SENATE BILL NO. 2419

AN ACT TO CREATE THE HOSPITAL NURSES AND ALLIED HEALTH
PROFESSIONAL RETENTION LOAN REPAYMENT PROGRAM; TO PROVIDE AWARDS
TO CERTAIN NURSES AND ALLIED HEALTH PROFESSIONALS WHO APPLY
SUBJECT TO AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS; TO SET ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS;
TO EXCLUDE CERTAIN CATEGORIES OF PERSONS FROM ELIGIBILITY; TO
REQUIRE THAT RECIPIENTS MAINTAIN CURRENT EMPLOYMENT INFORMATION AT
ALL TIMES WITH THE STATE FINANCIAL AID BOARD; TO PROVIDE THAT
AMOUNTS AWARDED BE PAID TO THE RECIPIENT'S LENDER OR LOAN SERVICE
PROVIDER; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 11 **SECTION 1.** (1) There is established the "Hospital Nurses
- 12 and Allied Health Professional Retention Loan Repayment Program"
- 13 for new nursing and allied health profession graduates to be
- 14 administered by the State Financial Aid Board.
- 15 (2) Subject to the availability of funds, an eligible
- 16 applicant for an initial award must have:
- 17 (a) Legal residency in the State of Mississippi;
- 18 (b) Graduated from a degree-granting institution of
- 19 higher learning that is accredited by the Southern Association of
- 20 Colleges and Schools or a comparable accreditation body of another
- 21 region;

- (c) Gained recent employment for the first time as a
- 23 licensed practical nurse * * *, licensed registered nurse or
- 24 allied health professional at a general acute care hospital in the
- 25 State of Mississippi that is licensed by the Mississippi State
- 26 Department of Health;
- 27 (d) A current Mississippi * * * professional license;
- 28 and
- 29 (e) Outstanding qualifying educational loans, received
- 30 while pursuing a nursing or allied health profession degree, which
- 31 may include the principal, interest, and related expenses such as
- 32 the required interest premium on the unpaid balances of government
- 33 and commercial loans obtained by the recipient for educational
- 34 expense.
- 35 (3) Persons who have received funds from other forgivable
- 36 loan programs at the same degree level established for nurses or
- 37 allied health professionals under Mississippi law, or who are in
- 38 default or delinquent on any federal, state, local or commercial
- 39 qualifying educational loan, are not eligible for this program.
- 40 (4) Recipients in the initial year of the program will be
- 41 selected on a first-come, first-served basis from all eliqible
- 42 applicants. In the second and subsequent years of an applicant's
- 43 continued eligibility, priority shall be given to renewal
- 44 applicants. In any given year no more than one hundred fifty
- 45 (150) new registered nurse applicants \star \star , fifty (50) new
- 46 licensed practical nurse applicants and twenty-five (25) new

- 47 <u>allied health professional applicants</u> may receive funds under the
- 48 program.
- 49 (5) Awards for recipients who are employed at a licensed
- 50 general acute care hospital in the state are as follows:
- 51 (a) Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) for the first
- 52 year of employment;
- 53 (b) Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) for the second
- 54 year of employment; and
- 55 (c) Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) for the third
- 56 year of employment.
- 57 (6) A recipient shall not be penalized for ending employment
- 58 at a licensed general acute care hospital in the State of
- 59 Mississippi if the recipient begins working for another licensed
- 60 general acute care hospital in the State of Mississippi during the
- 61 year on which the award is based.
- 62 (7) Awards will be granted on a year-to-year basis, and
- 63 recipients have no obligation to seek a subsequent award.
- 64 (8) Awards shall be paid annually, after the expiration of
- 65 the year of employment for which the award was granted, to the
- 66 recipient's lender or loan service provider, to be applied to the
- 67 outstanding balance. Monies paid by the recipient or on the
- 68 recipient's behalf toward qualifying educational loans before
- 69 payment of the award are not eligible for reimbursement through
- 70 the program.

- 71 (9) During the employment year for which the award is
- 72 granted, a recipient must at all times keep the State Financial
- 73 Aid Board informed of any changes to the recipient's current,
- 74 correct, and complete employment information and status.
- 75 (10) Recipients who fail to maintain a * * * Mississippi
- 76 professional license or fail to fulfill the year of employment on
- 77 which the award was based forfeit any right to the award.
- 78 (11) The State Financial Aid Board, in collaboration with
- 79 the * * * licensing board of the nurse or other health care
- 80 professional eligible to receive funds under this program, must
- 81 track award recipients under this program through their fifth
- 82 employment year, unless the recipient leaves employment * * * at a
- 83 licensed general acute care hospital in the state at an earlier
- 84 date. Data collected must include each recipients' place of
- 85 employment and any other pertinent information necessary to
- 86 determine the efficacy of the program in retaining nurses and
- 87 allied health professionals in licensed general acute care
- 88 hospitals in the state of Mississippi. The board must submit a
- 89 report of the information collected under this subsection (11) to
- 90 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee by October 1 of each year,
- 91 and include information concerning the number of submitted
- 92 applications and the amount of grant funds awarded to each
- 93 applicant.
- 94 (12) The State Financial Aid Board must promulgate

- There is established in the State Treasury a special 98 fund to be designated the "Hospital Nursing and Allied Health 99 100 Professional Loan Repayment Program," into which shall be 101 deposited those funds appropriated by the Legislature, and any 102 other funds that may be made available, for the purpose of 103 implementing the loan repayment program established herein. in the fund at the end of the fiscal year shall not lapse into the 104 105 General Fund, and interest earned on any amounts deposited into 106 the fund shall be credited to the special fund.
- 107 (14) This section shall stand repealed on July 1, 2026.
- SECTION 2. Section 37-106-59, Mississippi Code of 1972,
 which establishes a forgivable loan program for baccalaureate and
 graduate studies in nursing, is repealed from and after July 1,
 2022.
- SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
