SENATE BILL NO. 2397 (As Passed the Senate)

- (2) (a) If a charge is brought under this article within two (2) years from the date of a declassification of a controlled substance on the federal schedule of controlled substances and that federally declassified controlled substance is the subject of the offense, there shall be an automatic defense to prosecution.
- 30 (b) The defense shall be raised sua sponte by the court or by any party to the proceeding and shall bar the prosecution of the charge.
- 33 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2022, and shall stand repealed on June 30, 2022.
