 6 GAME DAY DIVISION, SECOND PLACE AT THE DEEP SOUTH ROCK N' ROLL
 7 CLASSIC, AND SEVENTH PLACE IN THE MEDIUM NON-TUMBLING GAME DAY
 8 DIVISION AT THE UCA NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL CHEER CHAMPIONSHIPS.
