HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 98

1 A RESOLUTION MOURNING THE LOSS AND COMMENDING THE LIVES AND
 2 LEGACIES OF ZEB ANDREWS HUGHES AND JAMESON MED GUNNER PALMER,
 3 EXPRESSING DEEPEST SYMPATHY TO THEIR FAMILIES AND FRIENDS UPON
 4 THEIR PASSING, AND RAISING AWARENESS OF BOATING SAFETY BY
 5 ENCOURAGING MISSISSIPPI'S OBSERVATION OF NATIONAL SAFE BOATING
 6 WEEK DURING THE WEEK OF MAY 21-27, 2022.

7 WHEREAS, it is written in II Corinthians 4:17-18, "For our
 8 light affliction, which is but for a moment, worketh for us a far
 9 more exceeding and eternal weight of glory; While we look not at
 10 the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen:
 11 for the things which are seen are temporal, but the things which
 12 are not seen are eternal," and as such, the immaculate author and
 13 finisher of our soul's destiny summoned the mortal presence of
 14 dearly beloved, Zeb Andrews Hughes and Jameson Med Gunner Palmer,
 15 to rest eternally, as they made life's final transition from
 16 earthly travailing to heavenly reward, on Thursday, December 3,
 17 2020, rendering great sorrow and loss to their families and
 18 friends; and

19 WHEREAS, the Hazlehurst, Wesson and Brookhaven communities of
 20 Copiah and Lincoln Counties, lost two wonderful friends, outdoor



21 enthusiasts and rising community pillars with the passing of Zeb
22 Andrews Hughes and Jameson Med Gunner Palmer, and there is now a
23 hush in our hearts as we come together to pay our respects to the
24 memory of those who have been called to join that innumerable
25 heavenly caravan; and

26 WHEREAS, born March 9, 1999, to Barry and Sharon Chassion
27 Hughes, Zeb, a resident native of Wesson, was a devoted and loving
28 son, brother, and an equally dependable, encouraging and
29 trustworthy friend, who possessed a sense of humor that paralleled
30 his affinity of the great outdoors, whether through his stellar
31 sports play or heeding the call of the wild to be one with nature;

33 WHEREAS, a graduate of Wesson Attendance Center, Zeb
34 furthered his educational pursuits at Copiah-Lincoln Community
35 College, East Mississippi Community College and Mississippi State
36 University, and as a proud member of the Lincoln County Chapter of
37 Ducks Unlimited, he unashamedly shared his love for the Lord with
38 others while partaking in the pastimes he enjoyed most; and

39 WHEREAS, born March 7, 2004, to Med and Kim Palmer, Gunner, a
40 resident native of Hazlehurst, Mississippi, was a devoted and
41 loving son, brother and loyal friend who donned an uplifting and
42 kind spirit; he was characterized as a jokester and dedicated task
43 undertaker, particularly as those tasks related to hunting and
44 outdoor related activities; and



45 WHEREAS, a member of the Wounded Warrior Veteran hunts and
46 the National Wild Turkey Federation, Gunner was secure in his
47 faith in Christ, as evidenced through his membership at Bethel
48 Baptist Church; and

49 WHEREAS, the tragic and untimely passing of these bright
50 lights of life and joy has saddened the hearts of both the Hughes
51 and Palmer families who, while searching for a semblance of
52 comfort and solace in knowing that their sons' transition to the
53 spirit realm occurred while engaged in their passionate pursuit as
54 great outdoorsmen, have united to raise awareness for boating
55 safety; and

56 WHEREAS, in joining with the Hughes and Palmer families to
57 emphasize the importance of boating safety, we encourage all
58 boaters to observe the recommendations of the National Safe
59 Boating Council, including: taking a boating safety course;
60 checking equipment before launching; establishing a float plan by
61 informing a nonoccupant of the trip itinerary, operator and
62 passenger information, boat type and registration and available
63 communication devices aboard the vessel; wearing a life jacket at
64 all times; using an engine cut-off device; being weather and
65 environmental conditions aware; having knowledge of destination,
66 travel routes and navigating at safe speeds; never boating under
67 the influence; and remaining in communication with a land-based
68 individual; and



69 WHEREAS, in recognition of the importance of safe boating
70 practices, the United States Congress, by joint resolution
71 approved June 4, 1958 (36 USC 131), as amended, has authorized and
72 requested the President to proclaim annually the seven-day period
73 before Memorial Day weekend as "National Safe Boating Week"; and

74 WHEREAS, in reflecting upon the abbreviated lives and
75 meaningful impacts of Zeb Hughes and Gunner Palmer on the lives of
76 all they encountered, we encourage all citizens of this great
77 Magnolia State to honor their legacies by observing National Safe
78 Boating Week during the week of May 21-27, 2022; and

79 WHEREAS, we encourage the families to find solace from the
80 overwhelming sadness created by the earthly departure of their
81 beloved family members and be renewed in their faith that Zeb and
82 Gunner fulfilled the purpose of their appointed time in adherence
83 to the commandment of II Timothy 4:7, by having "fought a good
84 fight, finishing the course and keeping the faith until the hour
85 of their departure was at hand"; and

86 WHEREAS, it is the policy of the House of Representatives to
87 commend the lives of such remarkable individuals, as evidenced by
88 the lives of Zeb Hughes and Gunner Palmer, whose lives, like
89 candles in the wind, were prematurely extinguished, but sparked an
90 inspiration of hope and renewed sense of responsibility and safety
91 for those left behind:

92 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF
93 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby



94 mourn the loss and commend the lives and legacies of Zeb Andrews
95 Hughes and Jameson Med Gunner Palmer, expressing deepest sympathy
96 to their families and friends upon their passing, and raising
97 awareness of boating safety by encouraging Mississippi's
98 observance of National Safe Boating Week during the week of May
99 21-27, 2022.

101 furnished to the families of Zeb Andrews Hughes and Jameson Med
102 Gunner Palmer and to the members of the Capitol Press Corps.
