## SENATE BILL NO. 2498

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 59-21-87, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO ALLOW WATER SKIING WITHOUT AN OBSERVER IN THE BOAT IF THE BOAT 3 IS EQUIPPED WITH CERTAIN MIRRORS; TO REQUIRE SKIERS TO WEAR A 4 PERSONAL FLOTATION DEVICE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 59-21-87, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6 7 amended as follows: 8 59-21-87. (1) No person shall operate a motorboat on any 9 waters of this state while towing a person on water skis, or on an 10 aquaplane or similar device, **\* \* \*** between one (1) hour after sunset and one (1) hour before sunrise. 11 \* \* \* 12 (2) Each person being towed behind a vessel on water skis or 13 14 similar devices must wear a properly secured Type I, II, III or V U.S. Coast Guard-approved personal flotation device. 15 16 (3) Every vessel, except personal watercraft, towing a 17 person on water skis or similar device must have: 18 (a) A capable observer, other than the operator, ten 19 (10) years old or older, or S. 20	(b) A wide-angle rearview mirror. The size of the
21	mirror must be at least seventy-eight (78) square inches and have
22	a field of vision of at least one hundred seventy (170) degrees.
23	(4) Every personal watercraft towing a person on water skis
24	or a similar device must have mirrors mounted on both the right
25	and left sides of the personal watercraft but not attached to the
26	steering control, and the mirrors must be at least two and
27	one-half (2-1/2) inches high and four (4) inches wide.
28	(5) A reasonable distance from other vessels, people and
29	property must be maintained so as not to endanger life or
30	property. It is illegal to tow a person on water skis or similar
31	devices behind a vessel or to manipulate the water skis or similar
32	devices in a manner that causes the towed person to collide with
33	another person or object.
34	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
35	and after July 1, 2022.
