## SENATE BILL NO. 2433

AN ACT TO CREATE NEW SECTION 37-113-55, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT THE COLLEGE OF VETERINARY MEDICINE AT 3 MISSISSIPPI STATE UNIVERSITY SHALL ONLY ADMIT APPLICANTS WHO HAVE BEEN BONA FIDE RESIDENTS OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI FOR THREE 5 CONSECUTIVE YEARS IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING THE DATE OF THEIR APPLICATION; TO PROVIDE THAT IF ANY POSITIONS IN THE INCOMING 7 FIRST-YEAR CLASS ARE OPEN AFTER THE FIRST ROUND OF ADMISSIONS AND SUBSEQUENT RESERVATIONS BY RESIDENT APPLICANTS, THE COLLEGE OF 8 9 VETERINARY MEDICINE MAY ADMIT NONRESIDENT APPLICANTS; AND FOR 10 RELATED PURPOSES.

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 12 **SECTION 1.** The following shall be codified as Section
- 13 37-113-55, Mississippi Code of 1972:
- 14 37-113-55. (1) For purposes of this section, "resident"
- 15 shall be defined and determined in the same manner as resident
- 16 status for tuition purposes as set forth in Sections 37-103-1
- 17 through 37-103-29, with the exception of Section 37-103-17.
- 18 (2) The College of Veterinary Medicine at Mississippi State
- 19 University shall only admit applicants who have been bona fide
- 20 residents of the State of Mississippi for three (3) consecutive
- 21 years immediately preceding the date of his or her application.

- 22 These applicants shall also meet any other requirements set forth
- 23 by the College of Veterinary Medicine in its admission standards.
- 24 The College of Veterinary Medicine may accept class seat
- 25 reservations from such applicants.
- 26 (3) If any positions in the incoming first-year class are
- 27 open after the first round of admissions and subsequent
- 28 reservations by resident applicants, the College of Veterinary
- 29 Medicine may admit nonresident applicants who meet the
- 30 requirements set forth by the College of Veterinary Medicine in
- 31 its admission standards.
- 32 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 33 and after July 1, 2022.
