COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 2431

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 37-43-21 AND 37-43-23, MISSISSIPPI 2 CODE OF 1972, TO REMOVE THE REQUIREMENT THAT ANY TEXTBOOK SUPPLIER 3 WITH WHOM THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION HAS CONTRACTED TO PROVIDE 4 ALL OF THE STATE'S TEXTBOOKS SHALL MAINTAIN A DEPOSITORY IN THE 5 STATE OF MISSISSIPPI; TO PROVIDE THAT SUCH SUPPLIER MAY HAVE A 6 DEPOSITORY WITHIN THE STATE OR IN A REGIONAL AREA LOCATED IN 7 REASONABLE PROXIMITY TO THE STATE; TO AMEND SECTION 37-43-31, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CLARIFY INTERNAL REFERENCES AND 8 9 CORRECT GRAMMATICAL ERRORS; TO AMEND SECTIONS 37-43-33 AND 37-43-59, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, IN CONFORMITY TO THE PRECEDING 10 11 PROVISIONS; TO BRING FORWARD SECTIONS 37-43-1, 37-43-2, 37-43-17, 12 37-43-19, 37-43-24, 37-43-25, 37-43-27, 37-43-29, 37-43-39, 37-43-41, 37-43-43, 37-43-45, 37-43-47, 37-43-51 AND 37-43-57, 13 MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, FOR THE PURPOSE OF POSSIBLE AMENDMENTS; 14 TO REPEAL SECTIONS 37-43-37, 37-43-49, 37-43-53 AND 37-43-55, 15 16 MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, WHICH ARE VARIOUS OBSOLETE PROVISIONS OF 17 THE MISSISSIPPI TEXTBOOK LAW; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

18 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

19 SECTION 1. Section 37-43-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

20 amended as follows:

21 37-43-21. (1) For the purpose of assisting the board during 22 an adoption, there shall be rating committees in each of the 23 fields in which textbooks are considered for adoption. Each 24 committee shall be composed of seven (7) members. The State 25 Superintendent of Public Education shall appoint four (4) members

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26 of each of the committees, each of whom shall be a competent, 27 experienced teacher who is currently teaching in the field in 28 which the textbooks are considered for adoption. The Governor of 29 the State of Mississippi thereupon shall appoint three (3) members 30 of each of said committees, who shall be persons he deems 31 competent to participate in the appraisal of books offered for adoption, in each field, for use in the public schools of this 32 33 state.

34 It shall be the duty of said rating committees to (2) 35 appraise the books offered for adoption in each field in which 36 textbooks are offered for adoption and recommend eight (8) books 37 and/or series for each adoption to be made by the board and giving 38 the reasons for or basis of such recommendations. No book shall be recommended which does not receive a majority vote of the 39 members of each committee. Any member dissenting from any 40 41 majority vote of the committee shall make his appraisal of any 42 book recommended or rejected by the majority of the committee and specify the reasons therefor and make such recommendations as he 43 44 thinks proper. All appraisals, recommendations, and dissents if 45 any, shall be in writing and filed with the board for its 46 consideration upon the adoption. The travel expenses of such 47 committees shall be reimbursed in the amount as provided in Section 25-3-41 and shall be paid out of the State Textbook Fund. 48 49 Such rating committees shall be subject to the provisions of 50 Section 37-43-17. The board shall have the power to reject any

and all recommendations of the rating committees and to call for further recommendations; in no case shall the board adopt any book not recommended by the rating committees.

Any and all sample textbooks that may be furnished by 54 (3) 55 the publisher thereof as provided by Section 37-43-59 to any 56 member of the board, the State Superintendent of Public Education, 57 and any member of a rating committee shall within one (1) year 58 after receipt of same by said member be turned in to the * * * 59 Regional School Book Depository without cost to the State of Mississippi, and the same shall thereafter be used without any 60 61 cost to the State of Mississippi in supplying free textbooks to the educable children of the State of Mississippi as now provided 62 63 by law or shall be sold to the highest bidder by the board with the proceeds immediately deposited in the State Treasury to the 64 credit of the State Textbook Fund. 65

(4) No state official, state employee, school board member,
school superintendent, principal, teacher or any other individual
shall sell or donate sample textbooks furnished them by the * * *
<u>Regional</u> School Book Depository as part of the textbook adoption
or selection process. Said individuals and public officials shall
not receive payment by the * * * <u>regional</u> depository, any
publisher or any other company for sample textbooks.

