CAROL ROBINSON AND REVEREND SHIRLEY WATSON 3 HARRINGTON AND FOR PROMOTING ENTREPRENEURSHIP AND ECONOMIC 4 DEVELOPMENT IN THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI FOR OVER 29 YEARS. 5 WHEREAS, the Robinson-Watson Book Company was founded by Shirley Watson Harrington and Carol Robinson to promote 6 7 entrepreneurs and economic development in Jackson and this state 29 years ago and has remained a positive and effective staple of 8 9 the Mississippi business community; and 10 WHEREAS, since its inception, the company has honored more than 800 entrepreneurs at its annual honors banquet and inspired 11 12 countless young people to venture out into business ownership; and 13 WHEREAS, Reverend Harrington and Ms. Robinson are also 14 co-founders of the first Minority Business Phone Directory of Jackson, Mississippi, and Hinds County, Mississippi, which they 15 created to assist minority businesses in networking with each 16 17 other, and continue to print to this day in various forms with more than 1,000 names, businesses and historical sites and 18 19 churches; and

24 WHEREAS, Ms. Carol Todd Robinson is a Flint, Michigan, native 25 who ventured to Mississippi to attend Jackson State University in 26 1973, to obtain her master's degree in guidance counseling, 27 pursuing further studies at Mississippi College, Clinton, 28 Mississippi; and

WHEREAS, her passion for helping people has driven all of her phenomenal community and professional activities, which include helping incarcerated young men in Oakley Training School, working as an academic counselor at Hinds Community College, developing a Families First Parent Resources Center at the West Jackson Community Development Corporation, assisting older adults returning to college; and

36 WHEREAS, Reverend Shirley Harrington, is a native 37 Mississippian, who has always been a woman of firsts: she was one 38 of the first African Americans to graduate from Provine High 39 School, the first African American hired in Mississippi at the 40 National Weather Service, Climatology Division, Department of Commerce, the first woman to head the seven-state EEOC Local 3699 41 42 AFGE Union, and she negotiated the first contract under the Civil 43 Service Reform Act; and

WHEREAS, Reverend Harrington is also a business owner of Watson, Porter and Associates, with her dear sister, Orbra, and they use their business platform to promote other small businesses along with conducting feasibility studies for school districts and many other entities; and
