- 3 WHEREAS, it is written in Ecclesiastes 3:1 that "To
- 4 everything there is a season, and a time for every purpose under
- 5 the Heaven," and as such, on Friday, February 4, 2022, the
- 6 immaculate author and finisher of our soul's destiny summoned the
- 7 mortal presence of dearly beloved, Mr. John Girard Guthrie, to
- 8 eternal rest, rendering great sorrow and loss to his family,
- 9 friends and community; and
- 10 WHEREAS, the State of Mississippi lost a wonderful friend,
- 11 loving father and dedicated community leader with the passing of
- 12 Mr. Guthrie, who was born in Deerfield, Florida, on September 6,
- 13 1925, and grew up in West Lafayette, Indiana, where he was an
- 14 All-State football guard at West Lafayette High School, and there
- 15 is now a hush in our hearts as we come together to pay our
- 16 respects to the memory of one who has been called to join that
- 17 innumerable heavenly caravan; and

- 18 WHEREAS, Mr. Guthrie was a man of uncompromised faith and 19 very active in the First United Methodist Church of Wiggins, where 20 he had 67 years of perfect attendance in Sunday School, sang in the choir for 60 years, and served as a Sunday School teacher, 21 22 trustee, and in numerous other roles, and he now enjoys the 23 eternal peace described in Luke 2:29, "Lord, now you are letting your servant depart in peace, according to your word"; and 24 25 WHEREAS, consumed with an altruistic desire to defend his 26 country, Mr. Guthrie joined an elite fraternity of airmen in what 27 is now the United States Air Force, where he courageously served 28 as a fighter pilot during World War II, and after his time in the
- military, he attended Purdue University, where he was a member of the Sigma Chi Fraternity and completed a bachelor of science in forestry degree in 1948; and
- 32 WHEREAS, during his tenure at Purdue, he not only received
 33 his bachelor's degree, but he also met the love of his life,
 34 Randalin Tuesburg, and the two lovebirds exchanged the vows of
 35 holy matrimony in February 1949 and enjoyed 64 years of marriage
 36 before Randalin's passing; and
- 37 WHEREAS, Mr. Guthrie's first job upon graduation was with the 38 Illinois Central Railroad as a forestry agent to help reforest the 39 south, so he and his wife moved to Hattiesburg, Mississippi, and 40 brought Purdue's prototype mechanical tree planter, and Mr.
- 41 Guthrie helped perfect the tree planter into what became known as

- 42 the Illinois Central Tree Planter, earning him the nickname,
- 43 "Johnny Pinetree"; and
- 44 WHEREAS, later in his professional life, Mr. Guthrie began to
- 45 work for Dantzler Lumber Company, moved to Wiggins, Mississippi,
- 46 in 1951, and eventually opened what is now John G. Guthrie and
- 47 Sons in 1954, and throughout the entirety of his career, he
- 48 remained an advocate for the forestry profession and was issued
- 49 Registered Forester License No. 1 in Mississippi, and he served as
- 50 the first chairman for the Mississippi Board of Registration for
- 51 Foresters; and
- 52 WHEREAS, additionally, he was a licensed real estate broker
- 53 and served on the Mississippi Real Estate Appraiser Licensing and
- 54 Certification Board, served as a member of the Society of American
- 55 Foresters for 73 years, as a charter member of the Mississippi
- 56 Association of Consulting Foresters, as a past president of the
- 57 Mississippi Forestry Association, and on the board for Forestry
- 58 Suppliers, Inc.; and
- 59 WHEREAS, Mr. Guthrie was a 72-year member and past master of
- 60 J.L. Power Masonic Lodge No. 416 F. and A.M. in Perkinston,
- 61 Mississippi, and a longtime member of Knights Templar, Scottish
- 62 Rite, Miriam Chapter No. 67 Order of the Eastern Star (Past
- 63 Patron), Gideons International and Neighborhood Watchdogs in
- 64 Wiggins, and he was active in the Boy Scouts, where he received
- 65 the Silver Beaver, Pine Burr and Good Scout awards, served as a
- 66 Scout Master, and was on the Pine Burr Area Council Camp Committee

- 67 locating Camp Tiak in Fruitland Park, and he also served on the
- 68 Girl Scout Camp Committee to locate and purchase the Gulf Pine
- 69 Council Camp Iti Kana; and
- 70 WHEREAS, the memory of Mr. John Girard Guthrie, a man held in
- 71 the highest regard by friends and family as an inspiring and
- 72 precious gift from God, will continue to refresh the hearts and
- 73 memories of his beloved survivors: his children, Suzanne, John
- 74 G., Jr. (Sonja), James D. (Sherrye) and Randal L. (Connie); 10
- 75 grandchildren, David (Jennifer), Anny (Jacob Dykes), Christopher,
- 76 Joseph (Kharri), Samantha (John Thames), Katie (Jason Leist), Rand
- 77 (Ashley), Calista (Austin Mills), Sarah and John G., III; 20
- 78 great-grandchildren with two more on the way; and a host of other
- 79 relatives and friends; and
- 80 WHEREAS, we encourage the family to find solace from the
- 81 overwhelming sadness created by the earthly departure of their
- 82 beloved family member in Revelation 21:4, wherein is recorded,
- 83 "And God shall wipe away all tears from their eyes; and there
- 84 shall be no more death, neither sorrow, nor crying, neither shall
- 85 there be any more pain: for the former things are passed away" and
- 86 renewed in their faith that Mr. Guthrie fulfilled the commandment
- 87 of II Timothy 4:7 by having "fought a good fight, finishing his
- 88 course and keeping the faith until the hour of his departure was
- 89 at hand"; and