(5) School districts may annually utilize any portion of the textbook allotment for the repair of textbooks; provided, however, that school districts are authorized and encouraged to utilize the

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76 Mississippi Department of Corrections bookbinder for the repair of 77 textbooks.

(6) Prices for new textbook purchases shall not be higher
than the lowest price at which books are sold anywhere in the
United States, after all discounts are allowed.

81 SECTION 2. Section 37-43-23, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 82 amended as follows:

83 37-43-23. The State Board of Education is hereby authorized, 84 empowered and directed to advertise for and receive sealed bids for textbooks. Bidders shall quote their lowest net wholesale 85 86 prices, f.o.b. * * * destination being the board-authorized regional depository. The board may, in its discretion, establish 87 88 a state depository or approve regional depositories located in reasonable proximity to the state, or inaugurate any other plan 89 90 for the distribution of books. Such prices shall not be higher 91 than the lowest price at which books are sold anywhere in the 92 United States, after all discounts are allowed. It is the intent of the Legislature that the price paid for a textbook shall not 93 94 exceed the lowest price at which the same book, both having the 95 same copyright date, is sold anywhere in the United States after 96 all discounts are allowed. Every contract entered into under the 97 provisions of this section by the board and any publisher or publishing company shall contain a provision that the publisher 98 99 covenants and agrees that he is not furnishing under contract 100 executed after the first day of January of the year in which the

101 contract becomes effective, to any state, county or school 102 district in the United States, the textbooks embraced in the 103 contract at a price below the price stipulated therein. At any time that the board may find that any book or books, in either 104 105 regular or special editions, are being furnished in any other 106 state at a lower price under contract than it is being furnished 107 in Mississippi, the contract shall be forfeited to the state. Any 108 contractor who violates this provision shall return all money paid 109 out for such book or books and also forfeit such book or books to 110 the state, and suit may be brought on the bond of the contractor for all losses sustained. 111

Successful bidders or contractors * * * may maintain a 112 113 depository at a place within the State of Mississippi or within a regional area located in reasonable proximity to the state, to be 114 115 named by the board, where a stock of books sufficient to meet all 116 reasonable and immediate demands shall be kept. Upon requisition 117 of the board, * * * an approved depository shall ship books, transportation charges paid, to the various shipping points in 118 119 Mississippi to be specified by the board. For such service the 120 depository shall make no charge to the board except the actual 121 cost of transportation from the depository to the shipping point 122 designated. The cost of distribution shall not exceed eight percent (8%) of the total appropriation for any fiscal year. 123

124 All books furnished the State of Mississippi by contractors 125 under this chapter shall continue to measure up to the same

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126 standards as are required in the contract, said standards to 127 include printing, binding, cover boards, mechanical makeup, and any other relevant points as set out in the plans and 128 129 specifications as fixed by the board. Any contractor of any book 130 or books, who fails to keep said books up to said standards, shall 131 forfeit, not only his contract to the state, but shall return all 132 money paid out for such book or books and also forfeit said books 133 to the state.

134 SECTION 3. Section 37-43-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 135 amended as follows:

136 37-43-31. (1) The State Board of Education shall adopt and 137 furnish textbooks only for use in those courses set up in the 138 state course of study as recommended by the State Accreditation Commission and adopted by such board, or courses established by 139 acts of the Legislature. In all subjects the board, in its 140 141 discretion, may adopt textbooks and/or series from those 142 recommended by the textbook rating committees. The board may adopt a plan which permits the local school districts to choose 143 144 the book or books to be requisitioned from those adopted, 145 provided:

(a) That, when a book is furnished by the state, it
shall remain in use during the period of its adoption;
(b) That the average per pupil cost of textbooks so
furnished any unit shall not exceed that allowed for all other

150 units in the state;

151 (c) That nothing herein provided shall be construed as 152 giving any school the authority to discard or replace usable 153 copies of textbooks now being furnished by the state;

