- 3 WHEREAS, it is written in Ecclesiastes 3:1 that "To
- 4 everything there is a season, and a time for every purpose under
- 5 the Heaven," and as such, on December 27, 2021, the grand
- 6 architect of the universe summoned the mortal presence of dearly
- 7 beloved, Mr. Johnny Allen Morrow, to eternal rest, rendering great
- 8 sorrow and loss to his family, friends and community; and
- 9 WHEREAS, the City of Jackson and the State of Mississippi
- 10 lost a wonderful friend and community leader with the passing of
- 11 Mr. Morrow, who was called "Bootsy" by those who knew and loved
- 12 him and was born on October 21, 1954, and he attended Lanier High
- 13 School and Jackson State University; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Mr. Morrow was a well-known and respected
- 15 entrepreneur, businessman and collector in the Georgetown
- 16 Community in Jackson, as he owned and operated his own automobile
- 17 car dealership and detail car shop for decades at Five Points in

- 18 the Jackson area, and he was the first African-American automobile
- 19 wholesaler in the State of Mississippi; and
- 20 WHEREAS, because of Mr. Morrow's extensive knowledge and
- 21 expertise, automobile dealerships relied heavily upon him to
- 22 provide dollar figures to trade for automobiles that needed
- 23 appraising, giving rise to his nickname within the automobile
- 24 industry, Johnny "Retail" Morrow; and
- 25 WHEREAS, not only was Mr. Morrow's proficiency apparent to
- 26 his fellow automobile dealers, but he had a passion for collecting
- 27 and restoring antique cars and referred to his inventory as "The
- 28 Morrow Collection," and even Hollywood recognized his prowess and
- 29 eye for detail as some of his vintage cars appeared in the movie,
- 30 The Help; and
- 31 WHEREAS, a legend, a thinker, an innovator, a visionary, a
- 32 historian and a creative genius, Mr. Morrow used his many talents
- 33 and hobbies to establish a rental hall and multi-purpose complex
- 34 known as "The Room" located at Five Points, and through his
- 35 passion and vision to create such a facility, some of
- 36 Mississippi's most interesting and fascinating history has been
- 37 preserved, and "The Room" has seen numerous celebrities walk
- 38 through its doors, including Muhammad Ali, Dan Aykroyd, Snoop Dogg
- 39 and Morgan Freeman; and
- WHEREAS, additionally, one of Johnny's many community
- 41 projects was the development of a magazine entitled Jackson Cars,
- 42 The Legends of the Automobile Industry, which enabled him to

- 43 reflect on the automobile industry pioneers he encountered during
- 44 his career and publish their stories and contributions to the City
- 45 of Jackson, which had fascinated him for many years; and
- 46 WHEREAS, in 1965, the Lanier High School Bulldogs Basketball
- 47 Team was the only Mississippi high school basketball team to ever
- 48 win a national championship, but the team was never properly
- 49 honored because it occurred during the Civil Rights Movement, so
- 50 for 48 years, their trophy just collected dust in the trophy case,
- 51 but in January 2013, Mr. Morrow organized and brought together
- 52 state, city and county entities and local businesses and
- 53 individuals to properly recognize the team, and the Lanier High
- 54 School Bulldogs Basketball Team received their national
- 55 championship rings and were inducted into the Mississippi Sports
- 56 Hall of Fame and their story also became part of our nation's
- 57 Congressional Record; and
- 58 WHEREAS, Mr. Morrow's love and affection pierced the heart
- 59 and soul of Hazel, the love of his life, and on September 12,
- 60 1992, the two love birds exchanged the vows of holy matrimony and
- 61 spent the next 29 years traveling and spending time together; and
- 62 WHEREAS, in his spare time, Mr. Morrow truly loved spending
- 63 time with his family and friends, cracking jokes, listening to
- 64 music and watching football; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Johnny Allen Morrow's bright sense of humor,
- 66 remarkable intelligence and pure heart left an indelible
- 67 impression in the hearts and minds of his many friends and family,

- 68 who are left to cherish his memory, including: his brother, Leon
- 69 (Debra) Morrow; sister, Frances Quin; sister-in-law, Tameaker
- 70 Hicks; brother-in-law, Dwight (Linda) Johnson; father-in-law,
- 71 Melkiah Barnes; special cousin, Elvie Willis; and a host of aunts,
- 72 uncles, nieces, nephews, other relatives and friends; and
- 73 WHEREAS, it is the policy of the House of Representatives to
- 74 commend the life and service of such a genuine and selfless
- 75 individual as Mr. Johnny Allen Morrow, whose life's light
- 76 illuminated the path of hope for all he encountered along this
- 77 earthly sojourn:
- 78 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF
- 79 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby
- 80 mourn the loss and commemorate the life and legacy of Mr. Johnny
