- AN ACT TO ENACT THE REAL YOU ACT OF 2022; TO DEFINE TERMS; TO PROHIBIT PHYSICALLY INCARCERATED OFFENDERS FROM REQUESTING A NAME CHANGE; TO PROVIDE CERTAIN EXCEPTIONS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 5 **SECTION 1.** This act shall be known and may be cited as "The
- 6 Real You Act of 2022."
- 7 **SECTION 2.** For purposes of this act, the following words
- 8 shall have the meanings ascribed herein unless the context
- 9 otherwise requires:
- 10 (a) "Change of name petition" means a petition to
- 11 change the legal name of an individual.
- 12 (b) "Offender" means any physically incarcerated person
- 13 convicted of a crime or offense under the laws and ordinances of
- 14 the state and its political subdivisions or the laws and
- 15 regulations of the federal government.
- 16 **SECTION 3.** (1) (a) No offender shall have standing to file
- 17 a change of name petition with the chancery court;

18 (b) No chancellor shall grant a change of name peti
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- 19 for an offender; and
- 20 (c) No chancery clerk shall file a change of name
- 21 petition for an offender.
- 22 (2) A chancellor may change the name of an offender if:
- 23 (a) A district attorney files a change of name petition
- 24 on behalf of an offender;
- 25 (b) A sheriff of a county in which a person is
- 26 incarcerated files a change of name petition on behalf of an
- 27 offender;
- 28 (c) The commissioner of the Mississippi Department of
- 29 Corrections, or his or her designee, files a change of name
- 30 petition on behalf of an offender; or
- 31 (d) A Mississippi Department of Corrections Chaplain
- 32 files a change of name petition on behalf of an offender.
- 33 **SECTION 4.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 34 and after July 1, 2022.