154 (d) That the State Department of Education is 155 authorized to disburse the annual textbook appropriation directly 156 to the public school districts in accordance with *** * *** paragraph 157 (b) of this subsection. The textbooks procured through this 158 chapter, as well as textbooks which are on hand on June 30, 1994, 159 which were previously purchased through the provisions of this statute, shall become the property of the public school district 160 161 which purchased them, unless the State Department of Education 162 authorizes the transfer of unneeded textbooks to another location 163 in accordance with rules and regulations promulgated by the State 164 Board of Education;

165 That textbooks which are on loan to other than (e) 166 public schools as referenced in Section 37-43-1, shall remain the 167 property of the State of Mississippi. All requisitions for 168 textbooks from these schools shall be submitted to the State 169 Department of Education to be processed and subsequently shipped 170 to the requesting school. No funds shall be disbursed directly from the State Department of Education to the schools in this 171 172 category for the purpose of procuring textbooks; and

(f) That funds made available through this chapter may be used to purchase any state-adopted * * * textbook from any * * * board-approved depository, directly from the publisher,

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or in accordance with the provisions of Sections 37-43-21(5) and 37-43-31(3). For purchases made directly from the publisher, the public school district, or the State Department of Education when purchasing for other than public schools, shall not pay a higher price for a textbook than that listed on the current state-adopted list.

182 (2) Whenever any book under contract is displaced by a new 183 adoption, the board may continue to require the schools to use the 184 recently purchased books from any previous adoption; however, such 185 period of use shall not exceed four (4) years.

186 (3) If five (5) or more school boards petition the State 187 Board of Education to add a book, or a series of books, to the 188 approved list of state adoptions in a given subject area, then the 189 State Superintendent of Public Education shall have sixty (60) 190 days to show cause to the State Board of Education why the books 191 in question should or should not be purchased with state funds. 192 If the petition is not acted upon within the sixty-day period, the petition shall be deemed to be approved. Once a textbook has been 193 194 approved through the petition process, any public school district 195 or eligible other school may procure the said textbook utilizing 196 funds appropriated through this chapter.

197 (4) If new and innovative textbooks that would improve a
198 particular course of study become available between adoption
199 cycles, a school board may petition the State Board of Education

200 for permission to purchase these books out of sequence to be paid 201 for with state textbook funds.

202 (5) The State Board of Education shall not allow previously 203 rejected textbooks to be used if such textbooks were rejected for 204 any of the following reasons:

205 (a) Obscene, lewd, sexist or vulgar material;

206

(b) Advocating prejudicial behavior or actions; or

207 (c) Encouraging acts determined to be * * * derogatory
208 to any race, sex or religion.

(6) All books or series of books adopted under the petition procedures of this chapter shall be purchased under the provisions for bidding, pricing and distribution as prescribed in Section 37-43-23.

213 Petition procedure books or series of books adopted (7) 214 under this section shall be considered only until the date of the 215 next regular adoption series in the applicable subject area. 216 Petition procedure books shall be submitted for formal adoption at 217 the next applicable regular textbook adoption as prescribed under 218 the provisions of Chapter 43, Title 37, Mississippi Code of 1972; 219 otherwise, such books adopted under the petition procedures which 220 do not receive formal adoption approval as recommended by the 221 textbook rating committee shall be dropped from the state textbook 222 petition adoption list. Provided, however, this provision shall 223 in no way prohibit a school district from using other funds, 224 federal or local, for the purchase of such books.

225 SECTION 4. Section 37-43-33, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 226 amended as follows:

227 37-43-33. Any parent, person or school board in any
228 community of the state may purchase books from * * * <u>a</u>
229 <u>board-approved regional</u> depository who is given authority to sell
230 books under the provisions of this chapter. The price of the
231 books so ordered or brought shall be the same as the contract
232 price, plus whatever postage or delivery charges might accrue.

