## HOUSE BILL NO. 1616

| 1<br>2<br>3 | AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE SUPPORT AND MAINTENANCE OF THE STATE FORESTRY COMMISSION FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2023. |
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| 4           | BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:   |
| 5           | SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be  |
| 6           | necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State General  |
| 7           | Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and maintenance  |
| 8           | of the State Forestry Commission for the fiscal year beginning  |
| 9           | July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023  |
| 10          | \$ 14,289,905.00.   |
| 11          | SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be  |
| 12          | necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the special fund in  |
| 13          | the State Treasury to the credit of the State Forestry Commission   |
| 14          | which is comprised of special source funds collected by or  |
| 15          | otherwise available to the commission, for the support and  |
| 16          | maintenance of the commission for the fiscal year beginning   |
| 17          | July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023  |
| 18          | \$ 11,855,334.00.   |

| 19 | Of the funds specified in this section, Two Hundred Fifty          |
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| 20 | Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) shall be deposited in a fund       |
| 21 | created in the State Treasury called the "Forest Improvement       |
| 22 | Revolving Fund." Money in this fund shall be used by the State     |
| 23 | Forestry Commission to assist in the reforestation and growth      |
| 24 | improvement of the forests, woodlands, and publicly owned lands or |
| 25 | the state, including sixteenth section lands, Camp Shelby,         |
| 26 | Columbia Training School and colleges and universities.            |
| 27 | Landowners who contract with the commission for such work shall    |
| 28 | pay to the commission its actual cost for conducting such work.    |
| 29 | Money received for this work by the commission shall be paid into  |
| 30 | the State Treasury, and the State Treasurer shall deposit such     |
| 31 | money in the "Forest Improvement Revolving Fund."                  |
| 32 | SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of       |
| 33 | this act, the following positions are authorized:                  |
| 34 | AUTHORIZED POSITIONS:  |
| 35 | Permanent: Full Time 289   |
| 36 | Part Time 0  |
| 37 | Time-Limited: Full Time 6  |
| 38 | Part Time 0  |
| 39 | With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's       |
| 40 | responsibility to make certain that funds required for "Personal   |
| 41 | Services" for Fiscal Year 2024 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2023      |
| 42 | funds appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions   |
| 43 | are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2023 budget by the           |

| 44 | MISSISSIPPI Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the       |
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| 45 | agency's personal services appropriation, which shall be published |
| 46 | by the State Personnel Board. Additionally, the State Personnel    |
| 47 | Board shall determine and publish the projected annualized payroll |
| 48 | costs based on current employees. It shall be the responsibility   |
| 49 | of the agency head to ensure that actual personnel expenditures    |
| 50 | for Fiscal Year 2023 do not exceed the data provided by the        |
| 51 | Legislative Budget Office. If the agency's Fiscal Year 2023        |
| 52 | projected cost exceeds the annualized costs, no salary actions     |
| 53 | shall be processed by the State Personnel Board with the exception |
| 54 | of new hires that are determined to be essential for the agency.   |
| 55 | Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with      |
| 56 | the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or         |
| 57 | allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State     |
| 58 | Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written       |
| 59 | approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The    |
| 60 | Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written |
| 61 | approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions       |
| 62 | without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the |
| 63 | appropriated level.  |
| 64 | No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be         |
| 65 | used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are |

being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this

act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

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| 68 | None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in            |
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| 69 | violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating |
| 70 | to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as         |
| 71 | interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.                   |

