- 9 Benford, Sr., and Blanche Coleman Benford, Dr. Benford was reared
- 10 in Christian love along with her three siblings; and

- 12 Dr. Benford is a graduate of Lanier High School and she attended
- 13 Jackson State University before earning an undergraduate degree
- 14 from Tougaloo College and then a master's degree from the
- 15 University of Mississippi before finally earning a doctorate's
- 16 degree from Mississippi State University; and
- 17 WHEREAS, as one who had a passion for sharing knowledge, Dr.
- 18 Benford positively broadened the minds of youth in her role as an

- 19 educator with the Jackson Public Schools system, where she taught
- 20 at Blackburn Junior High and Jim Hill High School respectively;

- 22 WHEREAS, Dr. Benford also served as a professor at Mary
- 23 Holmes Junior College in West Point, Mississippi, where she taught
- 24 political science, American government and history, and she later
- 25 returned to the Capitol City and made contributions as the curator
- 26 of history for the Manship House and the Old Capitol Museum; and
- 27 WHEREAS, a virtuous woman who accepted Christ as her personal
- 28 Savior at an early age and was baptized at White Baptist Church in
- 29 Holly Buff, Mississippi, Dr. Benford used her God-given talents
- 30 and innate nature of wanting to help others and opened and
- 31 operated The Grace Personal Care and Independent Living Center;

- 33 WHEREAS, Dr. Benford not only demonstrated her care for her
- 34 community by providing much needed services, she also served the
- 35 community by being a strong community activist and a longtime
- 36 active member of both the Democratic Party and the National
- 37 Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP); and