233 SECTION 5. Section 37-43-59, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 234 amended as follows:

235 37-43-59. (1) Not more than one (1) pupil copy, one (1) 236 teacher's edition, and one (1) copy of any limited auxiliary 237 materials shall be furnished as samples or specimen copies to any 238 single person involved in the state rating, adoption process of 239 free textbooks. Any and all sample or specimen textbooks or other 240 materials furnished to any person serving in an official capacity 241 or as an officer or employee in a school receiving free textbooks shall be furnished only by the State Board of Education after 242 243 receipt from the publishers. No samples shall be furnished by 244 publishers directly to any such person. The board shall keep 245 detailed records of all samples furnished to all persons and 246 establish such procedures for return of all samples. The intent 247 of this provision is that no person serving in an official 248 capacity shall receive personal benefit or profit from sale of sample or specimen textbooks. 249

No. 2431 22/SS08/R468CS PAGE 10 250 (2) Not more than one (1) pupil copy, one (1) teacher's 251 edition, and one (1) copy of any limited auxiliary materials shall 252 be furnished for review and inspection to any single person 253 involved in the selection committee process of free textbooks. Any 254 and all textbooks or other materials furnished to any such person 255 serving in a selection committee capacity for inspection and 256 review shall be furnished subject to the rules and regulations 257 adopted by the board which such rules and regulations shall not 258 prohibit direct delivery by the publishers to such persons. The 259 board shall keep detailed records of all textbooks and auxiliary 260 materials furnished to all such persons and establish such 261 procedures for the return thereof. Any and all textbooks 262 furnished to persons serving on selection committees shall be 263 turned in to the *** * *** Regional School Book Depository without any 264 cost to the State of Mississippi and shall be credited to the 265 account of the publisher. Any and all textbooks so furnished to 266 persons serving on selection committees which have not been 267 returned within one (1) year of the receipt of same the value 268 thereof shall be charged against the allocation of state funds to 269 said school district to the same extent as if said books had been 270 purchased by said school district. The intent of this provision 271 is that no person serving as a selection committee member shall 272 receive personal benefit or proceeds from the sale of said 273 textbooks.

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274 (3) The *** * *** Regional School Book Depository shall pay into the State Treasury to the credit of the State Textbook Fund the 275 276 net wholesale price less an eight percent (8%) distribution cost 277 and freight charges of those adopted textbooks which are returned 278 by the rating committees as required herein. The board shall also 279 provide for the sale of damaged books and those textbooks not 280 adopted into the secondary textbook market on an annual basis. 281 The * * * Regional School Book Depository shall pay into the State 282 Treasury to the credit of the State Textbook Fund the amount 283 received for which said textbooks are sold less an eight percent 284 (8%) distribution cost and freight charges of said textbooks which 285 are damaged or not adopted.

(4) Any person converting to personal use or selling any
sample or specimen textbook or other materials contrary to
provisions of this section shall be guilty of the crime of
embezzlement as provided by Section 97-11-25 and in addition shall
upon conviction pay a fine of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) per book sold
or converted to personal use and shall be removed from any public
office or public employment position held.

293 **SECTION 6.** Section 37-43-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 294 brought forward as follows:

295 37-43-1. (1) This chapter is intended to furnish a plan for 296 the adoption, purchase, distribution, care and use of free 297 textbooks to be loaned to the pupils in all elementary and high 298 schools, other than charter schools, of Mississippi.

299 (2)The books herein provided by the State Board of 300 Education, which shall be the State Textbook Procurement 301 Commission, shall be distributed and loaned free of cost to the 302 children of the free public school districts of the state and of 303 all other schools located in the state, which maintain educational 304 standards equivalent to the standards established by the State 305 Department of Education for the state schools as outlined in the 306 Approval Requirements of the State Board of Education for 307 Nonpublic Schools.

308 (3) Teachers shall permit all pupils in all grades of any 309 public school in any school district to carry to their homes for 310 home study, the free textbooks loaned to them, and any other 311 regular textbooks whether they be free textbooks or not.

312 (4) For the purposes of this chapter, the term "board" shall313 mean the State Board of Education.

(5) "Textbook" shall be defined as any medium or manual of instruction which contains a systematic presentation of the principles of a subject and which constitutes a major instructional vehicle for that subject.

