## SENATE BILL NO. 2073

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 97-9-72, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REVISE THE OFFENSE OF FLEEING OR ELUDING A LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER WHEN A MINOR IS PRESENT IN THE VEHICLE AT THE TIME OF THE OFFENSE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 SECTION 1. Section 97-9-72, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 7 amended as follows:

97-9-72. (1) The driver of a motor vehicle who is given a 8 9 visible or audible signal by a law enforcement officer by hand, 10 voice, emergency light or siren directing the driver to bring his motor vehicle to a stop when such signal is given by a law 11 12 enforcement officer acting in the lawful performance of duty who has a reasonable suspicion to believe that the driver in question 13 14 has committed a crime, and who willfully fails to obey such direction shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction 15 shall be punished by a fine not to exceed One Thousand Dollars 16 17 (\$1,000.00) or imprisoned in the county jail for a term not to exceed six (6) months, or both. 18

No. 2073 G1/2 22/SS36/R216 PAGE 1 (ens\kr) 19 (2)Any person who is guilty of violating subsection (1) of 20 this section by operating a motor vehicle in such a manner as to 21 indicate a reckless or willful disregard for the safety of persons 22 or property, or who so operates a motor vehicle in a manner 23 manifesting extreme indifference to the value of human life, shall 24 be guilty of a felony, and upon conviction thereof, shall be 25 punished by a fine not to exceed Five Thousand Dollars 26 (\$5,000.00), or by commitment to the custody of the Mississippi 27 Department of Corrections for not more than five (5) years, or 28 both.

(3) Any person who is guilty of violating subsection (1) of this section, which violation results in serious bodily injury of another, upon conviction, shall be committed to the custody of the Department of Corrections for not less than three (3) nor more than twenty (20) years of imprisonment.

(4) Any person who is guilty of violating subsection (1) of
this section, which violation results in the death of another,
upon conviction, shall be committed to the custody of the
Department of Corrections for not less than five (5) nor more than
forty (40) years.
