6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
7	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
8	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State General
9	Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the Governor's
LO	Office - Division of Medicaid for the purpose of providing medical
L1	assistance under the Mississippi Medicaid Law and defraying the
L2	expenses of the administration of such law, as provided in Section
L3	43-13-101 et seq., Mississippi Code of 1972, for the fiscal year
L 4	beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023
L5	\$ 837,071,754.00.
L 6	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
L7	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury
L8	to the credit of the Medical Care Fund created by Section
L 9	43-13-143, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the purpose of providing

20	medical assistance under the Mississippi Medicaid Law for the
21	fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023
22	\$ 366,702,314.00.
23	SECTION 3. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
24	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in any special fund in
25	the State Treasury to the credit of the Governor's
26	Office - Division of Medicaid which is comprised of special source
27	funds collected by or otherwise available to the Division, for the
28	purpose of providing medical assistance under the Mississippi
29	Medicaid Law and defraying the expenses of the administration of
30	such law, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending
31	June 30, 2023\$ 5,187,873,061.00.
32	Prior period recovery of funds may be maintained and expended
33	by the division when the recovery is received or finalized. Any
34	recoveries due to audits or third party recoveries may be used to

36	such, the division may escalate Contractual Services as needed for

38	SECTION 4. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be

47	It is the intention of the Legislature that funds may be

51	SECTION 5. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
52	this act, the following positions are authorized:

58	With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
59	responsibility to make certain that funds required for "Personal
60	Services" for Fiscal Year 2024 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2023
51	funds appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions
62	are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2023 budget by the
63	Mississippi Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the
64	agency's personal services appropriation, which shall be published
65	by the State Personnel Board. Additionally, the State Personnel
66	Board shall determine and publish the projected annualized payroll
67	costs based on current employees. It shall be the responsibility
68	of the agency head to ensure that actual personnel expenditures
69	for Fiscal Year 2023 do not exceed the data provided by the

- 83 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are 84
- 85 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
- 86 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- 87 None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
- 88 violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating
- 89 to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
- 90 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
- 91 Funds have been appropriated herein for the purpose of
- funding Project SEC2 minimum salaries for all employees covered 92
- 93 under the Colonel Guy Groff/Neville Kenning Variable Compensation
- It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that the 94

95 funds are used to increase all employees' salaries up to the 96 minimum level as determined by the State Personnel Board.

SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Governor's Office - Division of Medicaid shall maintain complete accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 2022. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2024 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2023 budget request process with the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) being separated from the Medical Services Program and submitted as a separate program. All Medicaid 1915 (C) Home and Community Based Services Waivers shall be presented as a budget program separate from the Medical Services Program. In addition, the performance measures reported for the Medical Services Program shall include an unduplicated case count of individuals served by eligibility status, and the number and the costs of emergency room visits.

SECTION 7. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,

193	SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that	

whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the

195	purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
196	stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
197	quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
198	shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
199	the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
200	made without competitive hids

SECTION 9. The Governor's Office - Division of Medicaid shall provide statistical and financial reports on a monthly basis to the Legislative Budget Office and the PEER Committee. reports shall include, but are not limited to, an accounting of all funds spent in the medical program, the CHIP program, the Dialysis Transportation program, and each of the Home and Community Based Waiver programs, and an accounting of all funds spent in the administrative program, participant statistics and any other information requested by the Legislative Budget Office and the PEER Committee.

The Governor's Office - Division of Medicaid shall perform its cash flow projections on a predetermined monthly schedule and make this and any other information requested available, upon request, to the Chair of the Senate Public Health and Welfare Committee, the House Public Health and Human Services Committee, the House and Senate Medicaid Committees, the House and Senate Appropriations Committees, the Legislative Budget Office and the PEER Committee. A summary of this cash flow projection shall also be presented in the report referenced in the above paragraph.

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220	SECTION 10. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
221	of this act in an amount not to exceed, Two Million Seven Hundred
222	Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$2,750,000.00) is provided for the purpose
223	of funding a temporary program to provide nonemergency
224	transportation to locations for necessary dialysis services for
225	end-stage renal disease patients who are sixty-five (65) years of

237	are provided for five (5) slots in the Assisted Living Waiver
238	program for persons with Traumatic Brain Injury and in need of
239	Cognitive Rehabilitation. The Division shall develop eligibility
240	criteria for these additional slots.
241	SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
242	funds appropriated in this act to the Governor's Office - Division
243	of Medicaid for the Mississippi Coordinated Access Network
244	(MS-CAN) program be used in the most efficient and effective

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- 246 The division and the coordinated care organizations with which the
- 247 division has contracted to conduct the MS-CAN program shall
- 248 establish baselines for the health-related outcome measurement for

- 266 **SECTION 13.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 267 Governor's Office Division of Medicaid and the Department of
- 268 Human Services shall continue to work together to implement HB

269 1090 of the 2017 Regular Session, known as the "Medicaid and Human 270 Services Transparency and Fraud Prevention Act".

SECTION 14. The Governor's Office - Division of Medicaid is authorized to expend funds appropriated herein as necessary to provide currently existing home and community based services through any CMS approved state plan or home and community based services waiver to individuals who qualify for those services to avoid institutionalization or to transition an individual from an institution to any home and community based setting. Provision of such services shall not count against any limit imposed under this act. It is the intention of the Legislature that the cost of providing home and community based services shall not exceed the cost of nursing facility services, as determined by the Division.

SECTION 15. Of the funds appropriated herein, no more than

Ten Thousand Nine Hundred Forty-six Dollars and Six Cents

(\$10,946.06) may be used to pay invoices from Fiscal Year 2020 for expenses to the Sovereign States Drug Consortium for Medicaid supplemental drug rebate group purchasing services.

SECTION 16. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.

293 **SECTION 17.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 294 and after July 1, 2022, and shall stand repealed June 30, 2022.