(6) In addition to the authority granted in this chapter, local school boards shall make available to the parents or legal guardians of any children of school age who reside in the school district administered by the school board, upon request, any textbooks on the state surplus inventory list. The parent or legal guardian is responsible for the return of the textbook(s) to

the local school district upon completion of the textbook(s) use.
Failure to return the textbook(s) to the school district will
result in the parents or legal guardians being responsible for
compensating the school district for the fair market value of the
textbook(s).

329 **SECTION 7.** Section 37-43-2, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 330 brought forward as follows:

37-43-2. (1) On July 1, 1987, the State Board of Education 331 332 shall assume all power, authority, duties and functions of the State Textbook Procurement Commission. All records, personnel, 333 334 property and unexpended balances of appropriations, allocations or 335 other funds of the State Textbook Procurement Commission shall be 336 transferred to the State Board of Education on July 1, 1987. All 337 such employee transfers shall be in accordance with the rules and regulations of the State Personnel Board. It is the intent of the 338 339 Legislature that the number of persons employed by the state as a 340 result of the consolidation required by this section shall be reduced where possible, but that such reduction shall result from 341 342 attrition of employees and not dismissal.

343 (2) Each officer or agency subject to the provisions of this 344 section is hereby authorized and empowered to promulgate such 345 rules and regulations not conflicting with this section necessary 346 to accomplish an orderly transition. Each officer or agency 347 subject to this section shall assist, with the fullest degree of

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S. B. No. 2431 22/SS08/R468CS PAGE 14 348 reasonable cooperation, any other officer or agency in carrying 349 out the intent and purpose of this section.

350 All members serving on the Mississippi State Textbook (3) 351 Procurement Commission as it existed under the provisions of 352 Section 37-43-3 prior to June 30, 1987, shall continue to serve in 353 an advisory capacity to the State Board of Education until 354 December 31, 1987. This advisory board shall be known as the 355 "Mississippi State Textbook Advisory Board," and shall assist the 356 State Board of Education in assuming its duties under the 357 provisions of this section and shall provide technical assistance 358 as may be requested. The State Department of Education, from any 359 funds appropriated thereto, shall, upon the request of the State 360 Board of Education, timely pay all sums reasonably required for 361 the operation of the Mississippi State Textbook Advisory Board, 362 including per diem and actual expenses of such board, through 363 December 31, 1987.

364 **SECTION 8.** Section 37-43-17, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 365 brought forward as follows:

366 37-43-17. If any person related within the third degree by 367 blood or marriage, as computed by civil law, to any member of the 368 board, or if any person that is associated in any business or 369 partnership with any member of said board, shall be employed in 370 good faith by any school book company, firm, corporation or agent 371 in connection with the adoption of textbooks within this state, 372 the said member of the board so related by blood or marriage, or

373 so associated in business or partnership with such person, shall 374 not vote in the rating and adoption of any school book or books 375 offered by such school book company, firm, corporation or agent 376 for adoption.

377 **SECTION 9.** Section 37-43-19, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 378 brought forward as follows:

379 37-43-19. The board shall have the power and is hereby 380 authorized:

(a) To promulgate rules and regulations for the
purchase, care, use, disposal, distribution and accounting for all
books to be furnished under the terms of this chapter, and to
promulgate such other rules and regulations as may be necessary
for the proper administration of this chapter.

(b) To adopt, contract for, and make available for
purchase, cash or credit, basal, supplementary or alternative
textbooks through twelve (12) grades as provided in the school
curriculum, or for any other course that it may add thereto.

390 To determine the period of contract for rated and (C) 391 adopted textbooks which shall not be for less than four (4) years 392 nor more than five (5) years, with the right of the board, in its 393 discretion, to renew or extend such contract from year to year for 394 a period not exceeding two (2) additional years and to determine 395 the conditions of the approval or forfeiture of a contract and 396 such other terms and conditions as may be necessary and not 397 contrary to law.

398 (d) To have complete power and authority over additions and amendments to textbooks, advertising for bids and the contents 399 400 thereof, including auxiliary materials and workbooks, advertising 401 on the protective covers of textbooks, bids and proposals, prices 402 of textbooks, specimen copies, cash deposits, selection and 403 adoption, distribution, fumigation, emergencies, selling to 404 others, return of deposits, forfeiture of deposits, regulations 405 governing deposits, renovation and repair of books, requisition, 406 transportation or shipment of books, and any other acts or 407 regulations, not contrary to law, that may be deemed necessary for 408 furnishing and loaning free textbooks to the school children, as 409 provided in this chapter.

