HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 97

1 A RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING MRS. JOYCE  
2 ISABELLE GREEN HARRISON UPON THE OCCASION OF HER 102ND BIRTHDAY.

3 WHEREAS, on March 18, 1920, the world was blessed with the  
4 birth of Mrs. Joyce Isabelle Green Harrison, and decades later,  
5 upon the auspicious occasion of her 102nd birthday, she continues  
6 to shower those around her with unconditional love and support;  
7 and

8 WHEREAS, the daughter of Charles Green and Carrie Roebuck  
9 Green, and the sister of Tom Green, Fairra Green and Novella Pugh,  
10 Mrs. Joyce Isabelle Green Harrison and her family grew up on a  
11 family farm in Jasper County, Mississippi, in the Ras Community,  
12 and not only survived the Great Depression, but also found time to  
13 enjoy each other, their church and music and to value education;

15 WHEREAS, after graduating from Penantly School in 1938, Mrs.  
16 Harrison enrolled in Jones Junior College and later the University  
17 of Southern Mississippi, where she majored in home economics and



18 minored in chemistry, and she began her illustrious teaching  
19 career and lifetime of selfless public service in 1943; and

20 WHEREAS, Mrs. Harrison is a woman of uncompromised faith that  
21 she learned by the strong example of her mother and father, and  
22 she has continuously demonstrated her faith and devout commitment  
23 to Jesus Christ throughout her life, especially through her  
24 membership with Ephesus Baptist Church, where she taught Sunday  
25 School for many years and furnished floral arrangements for  
26 numerous church activities; and

27 WHEREAS, in 1945, while teaching at Ringgold School in Scott  
28 County, Mississippi, Mrs. Harrison met the love of her life, a  
29 handsome soldier who had just returned from World War II, Mr.  
30 Charles Maurice Harrison, and the duo exchanged the vows of holy  
31 matrimony with the sweet words "I do," in 1946, completing their  
32 family unit with the addition of five children, their first son,  
33 who died at childbirth, Dr. Charles L. Harrison and wife Sherrod  
34 Sims Harrison, William A. (Bill) Harrison (deceased) and wife  
35 Andrea Sparks Harrison, Dan M. Harrison (deceased) and wife  
36 Frankie Usry Harrison, and Tommy A. Harrison and wife Wanda  
37 Latham; nine grandchildren; and 19 great-grandchildren; and

38 WHEREAS, after marriage, Mr. and Mrs. Harrison moved to  
39 Petal, Mississippi, where she continued to teach school and he  
40 pursued a degree at the University of Southern Mississippi, and  
41 throughout their professional lives, they worked in several public



42 schools where he was a coach and school administrator and she  
43 taught home economics and chemistry; and

44 WHEREAS, the Harrisons made their family home in Forest,  
45 Mississippi, and lived a very blissful life together until Mr.  
46 Harrison's untimely death in October 1978, and she continued to  
47 teach until her retirement in 1983, at which time she had  
48 dedicated 40 years of service to Mississippi's public schools; and

49 WHEREAS, Mrs. Harrison has always cared deeply for the needs  
50 of those around her and truly become a community treasure, earning  
51 the love and respect of every person who has had the opportunity  
52 to meet her and experience her greatness; and

53 WHEREAS, for the past 102 years, Mrs. Joyce Isabelle Green  
54 Harrison has survived two pandemics, cancer, a poisonous snake  
55 bite and the task of raising four boys, but through it all, she  
56 has undoubtedly inspired her family and friends, greeting everyone  
57 she meets with a million-watt smile that could illuminate even the  
58 darkest day, and her children, grandchildren and  
59 great-grandchildren love her tremendously and revere her as the  
60 wonderful mother and grandmother she truly is; and

61 WHEREAS, it is the policy of the House of Representatives to  
62 recognize and honor the lives of Mississippi's wisest generation,  
63 especially those such as Mrs. Joyce Isabelle Green Harrison on the  
64 occasion of her 102nd birthday, for being a gracious woman who  
65 always puts others before herself and loves her family and friends