- 72 Funds have been appropriated herein for the purpose of funding Project SEC2 minimum salaries for all employees covered 73 74 under the Colonel Guy Groff/Neville Kenning Variable Compensation 75 It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that the funds are used to increase all employees' salaries up to the 76 77 minimum level as determined by the State Personnel Board.
- 78 SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 79 State Forestry Commission shall maintain complete accounting and 80 personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds 81 appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the 82 same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 83 2022. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the 84 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2024 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of 85 86 detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided 87 during the Fiscal Year 2023 budget request process.
- SECTION 5. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance 88 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of 89 90 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized 91 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, 92

| 114 | agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget  |

| 116 | SECTION 6. There is created in the State Treasury a fund           |
| 117 | designated as the Volunteer Fire Department Equipment Conversion   |

| 118 | Revolving Fund to be used by the State Forestry Commission to     |
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| 119 | assist in the conversion of vehicles acquired by the State        |
| 120 | Forestry Commission through the Federal Excess Personal Property  |
| 121 | Program or by volunteer fire departments through other means to   |
| 122 | adapt them for use in the suppression of wildland fires. This     |
| 123 | assistance shall be in the form of fabrication of water tanks or  |
| 124 | other accessories necessary for the operation of fire suppression |
| 125 | units, installation of piping and valves, painting or other       |
| 126 | similar or associated component work necessary to place fire      |
| 127 | suppression equipment into service. It is not for general vehicle |
| 128 | maintenance or repair.  |
| 129 | The Volunteer Fire Department Equipment Conversion Revolving      |
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Fund shall be funded by monies received from charges for work and services performed for volunteer fire departments by the State Forestry Commission. Monies collected from such charges shall be deposited into the Volunteer Fire Department Equipment Conversion Revolving Fund. The State Treasurer shall make disbursements therefrom for payment of materials, supplies and labor upon requisition of the Forestry Commission and upon the issuance of warrants therefor by the Department of Finance and Administration.

The amount of monies deposited into the Volunteer Fire

Department Equipment Conversion Fund through this work shall not

exceed Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00). Funds in excess of

Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) shall be placed in the State

Forestry Commission's regular appropriated special funds. Monies

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- 144 shall be carried forward from one fiscal year to the next.
- 145 **SECTION 7.** There is created in the State Treasury a fund
- 146 designated as the Camden State Forest Revolving Fund to be used by
- 147 the State Forestry Commission to direct forest management
- 148 activities on the Camden State Forest in Madison County,
- 149 Mississippi. The forest management activities will include, but
- 150 not be limited to, maintenance of property, timber sale activities
- 151 and regeneration work.
- The Camden State Forest Revolving Fund shall be funded by
- 153 monies received from timber sales, leases, and any other source.
- 154 Monies collected from these income sources shall be deposited into
- 155 the Camden State Forest Revolving Fund. The State Treasurer shall
- 156 make disbursements therefrom for payments of materials, supplies
- 157 and labor upon requisition of the State Forestry Commission and
- 158 upon the issuance of warrants therefor by the Department of
- 159 Finance and Administration.
- 160 It is the intention of the Legislature that any revolving
- 161 funds in excess of the budgeted amount needed for the necessary
- 162 operation and maintenance of all properties under the direct
- 163 supervision and management of the State Forestry Commission shall
- 164 remain in the Camden State Forest Revolving Fund for use in future
- 165 years.
- SECTION 8. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, it is the
- 167 intention of the Legislature that Two Hundred Thousand Dollars

- 171 **SECTION 9.** Any funds in the Salary, Wages and Fringe
- 172 Benefits major object of expenditure may be used to purchase
- 173 accumulated compensatory time within the funds available.
- 174 **SECTION 10.** It is the intention of the Legislature that
- 175 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
- 176 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
- 177 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
- 178 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
- 179 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
- 180 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
- 181 made without competitive bids.
- SECTION 11. Any person who was an employee of the Forestry
- 183 Commission who was laid off during Fiscal Year 2006 shall be given
- 184 first priority in any new employment by the commission.
- 185 **SECTION 12.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 186 funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with
- 187 Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency
- 188 shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their
- 189 appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally
- 190 or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for
- 191 actions contrary to this provision.

| SECTION 13. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by        |
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| the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the |
| credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon |
| warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal |
| Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the  |
| proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law |
| SECTION 14. This act shall take effect and be in force from       |
| and after July 1, 2022, and shall stand repealed June 30, 2022.   |
