## HOUSE BILL NO. 1605 (As Sent to Governor)

1 2 3	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE SUPPORT AND MAINTENANCE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF WILDLIFE, FISHERIES AND PARKS FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2023.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State General
7	Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and maintenance
8	of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for the fiscal
9	year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023
10	\$ 9,540,002.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in any special fund in
13	the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of Wildlife,
14	Fisheries and Parks which is comprised of special source funds
15	collected by or otherwise available to the department for the
16	support and maintenance of the department, including the Museum of
17	Natural Science and the Bureau of Parks and Recreation, for the
18	fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023

19	\$ 80,144,536.00.
20	The following sum, which is included in the sum appropriated
21	above in this section, is appropriated out of the state excise
22	taxes upon gasoline, oil and other petroleum products to the
23	Fisheries and Wildlife Fund for the fiscal year beginning
24	July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023\$ 5,750,000.00.
25	The Department of Revenue is directed to set aside the amount
26	of this appropriation or any part thereof at any time it sees fit,
27	out of any collections of taxes upon gasoline, oil and other
28	petroleum products, and to deduct the amounts so set aside from
29	such funds before making distribution thereof. However,
30	provisions shall first be made for the Highway Bonds Sinking Fund,
31	as required under the provisions of Chapter 130, Laws of 1938, and
32	any amendments thereto, and Section 27-5-101, Mississippi Code of
33	1972.
34	Any funds available in the Wildlife Heritage Fund may be
35	expended by the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks as
36	authorized by law. The department shall make a detailed report to
37	the Legislature regarding the spending of the Wildlife Heritage
38	funds by September 1 for the preceding fiscal year.
39	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
40	Section 2 to the Bureau of Wildlife and Fisheries, funds in the
41	amount of One Hundred Twenty-five Thousand Three Hundred
42	Thirty-five Dollars (\$125,335.00) shall be derived from the
43	Education Enhancement Fund deposited pursuant to Sections 27-65-75

44	and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the purpose of
45	defraying the expenses of Project WILD for Fiscal Year 2023.
46	SECTION 4. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
47	this act, the following positions are authorized:
48	AUTHORIZED HEADCOUNT:
49	Permanent: Full Time 575
50	Time-Limited: Full Time 58
51	With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
52	responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal
53	Services for Fiscal Year 2024 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2023 funds
54	appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are
55	added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2023 budget by the Mississippi
56	Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's
57	personal services appropriation, which shall be published by the
58	State Personnel Board. Additionally, the State Personnel Board
59	shall determine and publish the projected annualized payroll costs
60	based on current employees. It shall be the responsibility of the
61	agency head to ensure that actual personnel expenditures for
62	Fiscal Year 2023 do not exceed the data provided by the
63	Legislative Budget Office. If the agency's Fiscal Year 2023
64	projected cost exceeds the annualized costs, no salary actions
65	shall be processed by the State Personnel Board with the exception
66	of new hires that are determined to be essential for the agency.
67	Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with

the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or

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- 69 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
- 70 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
- 71 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
- 72 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
- 73 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
- 74 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
- 75 appropriated level.
- No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 77 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
- 78 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
- 79 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
- 81 violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating
- 82 to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
- 83 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
- Funds have been appropriated herein for the purpose of
- 85 funding Project SEC2 minimum salaries for all employees covered
- 86 under the Colonel Guy Groff/Neville Kenning Variable Compensation
- 87 Plan. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that the
- 88 funds are used to increase all employees' salaries up to the
- 89 minimum level as determined by the State Personnel Board.
- 90 **SECTION 5.** Each conservation officer and supervisor shall be
- 91 furnished an allowance for uniforms not to exceed Five Hundred
- 92 Fifty Dollars (\$550.00) per annum.

93	Provided further, when any personnel of the Bureau of
94	Wildlife and Fisheries are transferred from one (1) county to
95	another on a permanent assignment, the expense monies now paid on
96	out-of-county duty shall not be applicable.
97	SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
98	Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall maintain
99	complete accounting and personnel records related to the
100	expenditure of all funds appropriated under this act and that such
101	records shall be in the same format and level of detail as
102	maintained for Fiscal Year 2022. It is further the intention of
103	the Legislature that the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year
104	2024 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee
105	in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level
106	of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2023 budget request
107	process.
108	SECTION 7. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
109	Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
110	the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
111	in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
112	intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,
113	this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted
114	performance measures provided below:

190	SECTION 8. Of the funds appropriated in Section	n 2, the								
191	following amount shall come from the Department of W	ildlife,								
192	Fisheries and Parks Special Pearl River Timber Fund N	No. 3465, for								

193	the purpose of making improvements to the Pearl River Wildlife
194	Management Area\$ 50,000.00.
195	SECTION 9. Of the funds appropriated within this act, the
196	Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks may enter into
197	cooperative agreements with the board of supervisors of any county
198	or any group or combination of counties for the purpose of
199	creating, improving or restoring parks, public game and fish
200	habitat lying or to be situated wholly or partially within such
201	county or in an adjoining county; and each county is empowered and
202	authorized, in its discretion, to expend funds from the general
203	county fund for such purposes from which fund they shall reimburse
204	to the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks the actual cost
205	of all surveying and engineering projects incurred by the
206	Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks incidental thereto.
207	Such boards of supervisors are further authorized and empowered,
208	in their discretion, to enter into agreements necessary to carry
209	out the purposes of this act with any other county, the United
210	States Forest Service or any other agency if same should be
211	necessary for the acquisition of land by lease or otherwise for
212	such purposes.
213	SECTION 10. It shall be unlawful for any officer, employee
214	or other person whatsoever to use or permit or authorize the use
215	of any automobile or any other motor vehicle owned by the State of
216	Mississippi or any department, agency or institution thereof for

217	any purpose	other	than	upon	the	offic	ial	business	of	the	State	of
218	Mississippi	or any	y ager	ncy, (	depar	rtment	or	institut	ion	thei	ceof.	

