HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 110

1 A RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING THE JONES JUNIOR  
2 COLLEGE BOBCATS CHEERLEADING TEAM AND COACH KAYLA HANKINS FOR  
3 WINNING FIRST PLACE IN THE OPEN COED DIVISION OF THE 2022 UCA  
4 COLLEGE CHAMPIONSHIPS.

5 WHEREAS, proving hard work and diligence are the keys to  
6 success, the Jones Junior College has now earned two consecutive  
7 national championship titles, after cheering and tumbling their  
8 way into another first place finish in Open Coed Division of the  
9 2022 UCA College Championships; and

10 WHEREAS, having attended cheerleading camp at Mississippi  
11 State University in July 2021, the Bobcats Cheerleading Team was  
12 recognized as Most Collegiate in the junior/community college  
13 division, and was named recipient of the Leadership Award; and

14 WHEREAS, while the Bobcat Cheerleaders hosted numerous cheer  
15 camps, stunt clinics and community events while cheering  
16 consistently for the duration of the football and basketball  
17 seasons, the cheerleaders have maintained a 3.204 team GPA for

22 student-athletes named to the President's List, and 11 on the
