5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:										
6	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be										
7	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury										
8	to the credit of the Mississippi State Board of Physical Therapy,										
9	for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the Mississippi State										
10	Board of Physical Therapy for the fiscal year beginning										
11	July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023\$ 322,025.00.										
12	SECTION 2. With the funds appropriated under the provisions										
13	of Section 1, the following positions are authorized:

- 22 Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's
- personal services appropriation, which shall be published by the 23
- 24 State Personnel Board. Additionally, the State Personnel Board
- 25 shall determine and publish the projected annualized payroll costs
- 26 based on current employees. It shall be the responsibility of the
- 27 agency head to ensure that actual personnel expenditures for
- 28 Fiscal Year 2023 do not exceed the data provided by the
- 29 Legislative Budget Office. If the agency's Fiscal Year 2023
- 30 projected cost exceeds the annualized costs, no salary actions
- 31 shall be processed by the State Personnel Board with the exception
- 32 of new hires that are determined to be essential for the agency.
- 33 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 34 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or
- 35 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
- 36 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
- approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. 37 The
- 38 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
- 39 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
- 40 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the

- No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be 42
- used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are 43

- None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
- 47 violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating
- 48 to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
- 49 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
- 50 Funds have been appropriated herein for the purpose of
- 51 funding Project SEC2 minimum salaries for all employees covered
- 52 under the Colonel Guy Groff/Neville Kenning Variable Compensation
- 53 Plan. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that the
- 54 funds are used to increase all employees' salaries up to the
- 55 minimum level as determined by the State Personnel Board.
- 56 **SECTION 3.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 57 Mississippi State Board of Physical Therapy shall maintain
- 58 complete accounting and personnel records related to the
- 59 expenditure of all funds appropriated under this act and that such
- 60 records shall be in the same format and level of detail as
- 61 maintained for Fiscal Year 2022. It is further the intention of
- 62 the Legislature that the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year
- 63 2024 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee
- 64 in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level
- 65 of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2023 budget request
- 66 process.
- 67 **SECTION 4.** It is the intention of the Legislature that
- 68 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the

- 69 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
- 70 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
- 71 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
- 72 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
- 73 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
- 74 made without competitive bids.
- 75 **SECTION 5.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 76 funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with
- 77 Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency
- 78 shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their
- 79 appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally
- 80 or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for
- 81 actions contrary to this provision.
- 82 **SECTION 6.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
- 83 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
- 84 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
- 85 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
- 86 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
- 87 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
- 88 **SECTION 7.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 89 and after July 1, 2022.