It is the intent of the Legislature that motor vehicles authorized to be owned and operated by this agency shall comply with Sections 25-1-77 through 25-1-93, Mississippi Code of 1972.

SECTION 11. In order to be in compliance with Section
63-1-201 et seq., funds are herein provided and may be expended by
the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks to pay the costs
of commercial driver's licenses for specific employees and/or to
reimburse such costs for specific employees who, in the course of
their duties and responsibilities, are required to hold a valid
Mississippi Commercial Driver's License.

SECTION 12. The Mississippi Department of Wildlife,
Fisheries and Parks is authorized to provide financial support of
One Hundred Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$175,000.00) and to
enter into an agreement with the Mississippi Cooperative Extension
Service for a project specialist and related supportive cost.

SECTION 13. The department is authorized to spend up to sixty percent (60%) of revenue in the State Park Timber Endowment Fund, as needed, to operate and maintain the state parks.

SECTION 14. It is the intention of the Legislature that whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind

- 242 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
- 243 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
- 244 made without competitive bids.
- 245 **SECTION 15.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, it is
- 246 the intention of the Legislature that Four Hundred Thousand
- 247 Dollars (\$400,000.00) is allocated for the detection and
- 248 prevention of Chronic Wasting Disease in deer populations across
- 249 the state.
- 250 **SECTION 16.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, it is
- 251 the intention of the Legislature that Seventy-five Thousand
- 252 Dollars (\$75,000.00) is allocated for LeFleur's Bluff State Park
- 253 for playground security expenses.
- 254 **SECTION 17.** Of the funds appropriated herein, Two Hundred
- 255 Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) may be provided to fund the Youth
- 256 Participation Initiative for the purpose of educating children in
- 257 the areas of hunting, fishing, conservation, and safety.
- 258 **SECTION 18.** The fund created pursuant to Section 49-5-21,
- 259 Mississippi Code of 1972, and known as the "Fisheries and Wildlife
- 260 Fund" shall be treated as a special trust fund. All funds derived
- 261 from the sale of licenses, fees, fines and other revenues received
- 262 by the department as provided by law, shall be deposited in the
- 263 Fisheries and Wildlife Fund. In addition, revenue derived from
- 264 the sale of timber on wildlife management areas, refuges and
- 265 preserves shall be deposited into an account established for such
- 266 revenues under the Fisheries and Wildlife Fund. The interest and

- any investment income earned on the fund shall be credited by the

  State Treasurer to the Fisheries and Wildlife Fund and shall not

  be paid into the General Fund. Any unexpended funds remaining in

  the fund at the end of the fiscal year shall not lapse and shall

  remain in the fund. Nothing in this section shall prevent the use

  of said funds from maintenance and upgrade of wildlife management

  areas.
- SECTION 19. It is the intention of the Legislature that no more than One Million Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,300,000.00) be expended from the Motor Vehicle Fund for the purchase of any type of motor vehicle.
- SECTION 20. The executive director of the Department of
  Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks is authorized to enter into an
  agreement with any public or private entities to manage any park
  or parks within the state park system.
- 282 SECTION 21. It is the intent of the Legislature that no 283 state-owned wildlife management area be closed and that to the 284 greatest practicable extent, department land management decisions 285 and actions may not result in any net loss of any acreage 286 available for hunting opportunities that existed on July 1, 2006, 287 as provided in Section 49-5-99(4). It is the intention of the 288 Legislature that no state park be closed without legislative 289 approval.
- 290 **SECTION 22.** It is the intent of the Legislature that the 291 Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have

- the authority to enter into multi-year contracts for the purpose of placing a sign on such state park property under the department's domain, in accordance with any applicable rules and regulations. All proceeds generated from these activities shall remain with the department and shall be deposited into the proper
- SECTION 23. It is the intent of the Legislature that from
  the funds available to the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and
  Parks, the department may purchase and pay premium(s) on property
  damage insurance on its motor vehicles, boats, trailers, real
  property improvements, buildings, furnishings, and such other
  assets as may be appropriate or practical, and/or as required by a
  granting entity.
- 305 **SECTION 24.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
  306 of Section 2, One Million Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars
  307 (\$1,750,000.00) shall be designated for the purpose of defraying
  308 the operational expenses of Special Projects. None of these funds
  309 shall be used for "Personal Services".
- 310 SECTION 25. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
  311 Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have the
  312 authority to receive, budget and expend funds from the Gulf and
  313 Wildlife Protection Fund, not to exceed Fifty Thousand Dollars
  314 (\$50,000.00) for the purpose of preservation, protection,
  315 conservation, and acquisition of waters, land and wildlife of this
  316 state.

317	SECTION 26. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, Ten
318	Million Dollars (\$10,000,000.00), or so much thereof, shall be
319	derived out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of
320	the Capital Expense Fund, as created in Section 27-103-303,

SECTION 28. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, it is the intention of the Legislature that Fifty-eight Thousand Five Hundred Ninety-three Dollars (\$58,593.00) may be allocated for the Hunter Education program supported from the General Fund court assessments.

SECTION 29. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