410 **SECTION 10.** Section 37-43-24, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 411 brought forward as follows:

412 37-43-24. (1) This section shall be referred to and may be 413 cited as the "Timely Acquisition of Braille and Large Print 414 Textbooks Act of 2002."

415 The State Department of Education is hereby authorized (2)416 and directed to place textbook procurement orders for visually 417 impaired and hearing impaired students in the schools of this 418 state prior to the beginning of the fiscal year for which the 419 expenditure for such order has been authorized by the Legislature. 420 After June 1 of any year, the State Department of Education may 421 order additional books, as needed. In addition, the State 422 Department of Education is authorized and directed to place

423 textbook, equipment and school supply procurement orders for 424 students attending the state supported schools administered by the 425 State Board of Education prior to the beginning of the fiscal year 426 for which the expenditure for such order has been authorized by 427 the Legislature, and may order additional books, equipment and 428 supplies at a later date, as needed. The department shall insure 429 that the appropriate procedures for textbook procurement are 430 followed according to state law and board policy as described in 431 the Textbook Administration Handbook.

432 **SECTION 11.** Section 37-43-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 433 brought forward as follows:

434 37-43-25. Specimen copies of all textbooks, which have been 435 made the basis of contracts under the provisions of this chapter, 436 clearly marked and identified as such, shall be deposited by the 437 publisher of said books with the State Superintendent of Public 438 Education. Said specimen copies shall be preserved and kept open 439 for inspection by the public.

A copy of all contracts and bonds executed under the provisions of this chapter shall be provided to the following, one (1) copy for the contractor, one (1) copy to be filed in the Office of the Secretary of State, and one (1) copy to be filed in the office of the State Superintendent of Public Education.

An original of each bid, whether accepted or rejected, shall be filed and preserved in the office of the State Superintendent of Public Education for at least five (5) years.

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448 **SECTION 12.** Section 37-43-27, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 449 brought forward as follows:

450 37-43-27. No book or books shall be purchased from any 451 person, firm or corporation who is a member of, or connected with, 452 any trust. In the event that it is established that this 453 provision has been violated, the contract shall be forfeited and 454 monies paid out under this contract shall be returned to the 455 state, and all books heretofore purchased under said contract 456 shall be kept by the state or the public school district which 457 purchased the textbooks.

458 **SECTION 13.** Section 37-43-29, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 459 brought forward as follows:

460 37-43-29. Any person, firm or corporation with whom a 461 contract has been entered into, under the provisions of this 462 chapter, shall designate the Secretary of State of Mississippi as 463 its agent, upon whom citation and all other writs and processes 464 may be served, in case any suit shall be brought against such 465 person, firm or corporation.

466 SECTION 14. Section 37-43-39, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
467 brought forward as follows:

468 37-43-39. No teacher in any of the schools of the state, and 469 no county or municipal superintendent of schools, and no person 470 officially connected with the government of or direction of any 471 school shall, during the term of his office as said superintendent 472 or during the time of his or her employment as teacher, act as

473 agent or attorney for any textbook publishing company selling textbooks in this state. If, after election as county or 474 475 municipal superintendent or employment as teacher, any person 476 filling such position accepts the agency or attorneyship of any 477 textbook publishing company, the acceptance of such agency or 478 attorneyship shall work a forfeiture of the office or position as 479 teacher held at the time of the acceptance of such agency or 480 attorneyship.

481 **SECTION 15.** Section 37-43-41, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 482 brought forward as follows:

483 37-43-41. The State Textbook Fund of Mississippi shall 484 consist of the amounts appropriated by the Legislature for the 485 same, all monies accruing from the sale of disused books from 486 other than public schools, all monies derived from the purchase of 487 books by both public and private schools trustees, and by private 488 individuals, all monies collected in damage suits under the terms 489 of this chapter, and all other monies collected in any way 490 whatsoever under the terms of this chapter.

