HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 77

A RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE LIFE, SERVICE AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF MRS. HILDA LOUISE SMITH CASIN AND ACKNOWLEDGING HER SIGNIFICANT BEDUCATIONAL AND CIVIC CONTRIBUTION TO PIKE COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI.

- 4 WHEREAS, the only child of her late parents, Mr. Willie B.
- 5 and Mrs. Ruth Mae Bonds Smith, born and reared in McComb,
- 6 Mississippi, on the precept tenets of humility, integrity,
- 7 intestinal fortitude and the importance of education, Mrs. Hilda
- 8 Louise Smith Casin premised her life to one of service to
- 9 humanity, starting right in her native home; and
- 10 WHEREAS, a 1948 graduate of Burglund High School, a young
- 11 Louise attended Southern Christian Institute, where she received
- 12 her associate's degree in 1950, which prepared her for her
- 13 inaugural entry into the wonderful world of educational
- 14 instruction, which commenced during the fall of the same year at
- 15 Stephenson Elementary School as a fourth and fifth Grade teacher;
- 16 and
- 17 WHEREAS, eager to sharpen her educational acumen and expand
- 18 her arsenal of instructional tools, Mrs. Casin embarked upon a

- 19 journey of undergraduate and postgraduate matriculation, which
- 20 materialized in her receipt of a bachelor of science degree in
- 21 elementary education from Jackson State University in 1959, a
- 22 National Science Foundation Grant to attend Depauw University
- 23 during the summer of 1962, and both a master of science degree in
- 24 guidance and counseling and an education specialist degree in
- 25 educational administration from the University of Mississippi, in
- 26 1969 and 1977 respectively; and
- 27 WHEREAS, on a trailblazing trajectory for career success in
- 28 her chosen profession, Mrs. Casin was one of 19 national
- 29 participants chosen to attend the Computer Assisted Instruction
- 30 Institute at Stanford University in 1969, and became the first
- 31 African-American inductee into the University of Mississippi
- 32 Chapter of Kappa Delta Pi Education Honor Society; and
- 33 WHEREAS, Mrs. Casin's commitment to educational excellence
- 34 and the success of students under her instructional tutelage and
- 35 guidance spanned the course of 50 years until her retirement in
- 36 2000, which encompassed the ascent from roles as an instructor to
- 37 an apex conclusion in a supervisory position as a district
- 38 administrator for the final 27 years of her career, and witnessed
- 39 the inception of a personal self-funded scholarship to assist
- 40 students in attending the college or university of their choice;
- 41 and
- WHEREAS, her community service is inclusive of a broad span
- 43 of civic and social involvement, stemming from the McComb Library

- 44 Board, the Railroad Museum Board, the Pike County Chamber of
- 45 Commerce Board, Pike County Teachers Federal Credit Union Board,
- 46 Pike County Business League, NAACP, Jackson State University
- 47 Alumni Association and the McComb Historic Preservation
- 48 Commission, the latter of which inspired her to establish Pike
- 49 County's Black History Gallery as a 501(c)(3) nonprofit
- 50 organization listed within the State of Mississippi's Tourism
- 51 Guide Book; and
- 52 WHEREAS, with these affiliations, she has been on the
- 53 receiving end of numerous accolades of acknowledgement, including,
- 54 but not limited to: the Georgia Westbrook Club Award for
- 55 Excellence; 24th Street Church Award; Walker's Chapel Church
- 56 Award; McComb Club Award; McComb-Pike Reading Council's IRA
- 57 Service Award; the McComb Negro Business and Professional's Woman
- 58 of the Year Award; Alpha Kappa Alpha Phi Mu Omega Chapter
- 59 Community Service Award; NAACP's C.C. Bryant Lifetime Achievement
- 60 Award; Pike County Chamber of Commerce's Lifetime Achievement
- 61 Award; Jubilee Performing Arts Center's Lifetime Achievement
- 62 Award; Enterprise Journal's Lifetime Achievement Award; and
- 63 Chapter of the Delta Kappa Gamma's Red Rose Award; and
- 64 WHEREAS, having been encouraged, inspired and supported in
- 65 all of her career and civic endeavors by her late husband, Silas
- 66 Casin, Jr., until his untimely transition, Mrs. Casin continues to
- 67 enjoy the boundless affection and inspiration of her immediate
- 68 family circle, including: her daughter, Dr. Sylvia Casin-Brown;
