## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 45

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING THE OLE 2 MISS REBELS WOMEN'S GOLF TEAM AND COACH KORY HENKES FOR WINNING 3 THE 2021 NCAA DIVISION I NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP. 4 WHEREAS, it was a fairytale ending for Ole Miss Women's Golf at Grayhawk Golf Club in Scottsdale, Arizona, defeating Oklahoma 5 State University 4-1 on May 26, 2021, to capture the 2021 NCAA 6 Division I National Championship; and 7 8 WHEREAS, with the title, the University of Mississippi 9 claimed its first team National Championship since the school's 1962 football title, and these Rebels also became the first 10 11 University of Mississippi women's team to claim an NCAA National Championship; and 12 13 WHEREAS, in the final match of the season, with a national 14 championship on the line, Sophomore Chiara Tamburlini was eager to

win her team a point for the first time and did just that out of

17 birdieing three of her first seven holes, but more importantly,

18 building a commanding six-hole lead through nine; though she

19 conceded her first hole of the day on number 10 when she took a 20 par 4 on number 12 to put the pressure on Oklahoma State 21 University; and not wasting any time, Tamburlini won 6 and 5 to 22 put the first point on the board; and

23 WHEREAS, Kennedy Swann teed off in her customary leadoff 24 spot, extending her career match play record to 10-2 after being tied through the first six holes in match play before the senior 25 26 began to separate herself by sinking an eagle on number 7 to go 1 27 up; and after the eagle, Swann continued with a birdie and a par 28 to go 3-up heading into the back nine and Oklahoma State managed 29 to cut the deficit to one, but the Austin, Texas, native 30 responded, going stroke-for-stroke before sinking the final birdie 31 on number 17 to snag the second point and inch Ole Miss that much 32 closer to the title; and

WHEREAS, "It took a lot of players to buy in," said Head 33 34 Coach Kory Henkes, "Our team is very disciplined, and I think 35 that's what I pride us on the most. When we come out to practice, we have a purpose every single day, and we hold each other 36 37 accountable which is the really cool part about it. We don't 38 necessarily have to push them as much as they are going to push 39 each other. I think that's the important part of team chemistry, 40 having everyone buy into the same thing."; and

41 WHEREAS, during the postseason, the Ole Miss Women's Golf 42 Team received many awards following its first national title in 43 program history, including Head Coach Kory Henkes being named the

becoming the first Rebel Head Coach to earn the award from the
Women's Golf Coaches Association (WGCA); and

48 WHEREAS, Ole Miss finished in fourth place or better in nine 49 of the team's 10 tournaments during the 2020-2021 season, including first place finishes at the East Lake Cup and Gators 50 51 Invitational; the top five Ole Miss single-round averages 52 throughout a season have all come during Coach Henkes' tenure, including the 2020-2021 mark of 289.4, which ranks second in 53 54 program history; the nine top 5 team finishes during the 2020-2021 55 season are also a new school record; and Julia Johnson and Kennedy 56 Swann earned WGCA All-American honors, with Johnson becoming the 57 program's first-ever First Team All-American; and

58 WHEREAS, under Coach Henkes' guidance, Julia Johnson finished 59 the season ranked eighth individually in the NCAA by both Golfstat 60 and Golfweek and led the team in stroke average (71.34), tallying 61 five Top 5, eight Top 10 and nine Top 20 finishes during this 62 season, including a fifth place individual finish at the NCAA 63 Championship; and

64 WHEREAS, the Ole Miss Women's Golf Team earned its first-ever 65 WGCA All-Scholar Team GPA Award ranking 10th in the nation among 66 more than 300 NCAA Division I schools with a cumulative team grade 67 point average of 3.88 for the 2020-2021 academic year, and four