There is hereby created a special fund in the State Treasury to be designated as the "Local School District Textbook Carryover Fund." Said fund shall be credited with any funds which were appropriated by the Legislature to the State Textbook Fund for any fiscal year in which said funds were allocated to local school districts but unexpended by said districts. Said unexpended funds shall be deposited by the board into the Local School District

498 Textbook Carryover Fund to the credit of the local school 499 districts which were originally allocated such funds. All 500 carryover funds which exist on June 30, 1994, which belong to 501 public school districts shall be disbursed to the respective 502 school districts. Carryover funds for other than public schools 503 shall be handled in the same manner as previously described in 504 this section.

505 **SECTION 16.** Section 37-43-43, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 506 brought forward as follows:

507 37-43-43. The State Superintendent of Public Education shall 508 deposit all funds sent to him from nonpublic schools for lost 509 books or damaged books as well as all other funds accruing under 510 this chapter in the State Treasury to the credit of the State 511 Textbook Fund.

512 **SECTION 17.** Section 37-43-45, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 513 brought forward as follows:

514 37-43-45. Any loss occasioned by the neglect, carelessness 515 or failure of duty by the county superintendent or any principal 516 or teacher in charge of any school, shall entitle the state to 517 bring suit for the recovery of the amount of the loss or losses 518 occasioned thereby.

519 Any writ or suit of any nature instituted under the 520 provisions of this chapter shall be brought in the name of the 521 State of Mississippi by the Attorney General. Any money or moneys 522 recovered by such suit shall be placed to the credit of the State 523 Textbook Fund.

524 **SECTION 18.** Section 37-43-47, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 525 brought forward as follows:

526 37-43-47. Bills for textbooks purchased by the state on 527 requisitions as provided in this chapter, and bills for all other 528 expenses incurred under the terms of this chapter, shall be paid by warrants on the State Treasury made by the Auditor on receipt 529 530 of bills from the State Superintendent of Public Education, and 531 approved by the State Board of Education. Bills for textbooks 532 purchased by public school districts, shall be submitted to the 533 respective school district submitting the requisition. Each 534 public school district will make payment to the appropriate entity 535 which is responsible for providing the requested textbooks.

536 **SECTION 19.** Section 37-43-51, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 537 brought forward as follows:

538 37-43-51. The management of all public, private, parochial 539 or denominational schools wherein the board is furnishing to the 540 students thereof free school textbooks and said free school 541 textbooks are used by the students in said school, shall file 542 annually with the State Board of Education any and all reports as 543 may be required by the board.

544 Any person who shall refuse, neglect or fail to file any 545 report required by the board shall be denied a new allocation of 546 funds until such reports have been completed and filed with the 547 board.

548 **SECTION 20.** Section 37-43-57, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 549 brought forward as follows:

550 37-43-57. Except as may otherwise be provided in this 551 chapter, any person willfully violating any of the provisions of 552 this chapter shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction 553 shall be punished by a fine of not less than Five Hundred Dollars 554 (\$500.00) nor more than Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00), or by 555 imprisonment not to exceed twelve (12) months in the county jail, 556 or by both, in the discretion of the court.

557 SECTION 21. Section 37-43-37, Mississippi Code of 1972, 558 which requires all books to have a uniform label printed on the 559 inside cover and for all teachers to maintain an accurate record 560 of the number and names of all books issued to pupils, is hereby 561 repealed.

562 SECTION 22. Section 37-43-49, Mississippi Code of 1972, 563 which requires county boards of supervisors to provide adequate 564 storage space in the county courthouse or other county building 565 for the storage of school textbooks, is hereby repealed.

566 SECTION 23. Section 37-43-53, Mississippi Code of 1972, 567 which authorizes the State Board of Education to offer the space 568 on the protective of textbooks for advertising purposes, is hereby 569 repealed.

Section 37-43-55, Mississippi Code of 1972, 571 which authorizes the State Board of Education to purchase and 572 determine the number of copies of the Mississippi Blue Book to be 573 furnished to each school for supplemental use therein, is hereby 574 repealed.

575 **SECTION 25.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 576 and after July 1, 2022.

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
