HOUSE BILL NO. 1416 (As Sent to Governor)

AN ACT TO ALLOW STUDENTS IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS TO ENGAGE IN 1 2 POLITICAL ACTIVITIES OR PHILOSOPHICAL EXPRESSION BEFORE, DURING 3 AND AFTER THE SCHOOL DAY IN THE SAME MANNER AND TO THE SAME EXTENT THAT STUDENTS MAY ENGAGE IN NONPOLITICAL ACTIVITIES OR 4 5 EXPRESSIONS; TO ALLOW STUDENTS TO ORGANIZE PARTISAN OR NONPARTISAN 6 POLITICAL GROUPS, POLITICAL CLUBS, POLITICAL RALLIES, OR OTHER POLITICALLY THEMED GATHERINGS BEFORE, DURING AND AFTER SCHOOL TO 7 THE SAME EXTENT THAT STUDENTS ARE PERMITTED TO ORGANIZE OTHER 8 9 NONCURRICULAR STUDENT ACTIVITIES AND GROUPS; TO PROVIDE THAT 10 NOTHING IN THIS ACT SHALL BE CONSTRUED TO LIMIT THE AUTHORITY OF 11 THE SCHOOL, ITS AGENTS OR EMPLOYEES, TO MAINTAIN ORDER AND 12 DISCIPLINE ON SCHOOL PREMISES, TO PROTECT THE WELL-BEING OF 13 STUDENTS AND FACULTY, AND TO ASSURE THAT ATTENDANCE OF STUDENTS AT MEETINGS IS VOLUNTARY; TO PROVIDE FOR THE SEVERABILITY OF THE ACT; 14 15 AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 16 17 SECTION 1. Students in public schools may engage in political activities or political or philosophical expression 18 19 before, during and after the school day in the same manner and to 20 the same extent that students may engage in nonpolitical activities or expression. Students may organize partisan or 21 22 nonpartisan political groups, political clubs, political rallies, 23 or other politically themed gatherings before, during and after 24 school to the same extent that students are permitted to organize

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other noncurricular student activities and groups. Partisan and nonpartisan political groups must be given the same access to school facilities for assembling as is given to other noncurricular groups without discrimination based on the political content of the students' expression.

30 <u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) It shall be unlawful for any public school 31 which has a limited open forum to deny equal access or a fair 32 opportunity to, or discriminate against, any students who wish to 33 conduct a meeting within that limited open forum on the basis of 34 the political, philosophical, ideological or other content of the 35 speech at such meetings.

36 (2) Nothing in this act shall be construed to limit the
37 authority of the school, its agents or employees, to maintain
38 order and discipline on school premises, to protect the well-being
39 of students and faculty, and to assure that attendance of students
40 at meetings is voluntary.

41 <u>SECTION 3.</u> If any provision of this act or the application 42 thereof to any person or circumstances is judicially determined to 43 be invalid, the provisions of the remainder of the act and the 44 application to other persons or circumstances shall not be 45 affected thereby.

46 **SECTION 4.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 47 and after July 1, 2022.

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
