## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 75

1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE LIFE, SERVICE AND
2	ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF MRS. HILDA LOUISE SMITH CASIN AND ACKNOWLEDGING
3	HER SIGNIFICANT EDUCATIONAL AND CIVIC CONTRIBUTION TO PIKE COUNTY,
4	MISSISSIPPI.

- 5 WHEREAS, the only child of her late parents, Mr. Willie B.
- 6 and Mrs. Ruth Mae Bonds Smith, born and reared in McComb,
- 7 Mississippi, on the precept tenets of humility, integrity,
- 8 intestinal fortitude and the importance of education, Mrs. Hilda
- 9 Louise Smith Casin premised her life to one of service to
- 10 humanity, starting right in her native home; and
- 11 WHEREAS, a 1948 graduate of Burglund High School, a young
- 12 Louise attended Southern Christian Institute, where she received
- 13 her associate's degree in 1950, which prepared her for her
- 14 inaugural entry into the wonderful world of educational
- 15 instruction, which commenced during the fall of the same year at
- 16 Stephenson Elementary School as a fourth and fifth grade teacher;
- 17 and
- 18 WHEREAS, eager to sharpen her educational acumen and expand
- 19 her arsenal of instructional tools, Mrs. Casin embarked upon a

- 20 journey of undergraduate and postgraduate matriculation, which
- 21 materialized in her receipt of a bachelor of science degree in
- 22 elementary education from Jackson State University in 1959, a
- 23 National Science Foundation Grant to attend Depauw University
- 24 during the summer of 1962, and both a master of science degree in
- 25 guidance and counseling and an education specialist degree in
- 26 educational administration from the University of Mississippi, in
- 27 1969 and 1977 respectively; and
- 28 WHEREAS, on a trailblazing trajectory for career success in
- 29 her chosen profession, Mrs. Casin was one of 19 national
- 30 participants chosen to attend the Computer Assisted Instruction
- 31 Institute at Stanford University in 1969, and became the first
- 32 African-American inductee into the University of Mississippi
- 33 Chapter of Kappa Delta Pi Education Honor Society; and
- 34 WHEREAS, Mrs. Casin's commitment to educational excellence
- 35 and the success of students under her instructional tutelage and
- 36 quidance spanned the course of 50 years until her retirement in
- 37 2000, which encompassed the ascent from roles as an instructor to
- 38 an apex conclusion in a supervisory position as a district
- 39 administrator for the final 27 years of her career, and witnessed
- 40 the inception of a personal self-funded scholarship to assist
- 41 students in attending the college or university of their choice;
- 42 and
- WHEREAS, her community service is inclusive of a broad span
- 44 of civic and social involvement, stemming from the McComb Library

- 45 Board, the Railroad Museum Board, the Pike County Chamber of
- 46 Commerce Board, Pike County Teachers Federal Credit Union Board,
- 47 Pike County Business League, NAACP, Jackson State University
- 48 Alumni Association and the McComb Historic Preservation
- 49 Commission, the latter of which inspired her to establish Pike
- 50 County's Black History Gallery as a 501(c)(3) nonprofit
- 51 organization listed within the State of Mississippi's Tourism
- 52 Guide Book; and
- 53 WHEREAS, with these affiliations, she has been on the
- 54 receiving end of numerous accolades of acknowledgement, including,
- 55 but not limited to: the Georgia Westbrook Club Award for
- 56 Excellence; 24th Street Church Award; Walker's Chapel Church
- 57 Award; McComb Club Award; McComb-Pike Reading Council's IRA
- 58 Service Award; the McComb Negro Business and Professional's Woman
- 59 of the Year Award; Alpha Kappa Alpha Phi Mu Omega Chapter
- 60 Community Service Award; NAACP's C.C. Bryant Lifetime Achievement
- 61 Award; Pike County Chamber of Commerce's Lifetime Achievement
- 62 Award; Jubilee Performing Arts Center's Lifetime Achievement
- 63 Award; Enterprise Journal's Lifetime Achievement Award; and
- 64 Chapter of the Delta Kappa Gamma's Red Rose Award; and
- 65 WHEREAS, having been encouraged, inspired and supported in
- 66 all of her career and civic endeavor by her late husband, Silas
- 67 Casin, Jr., until his untimely transition, Mrs. Casin continues to
- 68 enjoy the boundless affection and inspiration of her immediate
- 69 family circle, including: her daughter, Dr. Sylvia Casin-Brown;

- 70 grandson, Justin E. Armstrong; and completed by the calvary of
- 71 Thompson, Webb, Harris, Bonds and Barnes families; and
- 72 WHEREAS, it is the policy of this Legislature to commend the
- 73 excellence displayed in the venerable lives and careers of such
- 74 esteemed Mississippians of Mrs. Casin's caliber, whose lifetime of
- 75 educational prowess is attributable to shaping the minds and
- 76 futures of countless thousands of students and families with whom
- 77 she interacted and the enduring impacts upon lineal generations
- 78 which followed:
- 79 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF
- 80 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE SENATE CONCURRING
- 81 THEREIN, That we do hereby commend the life, service and
- 82 accomplishments of Mrs. Hilda Louise Smith Casin and acknowledge
- 83 her significant educational and civic contributions to Pike
- 84 County, Mississippi.
