1 2 3	STATE TREASURY FOR	AN APPROPRIATION FROM SPECIAL FUNDS IN THE THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING THE EXPENSES OF THE CAL LICENSURE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2023.
4	BE IT ENACTED	BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. Th	e following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is appro	priated out of any money in the special fund in
7	the State Treasury	to the credit of the State Board of Medical
8	Licensure, for the	purpose of defraying the expenses of the board
9	for the fiscal year	beginning July 1, 2022, and ending
10	June 30, 2023	\$ 3,290,753.00.
11	SECTION 2. Of	the funds appropriated under the provisions of
12	Section 1, the foll	owing positions are authorized:

L 8	With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
L 9	responsibility to make certain that funds required for "Personal
20	Services" for Fiscal Year 2024 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2023
21	funds appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions
22	are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2023 budget by the
23	Mississippi Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the
24	agency's personal services appropriation, which shall be published
25	by the State Personnel Board. Additionally, the State Personnel
26	Board shall determine and publish the projected annualized payroll
27	costs based on current employees. It shall be the responsibility
28	of the agency head to ensure that actual personnel expenditures
29	for Fiscal Year 2023 do not exceed the data provided by the
30	Legislative Budget Office. If the agency's Fiscal Year 2023
31	projected cost exceeds the annualized costs, no salary actions
32	shall be processed by the State Personnel Board with the exception
33	of new hires that are determined to be essential for the agency.
34	Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
35	the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or
36	allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
37	Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
38	approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
39	Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
10	approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
11	without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
12	appropriated level.

43	No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
44	used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
45	being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
46	act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
47	None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
48	violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating
49	to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
50	interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
51	Funds have been appropriated herein for the purpose of
52	funding Project SEC2 minimum salaries for all employees covered
53	under the Colonel Guy Groff/Neville Kenning Variable Compensation
54	Plan. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that the
55	funds are used to increase all employees' salaries up to the
56	minimum level as determined by the State Personnel Board.
57	SECTION 3. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
58	Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
59	the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
60	in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
61	intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,
62	this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted
63	performance measures provided below:

76	A reporting of the degree to which the performance targets
77	set above have been or are being achieved shall be provided in the
78	agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget
79	Committee for Fiscal Year 2024.
80	SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
81	State Board of Medical Licensure shall maintain complete
82	accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all
83	funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be
84	in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal
85	Year 2022. It is further the intention of the Legislature that
86	the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2024 shall be
87	submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format
88	and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail
89	provided during the Fiscal Year 2023 budget request process.
90	SECTION 5. It is the intention of the Legislature that
91	whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
92	purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things

- 93 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
- 94 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
- 95 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
- 96 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
- 97 made without competitive bids.
- 98 **SECTION 6.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 99 funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with
- 100 Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency
- 101 shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their
- 102 appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally
- 103 or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for
- 104 actions contrary to this provision.
- 105 **SECTION 7.** Of the funds provided under the provisions of
- 106 this act, an amount not to exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars
- 107 (\$500,000.00) is provided for the Mississippi Physician Health
- 108 Program.
- 109 **SECTION 8.** Of the funds provided under the provisions of
- 110 this act, an amount not to exceed One Hundred Thirty Thousand
- 111 Dollars (\$130,000.00) may be allocated to the Mississippi Board of
- 112 Pharmacy to defray the expense of the Mississippi Prescription
- 113 Monitoring Program.
- 114 **SECTION 9.** It is further the intention of the Legislature
- 115 that, for Fiscal Year 2023, the board shall be allowed to recover
- 116 all costs from a holder of a license who has been found by the
- 117 board in violation of statute after notice and a hearing as

118	provided by law. The expenses must be direct costs associated
119	with the investigation and conduct of a proceeding for licensure
120	revocation, suspension or restriction.

SECTION 10. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.

127 SECTION 11. This act shall take effect and be in force from 128 and after July 1, 2022, and shall stand repealed June 30, 2022.

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
