- 5 WHEREAS, chartered on April 5, 1872, through special
- 6 enactment by the Mississippi Legislature, after being chosen in
- 7 1871 by Colonel Henry Simpson McComb, president of the New
- 8 Orleans, Jackson and Greater Northern Railroad, as the northern
- 9 location for its railroad shops and division headquarters in
- 10 furtherance of the development of the rail line by way of Pass
- 11 Manchac, the City of McComb will celebrate its Sesquicentennial
- 12 Anniversary, acknowledging 150 years of rich and historical
- 13 excellence; and
- 14 WHEREAS, prior to his death in 1881, Colonel McComb had sold
- 15 his interest in the railroad, and in June of 1882, the Illinois
- 16 Central Railroad had begun leasing and operating the railroad,
- 17 which initiated the completed expansion of the line to Chicago by
- 18 1891, and the completion of its second main track by 1903,
- 19 bringing with it an influx of new inhabitants; and

20	WHEREAS, boasting a storied legacy, the "Railroad City," as					
21	it has come to be known, was twice occupied by federal troops or					
22	state militiamen in furtherance of preserving the peace, suffered					
23	through the 1878 Yellow Fever epidemic, recovered from the June					
24	21, 1904 fire, which began in a Chinese laundry and destroyed 22					
25	downtown buildings, and the November 29, 1942 fire which decimated					
26	the McComb High School along with the records of all elementary					
27	students ever to attend the McComb schools from 1920 through 1943,					
28	and was an iconic location of efforts to further the tenets of the					
29	Civil Rights Movement; and					
30	WHEREAS, the first among cities of its size in industry,					
31	mercantile importance, religious and educational facilities,					
32	public improvements, and general progressiveness, the City of					
33	McComb, only 50 years after its founding, comprised a total area					
34	of two square miles, that included 125 miles of streets, seven					
35	large schools, 13 churches of the Baptist, Methodist,					
36	Presbyterian, Episcopal, Christian, Nazarene, Christian Science					
37	and Roman Catholic denominations, 19 blocks of paved streets in					
38	the city's business center, three hospitals, and an assessed					
39	valuation of \$5,635,193.00; and					
40	WHEREAS, with the railroad at the center of its economic					
41	viability, McComb thrived as an industrial giant, as industry					
42	proved to be its paramount achievement in its narrative of					
43	success, the mechanical departments and the rail car shops ensured					
1 /1	the robust advancement of Illinois Central Railroad and snawned					

- 45 the creation of several businesses to accommodate the needs of the
- 46 city's residents, including: X.A. Kramer Industries, which
- 47 consisted of the acquisition and renovation of the McColgan Hotel,
- 48 the McComb Ice Company, the McComb Creamery, the McComb Ice Cream
- 49 Company and the McComb Commissary; the Allen Lumber Company; the
- 50 Home Light Company; the McComb Cotton Mill; the Berthadale Mills;
- 51 the J.J. White Industries, which consisted of the McComb Steam
- 52 Laundry, the Dry Cleaning Department and the McComb Cotton Gin;
- 53 and the B.V. Slate Industry; and
- 54 WHEREAS, from its optimistic formation as a tiny railroad
- 55 community in 1872, to its now premier status as an estimable
- 56 metropolitan area boasting a diverse demography, and proudly
- 57 touting the roots of several dozen native sons and daughters who
- 58 have reached national acclaim in the television, entertainment,
- 59 music, athletic and literary arenas, McComb's pride is embedded in
- 60 the hearts of its citizens; and
- 61 WHEREAS, encompassing an area of 11.6 square miles today, the
- 62 city's population of 12,413 residents, according to the 2020
- 63 Federal Decennial Census, McComb's history is embodied in an
- 64 immersive cultural experience rooted in transparency, by drawing
- 65 upon the lessons and growing pains of its former experiences, to
- 66 emerge like a phoenix from the ashes with a clean, energetic and
- 67 invigorated spirit of hope and inclusiveness to enhance the
- 68 quality of life and inspire dreams of great success for every
- 69 citizen and visitor for generations to come; and

- 70 WHEREAS, it is the policy of the House of Representatives to
 71 pay tribute to a municipality such as the City of McComb, which is
 72 a place where the quality of life is still important and where its
- 73 small town values stand as a role model throughout the great State
- 74 of Mississippi:
- 75 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF
- 76 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby
- 77 commend the rich and historical legacy of the City of McComb,
- 78 Mississippi, congratulate the city upon the occasion of its
- 79 Sesquicentennial Anniversary, acknowledging 150 years of
- 80 excellence, and wish it continued success in all its future
- 81 endeavors.
