1 2 3	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FROM GENERAL FUNDS IN THE STATE TREASURY FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING THE EXPENSES OF THE MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF INSURANCE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2023.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State General
7	Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of defraying the
8	expenses of the Mississippi Department of Insurance for the fiscal
9	year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023
10	\$ 11,989,094.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in any special fund in
13	the State Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi Department of
14	Insurance which is comprised of special source funds collected by
15	or otherwise available to the department, for the support of the
16	various offices of the department for the fiscal year beginning
17	July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023\$ 130,000.00.

18	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
19	this act, the following positions are authorized:

21	Permanent: Full Time 132

25	With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
26	responsibility to make certain that funds required for "Personal
27	Services" for Fiscal Year 2024 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2023
28	funds appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions
29	are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2023 budget by the
30	Mississippi Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the
31	agency's personal services appropriation, which shall be published
32	by the State Personnel Board. Additionally, the State Personnel
33	Board shall determine and publish the projected annualized payroll
34	costs based on current employees. It shall be the responsibility
35	of the agency head to ensure that actual personnel expenditures
36	for Fiscal Year 2023 do not exceed the data provided by the
37	Legislative Budget Office. If the agency's Fiscal Year 2023
38	projected cost exceeds the annualized costs, no salary actions
39	shall be processed by the State Personnel Board with the exception
40	of new hires that are determined to be essential for the agency.
41	Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
42	the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or

43	allowable	under	the	terms	set	forth	within	this	act.	The Stat

- 44 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
- 45 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
- 46 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
- 47 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
- 48 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
- 49 appropriated level.
- No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 51 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
- 52 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
- 53 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
- 55 violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating
- 56 to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
- 57 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
- Funds have been appropriated herein for the purpose of
- 59 funding Project SEC2 minimum salaries for all employees covered
- 60 under the Colonel Guy Groff/Neville Kenning Variable Compensation
- 61 Plan. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that the
- 62 funds are used to increase all employees' salaries up to the
- 63 minimum level as determined by the State Personnel Board.
- 64 **SECTION 4.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 65 Mississippi Department of Insurance shall maintain complete
- 66 accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all
- 67 funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be

68	in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fis	scal
69	Year 2022. It is further the intention of the Legislature t	hat
70	the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2024 shall be	
71	submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a for	rmat
72	and level of detail comparable to the format and level of de	etail
73	provided during the Fiscal Year 2023 budget request process.	
74	SECTION 5. In compliance with the "Mississippi Perform	nance
75	Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent	of
76	the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be util	ized
77	in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achie	eve the
78	intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding author	orized,
79	this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted

106	Section 1, Fifteen Thousand Seventy-nine Dollars (\$15,079.00)	is
107	provided for the Mississippi Fire Personnel Minimum Standards	and
108	Certification Board.	
109	SECTION 7. Of the funds appropriated under the provision	ns of
110	Section 1, funds in the amount of Twenty Thousand Dollars	
111	(\$20,000.00) are provided and shall be expended to pay the an	ınual
112	dues for the National Conference of Insurance Legislators.	
113	SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that	none
114	of the funds appropriated above shall be expended unless memb	ers
115	of the Mississippi House of Representatives and Mississippi S	Senate
116	are notified at least five (5) days prior to a public ceremon	ıy
117	announcing the award of any grant in their district or any pu	blic

118	announcement or ceremony regarding any project for which the
119	Legislature has made funds available. Any signage regarding any
120	public event or project shall include the following language:
121	"Funds were made available for this project by the Mississippi
122	State Legislature."
123	SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that
124	whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
125	purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
126	stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
127	quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
128	shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
129	the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
130	made without competitive bids.
131	SECTION 10. Within the limits of the funds available to the
132	Mississippi Insurance Department for such purpose, the
133	Commissioner of Insurance for the Mississippi Insurance Department
134	may grant a paid internship to students pursuing junior or senior
135	undergraduate level year coursework toward a bachelor's degree in
136	risk management insurance or graduate level coursework towards a
137	master's degree in business administration. Those applicants
138	deemed qualified by the Mississippi Department of Insurance shall
139	receive funds that may be used to pay for tuition, books and
140	related fees to pursue their degree. It is the intent of the

Legislature that the paid internship program shall be used as

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142	incentive for risk management insurance careers at the Mississippi
143	Insurance Department.
144	SECTION 11. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, Two
145	Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) is provided for the
146	State Fire Marshal's Office for fire safety prevention and
147	services, including, but not limited to, fire protection supplies
148	and materials, smoke alarms, and public service announcements
149	providing fire prevention information.
150	SECTION 12. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
151	of Section 2, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be
152	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury
153	to the credit of the Propane Education and Research Program Fund,
154	for the purpose of research and development of more cost effective
155	uses of propane and on educational programs, safety programs, and
156	market development of propane for the fiscal year beginning
157	July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023\$ 130,000.00.
158	SECTION 13. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
159	necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the State
160	Treasury to the credit of the Rural Fire Truck Acquisition Fund
161	and/or the Supplementary Rural Fire Truck Fund, which was created
162	in Section 152 of Chapter 1, Laws of 2004, Third Extraordinary
163	Session, to the Mississippi Department of Insurance for the Rural
164	Fire Truck Acquisition Assistance Program for the fiscal year
165	beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023
166	\$ 1,360,000.00.

167	Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under the
168	provisions of this section, in no event shall the amount expended
169	exceed the unexpended balance as of June 30, 2022.
170	SECTION 14. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
171	necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the State
172	Treasury to the credit of the Capital Expense Fund, for the
173	purpose of defraying the expenses of the Rural Fire Truck
174	Acquisition Assistance Fund and/or the Supplemental Rural Fire
175	Truck Fund, which was created in Section 152 of Chapter 1, Laws of
176	2004, Third Extraordinary Session, to the Mississippi Department
177	of Insurance for the Rural Fire Truck Acquisition Assistance
178	Program for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending
179	June 30, 2023\$ 2,000,000.00.
180	Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under the
181	provisions of this section, in no event shall the amount expended
182	exceed the unexpended balance as of June 30, 2022.
183	SECTION 15. With the funds appropriated herein, the
184	Mississippi Department of Insurance is authorized to make payment
185	for expenses incurred during Fiscal Year 2020 and 2021 as follows:

190	SECTION 16. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by

the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the

192	credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
193	warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
194	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
195	proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law
196	SECTION 17. This act shall take effect and be in force from
197	and after July 1, 2022, and shall stand repealed June 30, 2022.
