HOUSE BILL NO. 1630 (As Sent to Governor)

1 AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FROM SPECIAL FUNDS IN THE 2 STATE TREASURY FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING THE EXPENSES OF THE 3 MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 4 2023; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 6 7 necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of Transportation Funds, for the 8 9 purpose of defraying the administrative expenses of the 10 Mississippi Department of Transportation for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023..... 11 12\$ 1,426,077,673.00. **SECTION 2.** The following offices are supported by the funds 13 14 appropriated in Section 1: The Office of Administrative Services, the Office of Highways and the Office of Aeronautics and Rails. 15 Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of Section 1, the 16 17 following positions are authorized: AUTHORIZED HEADCOUNT: 18 19 Permanent: 2,906 A1/2H. 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Time-Limited:

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21 With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's 22 responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal 23 Services for Fiscal Year 2024 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2023 funds 24 appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are 25 added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2023 budget by the Mississippi Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's 26 27 personal services appropriation, which shall be published by the 28 State Personnel Board. Additionally, the State Personnel Board 29 shall determine and publish the projected annualized payroll costs 30 based on current employees. It shall be the responsibility of the 31 agency head to ensure that actual personnel expenditures for 32 Fiscal Year 2023 do not exceed the data provided by the Legislative Budget Office. If the agency's Fiscal Year 2023 33 34 projected cost exceeds the annualized costs, no salary actions 35 shall be processed by the State Personnel Board with the exception 36 of new hires that are determined to be essential for the agency.

Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.

Funds have been appropriated herein for the purpose of funding Project SEC2 minimum salaries for all employees covered under the Colonel Guy Groff/Neville Kenning Variable Compensation Plan. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that the funds are used to increase all employees' salaries up to the minimum level as determined by the State Personnel Board.

60 SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated to the Mississippi 61 Department of Transportation under the provisions of Section 1, 62 the following amounts shall be available for expenditure in the 63 program budgets as required by Section 27-103-127, Mississippi 64 Code of 1972:

It is the intention of the Legislature that the 71 Mississippi Department of Transportation shall maintain complete 72 accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all 73 funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be 74 in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal 75 Year 2022. It is further the intention of the Legislature that 76 the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2024 shall be 77 submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format 78 and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail 79 provided during the Fiscal Year 2023 budget request process.

80 SECTION 5. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, it is the 81 intention of the Legislature that Six Hundred Fifty Thousand 82 Dollars (\$650,000.00) shall be transferred to the Department of 83 Agriculture and Commerce for the Beaver Control or Eradication 84 Program during the Fiscal Year 2023.

SECTION 6. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 and authorized for expenditure in Section 3, Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000.00) shall be transferred by the Mississippi Department of Transportation to the Department of Public Safety Office of Commercial Transportation Enforcement Division for the operations of the Division as authorized to be relocated in Senate Bill 2825, 2021 Regular Session.

92 SECTION 7. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this 93 act, the Mississippi Department of Transportation shall expend

94 such funds as necessary to conduct project planning. Such project 95 planning shall apply to all preliminary engineering, right-of-way 96 acquisition and construction projects of the department and, at a 97 minimum, shall consist of policies for the oversight and 98 management of project cost which:

99 (a) Establish a reasonable cost estimate for each 100 project. For purposes of this provision, projects include 101 preliminary engineering, right-of-way acquisition and 102 construction;

103 (b) Capture and retain the initial project cost104 estimates for comparison with final actual expenditures;

(c) Require that any changes to a cost estimate for a project will be reviewed and approved by district or central office personnel. Such personnel shall be responsible for signing any revision, and providing a narrative description of the reasons for approving a revision;

(d) Capture the cost of consultants, engineers, attorneys, contract appraisers and other technical and professional contractors used in preliminary engineering, right-of-way acquisition and construction projects.

114 SECTION 8. None of the funds appropriated under the 115 provisions of Section 1 of this act may be expended by the 116 Department of Transportation for construction of new highways if 117 such highway segment is less than ten (10) miles in length unless:

(a) The explanation and justification for letting such
a contract for a length of less than ten (10) miles is entered
upon the official minutes of the Transportation Commission;

(b) The commission, within ten (10) working days after entry of its explanation and justification upon its minutes, gives notice, by United States First Class Mail, and provides a copy of such entry upon its minutes, to the Chairman of the Transportation Committee of the Mississippi House of Representatives and the Chairman of the Mississippi Senate Highways and Transportation Committee.

128 SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that of the 129 sum appropriated in Section 1, the Department is authorized to 130 provide a protective footwear allowance of not more than \$150 per 131 person annually for Engineers, Maintenance, and Construction 132 Workers as part of their safety equipment.

SECTION 10. Of the funds appropriated to the Mississippi Department of Transportation, Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000.00) shall be used for the Statewide Litter Prevention Program.

137 SECTION 11. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, not less 138 than Eighty Million Dollars (\$80,000,000.00) shall be expended for 139 contracted maintenance overlay and pavement rehabilitation.

140 **SECTION 12.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the 141 Mississippi Department of Transportation is authorized to expend 142 with funds which were obligated in Fiscal Year 2022 for

143 maintenance overlay projects and maintenance repair projects but 144 not completed by the end of Fiscal Year 2022, in an amount not to 145 exceed Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000.00).

SECTION 13. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Mississippi Department of Transportation is authorized to transfer between the various programs in an amount not to exceed ten percent (10%) of the amount allocated in Section 3, except that no transfers shall be authorized which increase the "Administrative and Other Expenses" Program or which decrease the "Maintenance" Program.

153 **SECTION 14.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the 154 Mississippi Department of Transportation is authorized to expend 155 an amount not to exceed Thirty Million Dollars (\$30,000,000.00) 156 received from other public or private entities as reimbursements 157 for payments made on federal projects.

158 SECTION 15. With the funds appropriated in this act, the 159 Mississippi Department of Transportation shall notify members of 160 the Mississippi Senate and House of Representatives upon the award 161 of projects within their respective districts and at least five 162 (5) days prior to a public ceremony announcing the award of any 163 grant in their district or any public announcement of ceremony 164 regarding the groundbreaking or opening of a facility, roadway or 165 bridge for which the Legislature has made funds available. Anv 166 signage regarding any public event or any new facility, roadway or bridge shall include the following language: "Funds were made 167

168 available for this project by the Mississippi State Legislature."
169 Further, the signage shall state the four-year legislative term in
170 which the project was funded.

171 SECTION 16. It is the intention of the Legislature that 172 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the 173 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, 174 175 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind 176 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are 177 178 made without competitive bids.

SECTION 17. The Mississippi Department of Transportation is authorized to dispose of or transfer used cell phones that are obsolete or inoperable to cell phone recycling programs dedicated to providing free phone access to United States military personnel.

SECTION 18. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted performance measures provided below:

In the event the Transportation Commission deviates from the recommended priorities presented in the Capacity Program, the Commission shall spread the specific reasons for deviation on its minutes in accordance with Section 65-3-97, Mississippi Code of 1972 Annotated.

318 **SECTION 24.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 319 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 320 321 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 322 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 323 SECTION 25. This act shall take effect and be in force from 324 325 and after July 1, 2022.
