## HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 64

A RESOLUTION ACKNOWLEDGING AND COMMENDING THE SUCCESS OF
WILLIAM CAREY UNIVERSITY'S SCHOOL OF EDUCATION IN GROWING THE
STATE OF MISSISSIPPI'S TEACHER WORKFORCE IN AN UNMITIGATED EFFORT
TO REDUCE TEACHER SHORTAGES THROUGHOUT THE STATE.

WHEREAS, since its original inception in 1892 under the 5 moniker of the Pearl River Boarding School, and three subsequent 6 7 name changes aligned with the respective aims and missions of its identity, William Carey University, the designated nomenclature 8 9 assigned to the institution in 1954, has served as a premier 10 bastion of educational excellence for South Mississippi, as 11 indicated by the elite success of its distinguished leadership, 12 staff, alumni and current student body; and WHEREAS, in a time in our state's modern history when teacher 13 14 retention was on a rapid decline and fewer college prospects were interested in the profession, William Carey University's School of 15 Education sought to change the trajectory of education by 16 17 modifying its approach to teacher preparation by engaging and

18 inspiring students who aspired to become future educators; and

19 WHEREAS, home to the Program of Research and Evaluation for 20 Public Schools (PREPS), Inc., a statewide educational consortium that strives to provide Mississippi K-12 school districts with the 21 22 latest in research to support student success and teacher and 23 administrator effectiveness, William Carey University's School of 24 Education has grown by 700 students over the past 8 years, with the last three years data reflecting a 240% growth in the 25 26 undergraduate programs in teacher education, which accounts for 27 Fall 2021 enrollment total education of 1,806 students; and WHEREAS, having graduated an average of 500 students per year 28

29 from the School of Education, the university's 2021 Summer 30 Commencement exercises, introduced 593 new baccalaureate degree 31 holders in education; and

32 WHEREAS, in addition to hosting the Pine Belt superintendents, elementary principals, middle school principals 33 34 and high school principals on its campus, William Carey University 35 hosted the state's first statewide teacher shortage conference in 2021, and through affiliated partnerships with the Kellogg 36 37 Foundation and the Mississippi Department of Education, which 38 provided grants for the Mississippi Teacher Residency program, the 39 School of Education placed 421 first-year alternate route interns 40 in Mississippi schools in the fall of 2021; and

41 WHEREAS, in its zealous commitment to promote and improve the 42 education profession within the State of Mississippi by providing 43 knowledgeable, skilled and highly qualified teachers to school

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44 districts with teacher shortages, the William Carey University 45 School of Education developed a "Grow Your Own" teacher 46 preparation program, a three-year program which allows aspiring 47 educators in the program to complete their teacher education 48 degree; and

WHEREAS, by partnering with school districts across the state to send teachers back to their school district to teach, William Carey University's School of Education has become the leading education preparation program among all public and private universities and colleges in the State of Mississippi; and

54 WHEREAS, it is the policy of the House of Representatives to 55 recognize and commend the exceptional work of our state's 56 collegiate institutions to shift the dynamic of the status quo to 57 ensure that our children are provided with the best education 58 professionals who are equipped with the instructional tools and 59 prowess to change the landscape of the teaching and grooming 60 scholars under their tutelage for success, as demonstrated by the William Carey University School of Education: 61

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby acknowledge and commend the success of William Carey University's School of Education in growing the State of Mississippi's teacher workforce in an unmitigated effort to reduce teacher shortages throughout the state.

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
