of the Child Support
- 57 Division of the Department of Human Services in enforcing in the
- 58 courts parental obligations has imposed additional duties on the
- 59 sheriff; and
- (h) The dispatchers of the enhanced E-911 system in
- 61 place in Leflore County have been placed under the direction and
- 62 control of the sheriff.
- 63 (3) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1)
- of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Rankin County, in its
- 65 discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the

- 66 county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars
- 67 (\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual
- 68 supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such
- 69 county for the following reasons:
- 70 (a) The Mississippi Department of Corrections operates
- 71 and maintains the Central Mississippi Correctional Facility within
- 72 the county;
- 73 (b) The State Hospital is operated and maintained
- 74 within the county at Whitfield;
- 75 (c) Hudspeth Regional Center, a facility maintained for
- 76 the care and treatment of persons with an intellectual disability,
- 77 is located within the county;
- 78 (d) The Mississippi Law Enforcement Officers Training
- 79 Academy is operated and maintained within the county;
- 80 (e) The State Fire Academy is operated and maintained
- 81 within the county;
- 82 (f) The Pearl River Valley Water Supply District,
- 83 ordinarily known as the "Reservoir District," is located within
- 84 the county;
- 85 (g) The Jackson-Medgar Wiley Evers International
- 86 Airport is located within the county;
- 87 (h) The patrolling of the state properties located
- 88 within the county has imposed additional duties on the sheriff;
- 89 and

90	(i) The sheriff, in addition to providing security to
91	the nearly one hundred thousand (100,000) residents of the county,
92	has the duty to investigate, solve and assist in the prosecution
03	of any misdomognor or followy committed upon any state property

- of any misdemeanor or felony committed upon any state property 93
- 94 located in Rankin County.

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- 95 In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1)
- of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Neshoba County shall 96
- 97 pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the county an amount
- equal to Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00). 98
- In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1) 99
- 100 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Tunica County, in its
- 101 discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the
- 102 county an amount equal to Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00),
- 103 payable beginning April 1, 1997.
- 104 In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1)
- 105 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Hinds County shall
- 106 pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the county in an amount
- equal to Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00). The Legislature 107
- 108 finds and declares that the annual supplement authorized by this
- 109 subsection is justified in such county for the following reasons:
- 110 Hinds County has the greatest population of any
- 111 county, two hundred fifty-four thousand four hundred forty-one
- 112 (254,441) by the 1990 census, being almost one hundred thousand
- 113 (100,000) more than the next most populous county;

- 122 (4) resident chancery judges, and three (3) resident county judges

- 160 (\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual
- 161 supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such
- 162 county because the Mississippi Department of Corrections contracts

- In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1) 165 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Marshall County, in 166 167 its discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the 168 county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual 169 170 supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such 171 county because the Mississippi Department of Corrections contracts for the private incarceration of state inmates at a private 172 173 correctional facility within the county.
- 174 In addition to the salary provided in subsection (1) of 175 this section, the Board of Supervisors of Greene County, in its 176 discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the 177 county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars 178 (\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual 179 supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such county for the following reasons: 180
- 181 The Mississippi Department of Corrections operates and maintains the South Mississippi Correctional Facility within 182 183 the county;
- In 1996, additional facilities to house another one 184 185 thousand four hundred sixteen (1,416) male offenders were constructed at the South Mississippi Correctional Facility within 186 187 the county; and

- (10) In addition to the salary provided in subsection (1) of 191 192 this section, the board of supervisors of any county, in its 193 discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the 194 county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00). The amount of the supplement shall be spread on the 195 196 minutes of the board. The annual supplement authorized in this 197 subsection shall not be in addition to the annual supplements 198 authorized in subsections (2) through (9).
 - (11) (a) The salaries provided in this section shall be payable monthly on the first day of each calendar month by chancery clerk's warrant drawn on the general fund of the county; however, the board of supervisors, by resolution duly adopted and entered on its minutes, may provide that such salaries shall be paid semimonthly on the first and fifteenth day of each month. If a pay date falls on a weekend or legal holiday, salary payments shall be made on the workday immediately preceding the weekend or legal holiday.
- 208 (b) At least Ten Dollars (\$10.00) from each fee
 209 collected and deposited into the county's general fund under the
 210 provisions of paragraphs (a), (c) and (g) of subsection (1) of
 211 Section 25-7-19 shall be used for the sheriffs' salaries
 212 authorized in Section 25-3-25; as such Ten Dollar (\$10.00) amount

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- 214 Laws of 2007, for the purpose of providing additional monies to
- 215 the counties for sheriffs' salaries.
- 216 (12) (a) All sheriffs, each year, shall attend twenty (20)
- 217 hours of continuing education courses in law enforcement. Such
- 218 courses shall be approved by the Mississippi Board on Law
- 219 Enforcement Officers Standards and Training. Such education
- 220 courses may be provided by an accredited law enforcement academy
- 221 or by the Mississippi Sheriffs' Association.
- 222 (b) The Mississippi Board on Law Enforcement Officers
- 223 Standards and Training shall reimburse each county for the
- 224 expenses incurred by sheriffs and deputy sheriffs for attendance
- 225 at any approved training programs as required by this subsection.
- 226 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 227 and after July 1, 2022.
