SENATE BILL NO. 2335

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 45-11-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 REMOVE THE LIMITATION ON THE NUMBER OF EMERGENCY MEDICAL RESPONDER 3 STUDENTS THE STATE FIRE ACADEMY MAY TRAIN PER YEAR; AND FOR 4 RELATED PURPOSES.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 SECTION 1. Section 45-11-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 7 amended as follows:

45-11-7. (1) There is hereby created a State Fire Academy 8 9 for the training and education of persons engaged in municipal, 10 county and industrial fire protection. The Commissioner of Insurance shall appoint an Executive Director of the State Fire 11 12 Academy who, along with his employees, shall be designated as a 13 division of the Insurance Department. The executive director 14 shall serve at the pleasure of the Commissioner of Insurance. The State Fire Academy shall be under the supervision and direction of 15 the Executive Director of the State Fire Academy. State Fire 16 17 Academy training programs for fire personnel shall be conducted at the academy with seminars to be conducted in other sections of the 18

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The Commissioner of Insurance may establish and charge reasonable fees for the training programs and other services provided by the academy. A record of all funds received pursuant to this paragraph shall be maintained as is required for other monies pursuant to Section 45-11-5.

The Executive Director of the State Fire Academy is authorized and empowered to purchase, operate and maintain mobile firefighting equipment as he may find necessary and proper for the operation of the academy subject to approval of the Commissioner of Insurance. The equipment may be utilized wherever training sessions may be held at the discretion of the State Fire Academy Advisory Board.

33 The Commissioner of Insurance shall be authorized to (2)34 undertake appropriate action to accomplish and fulfill the 35 purposes of the State Fire Academy, including the hiring of instructors and personnel, the lease and purchase of appropriate 36 37 training equipment and to lease, purchase or construct suitable 38 premises and quarters for conducting annual school and seminars, as the State Fire Academy Advisory Board may deem necessary and 39 40 required for such purposes. Any contract entered into under and by virtue of the provisions of this section shall first be 41 42 submitted to and approved by the Public Procurement Review Board,

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43 and construction pursuant to the contract shall be under the 44 supervision of the Governor's Office of General Services.

45 (3) Vouchers for operating expense for the State Fire
46 Academy shall be signed by the Executive Director of the State
47 Fire Academy and payment thereof shall be made from such funds to
48 be derived from a special allocation from the State Fire Academy
49 Fund as provided in Section 45-11-5.

50 (4) The State Fire Academy is hereby officially designated 51 as the agency of this state to conduct training for fire personnel 52 on a statewide basis in which members of all duly constituted fire 53 departments may participate. This subsection shall not be 54 construed to affect the authority of any fire department to 55 conduct training for its own personnel.

56 (5) Each state agency, private agency or federal agency
57 which provides training for the fire service shall coordinate such
58 efforts with the State Fire Academy to prevent duplication of cost
59 and to * * * ensure standardization of training.

60 (6) The State Fire Academy shall present an appropriate
 61 certificate signifying the successful completion of its prescribed
 62 courses.

(7) National firefighter standards approved by the
Mississippi Fire Personnel Minimum Standards and Certification
Board shall be used as the basis for classroom instruction at the
fire academy.

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67 (8) The Commissioner of Insurance, Executive Director of the
68 State Fire Academy, and the Mississippi Fire Personnel Minimum
69 Standards and Certification Board shall coordinate all state
70 programs related to fire department operations.

71 (9) The Commissioner of Insurance is hereby authorized and 72 empowered to establish standard quidelines for the use of, and 73 accountability for, municipal and county fire protection funds 74 distributed pursuant to the provisions of Sections 83-1-37 and 75 83-1-39, Mississippi Code of 1972. Such quidelines shall include requirements for the establishment of record keeping and reports 76 77 to the Commissioner of Insurance by municipalities and counties 78 relating to the receipt and expenditure of fire protection funds, 79 the training of fire department personnel and the submission to 80 the Commissioner of Insurance of other data reasonably related to local fire protection responsibilities which the Commissioner of 81 82 Insurance deems necessary for the performance of the duties of the 83 State Fire Academy Advisory Board.

84 In order that the Commissioner of Insurance may more (10)85 effectively execute the duties imposed upon him by subsection (9) 86 of this section, there is hereby created within the State Fire 87 Academy a Division of Fire Services Development. The division 88 shall be staffed by a Fire Services Development Coordinator, appointed by the executive director of the academy from his 89 90 current staff and by such other personnel as deemed by the Commissioner of Insurance. The division shall work with municipal 91

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92 and county fire coordinators to ensure effective implementation of 93 guidelines established pursuant to subsection (9) of this section and shall serve in an advisory capacity for all aspects of fire 94 service improvement. The Fire Service Coordinator shall annually 95 96 notify the Department of Finance and Administration of those 97 municipalities and counties which are not eligible to receive a portion of fire protection fund distributions because of failure 98 99 to comply with requirements imposed in Sections 83-1-37 and 100 83-1-39 as a prerequisite to receipt of such funds.

There is created in the State Treasury a separate 101 (11)account to be known as the "State Fire Academy Construction Fund." 102 103 The State Treasurer shall transfer on July 1, 1997, the sum of Six 104 Hundred Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$675,000.00) and on July 1, 105 1998, the sum of Six Hundred Seventy-five Thousand Dollars 106 (\$675,000.00) from the State Fire Academy Fund 3502 into the 107 separate account created in this subsection. Monies in such 108 account shall be expended solely, upon legislative appropriations, to defray expenses related to the construction of capital 109 110 improvements project known as "Fire Safety and Education Building" 111 and parking areas at the State Fire Academy by the Bureau of 112 Building, Grounds and Real Property Management of the Office of 113 General Services and to pay any indebtedness incurred to accomplish such construction. Funds not used after the completion 114 115 of this capital improvements project shall be transferred back into State Fund 3502. 116

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122 (13) From and after July 1, 2016, no state agency shall 123 charge another state agency a fee, assessment, rent or other 124 charge for services or resources received by authority of this 125 section.

126 (14)The State Fire Academy is designated as an authorized 127 training program for Emergency Medical Response and Emergency 128 Medical Technician, and is authorized to provide initial and 129 national continued competency program training, including 130 Emergency Medical Responder, Emergency Medical Technician-Basic 131 and Emergency Medical Technician-Advanced. The State Fire Academy 132 shall be limited to a total of one hundred twenty (120) students 133 per year for *** * *** Emergency Medical Technician-Basic and Emergency Medical Technician-Advanced training; however, no 134 135 limitation shall apply to the number of Emergency Medical 136 Responder students. The training program established by the State 137 Fire Academy shall meet or exceed the requirements of the most 138 current training program national standard curriculum as developed 139 by the United States Department of Transportation, National 140 Highway Traffic Safety Administration, and shall also meet the minimum testing and certification requirements established by the 141

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142 State Board of Health. Successful graduates of the State Fire 143 Academy Emergency Medical Response and Emergency Medical Technician training shall be eligible for certification by the 144 State Board of Health for the training level achieved, provided 145 146 that their training meets or exceeds the minimum testing and 147 certification requirements established by the State Board of 148 Health for these respective skills, and such certification may be 149 obtained in coordination with the State Board of Health pursuant 150 to Chapters 59 and 60, Title 41, Mississippi Code of 1972.

151 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 152 and after July 1, 2022.
