COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 2488

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-4-39, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE A FRESHWATER FISHING GUIDE OR SERVICE THAT UTILIZES A BOAT TO OBTAIN A FISHING GUIDE BOAT LICENSE AND DECAL; TO PROVIDE THE FEE FOR SUCH LICENSE; TO PROVIDE THAT FRESHWATER FISHING GUIDES 5 SHALL BE PROHIBITED FROM FISHING WHILE PROVIDING SERVICE; TO PROVIDE THAT FRESHWATER FISHING GUIDES SHALL BE PROHIBITED FROM KEEPING ANY FISH CAUGHT BY THE PERSONS THEY ARE GUIDING; TO 7 PROVIDE THAT THE PRESENCE OF THE GUIDE DOES NOT COUNT TOWARD THE 8 BAG LIMIT FOR FISH: AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 11 **SECTION 1.** Section 49-4-39, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 12 amended as follows:
- 13 49-4-39. (1) As used in this section:
- 14 (a) "Head boat" means a fishing boat that takes
- recreational (sports) fishermen out for a fee per person. 15
- (b) "Charter boat" means a fishing boat with a skipper, 16
- 17 quide, outfitter or captain that is rented for a fee for the
- 18 purpose of fishing.
- 19 (c) "Guide" means a person who advises or shows the way
- 20 to others for a fee.

21	(d) "Outfitter" means an establishment that sells
22	services for outdoor activities.
23	(e) "Skipper" means the captain of a ship or boat.
24	(f) "Captain" means a person who is at the helm,
25	controls or steering of a ship or boat.
26	(2) The commission may regulate hunting, fishing and
27	wildlife viewing, guide and outfitter services. The commission
28	shall have the following powers and duties:
29	(a) Prescribe the form and type of licenses;
30	(b) Prescribe an annual distinguishable decal for each
31	boat;
32	(* * \times c) Except as otherwise provided in this section,
33	establish fees for the types of licenses; the fee for guide
34	services <u>annual</u> licenses * * * <u>to be</u> One Hundred Fifty Dollars
35	(\$150.00) for residents and Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars
36	(\$2,500.00) for nonresidents; the fee for outfitters annual
37	licenses * * * $\underline{\text{to be}}$ Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) $\underline{\text{for}}$

41	(d) Require one-year proof of residency and a valid
42	sportsman's license for residents;
43	(e) Require a valid nonresident fishing license for
44	<pre>nonresidents;</pre>
45	(f) Require First Aid/CPR certification; and

46	(g) Exercise all powers to make regulations for
47	enforcement and safety of such services.
48	(3) A fishing guide, outfitter, skipper or captain that
49	utilizes a boat to provide fishing guide services shall obtain an

- 50 annual fishing guide boat license and decal for a fee of Two
- 51 Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00). In order to obtain a fishing
- 52 guide boat license and decal, an applicant must register the boat
- 53 being utilized with the department and provide to the department a
- 54 copy of the driver's license of the guide, outfitter, skipper or
- 55 captain and proof of liability insurance and such other
- 56 information as the department may require by regulation.
- 57 <u>(4) A fishing guide, outfitter, skipper, captain, boat mate</u> 58 <u>or crew is prohibited from keeping a recreational bag limit of</u>
- 59 fish.
- 60 (5) The presence of a guide, outfitter, skipper, captain,
 61 boat mate or crew does not count toward the boat's daily
- 62 possession limit for all game fish.
- 63 (6) A violation of this section or any regulation created by 64 the commission exercising its powers to regulate safety and
- 65 services is a Class II violation and is punishable as provided in
- 66 <u>Section 9-7-143.</u>
- 67 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 68 and after July 1, 2022.
