COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 2504

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-4-3, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE FOR THE DEFINITION OF THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE DIVISION OF PARKS AND RECREATION; TO AMEND SECTION 49-4-6, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE 5 DEPARTMENT OF WILDLIFE, FISHERIES AND PARKS TO BE APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR WITH THE ADVICE AND CONSENT OF THE SENATE; TO ESTABLISH 7 THAT THE DIRECTOR MAY SERVE A TERM OF FOUR YEARS AND MAY SEEK REAPPOINTMENT SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL AND APPOINTMENT BY THE 8 GOVERNOR AND THE ADVICE AND CONSENT OF THE SENATE; TO PROVIDE THAT 9 10 AN APPOINTMENT TO FILL AN UNEXPIRED TERM OCCURRING DUE TO THE 11 DEATH, REMOVAL OR RESIGNATION OF AN INCUMBENT SHALL NOT BE SUBJECT 12 TO THE TIME CONSTRAINTS PROVIDED FOR APPOINTMENTS TO FULL FOUR-YEAR TERMS; TO CREATE THE DIVISION OF PARKS AND RECREATION WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT OF WILDLIFE, FISHERIES AND PARKS; TO PROVIDE 14 1.5 THAT THE DIVISION SHALL BE HEADED BY AN EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR WHO 16 SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR WITH THE ADVICE AND CONSENT OF 17 THE SENATE AND SERVE A TERM OF FOUR YEARS; TO ESTABLISH THE 18 RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR; AND FOR RELATED 19 PURPOSES. 20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

- 21 **SECTION 1.** Section 49-4-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 22 amended as follows:
- 23 49-4-3. For the purposes of this chapter, the following
- 24 words shall have the meanings ascribed herein, unless the context
- 25 otherwise requires:

- 28 (b) "Commission" means the Mississippi Commission on
- 29 Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks.
- 30 (c) "Executive director" means the chief officer of the
- 31 department.
- 32 (d) "Executive Director of the Division of Parks and
- 33 Recreation" means the chief officer of the department's Division
- 34 of Parks and Recreation.
- 35 **SECTION 2.** Section 49-4-6, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 36 amended as follows:
- 37 49-4-6. (1) There is hereby created the Mississippi
- 38 Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks, whose principal
- 39 office shall be located in Jackson, Mississippi.
- 40 (2) (a) The department shall be headed by an executive
- 41 director who shall be appointed by the Governor with the advice
- 42 and consent of the Senate. The commission shall submit to the
- 43 Governor three (3) qualified nominees for the position of
- 44 executive director. The Governor shall appoint the executive
- 45 director from the list of qualified nominees submitted * * *. The
- 46 executive director may serve a term of four (4) years and shall be
- 47 eligible for reappointment at the end of each term. A
- 48 reappointment by the Governor shall be subject to the advice and
- 49 consent of the Senate. No person appointed by the Governor to
- 50 serve as executive director shall be eligible to take office

unless his name shall have been submitted to the Senate for its
advice and consent at least thirty (30) days prior to the
scheduled adjournment of the regular session of the Legislature
being held in the calendar year in which the term of the office of
the incumbent shall expire; however, if for any reason an
appointment is not given the advice and consent of the Senate
prior to the adjournment of such regular session, the Governor may
submit an appointment to the Senate for its advice and consent at
any time during a regular or extraordinary session of the
<u>Legislature.</u>
(b) When a vacancy occurs by the death, removal or
resignation of the incumbent, the incumbent's replacement shall be
appointed by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the
Senate, to serve for the remainder of the unexpired term, but the
appointment shall not be subject to the time constraints in
paragraph (a) of this subsection. Upon expiration of the
remainder of the term, the executive director shall be eligible
for reappointment by the Governor, with the advice and consent of
the Senate, for a four-year term as provided in paragraph (a) of
this subsection.
(c) The executive director may assign those powers and
duties as deemed appropriate to carry out the department's lawful
functions. Upon recommendation by the Governor to the commission,

the executive director may be removed from office only by both a

majority vote of the membership of the commission and the

- 76 Governor's approval of the removal. To remove the executive
- 77 director the commission must determine on sound evidence that
- 78 there is good cause for removal such as willful dereliction in
- 79 carrying out the duties of executive director, obvious malfeasance
- 80 in his actions as executive director or conviction of any criminal
- 81 act. After the determination is made by the commission that the
- 82 executive director should be removed from office, the commission
- shall notify the Governor of its determination and the Governor 83
- 84 must approve that determination before the executive director is
- 85 actually removed from office.
- 86 (3) The executive director shall appoint heads, who will
- serve at the pleasure of the executive director. 87
- 88 (4)The executive director shall have the authority to
- organize the department as deemed appropriate to carry out the 89
- 90 responsibilities of the department. The organizational charts of
- 91 the department shall be presented annually with the budget request
- 92 of the Governor for review by the Legislature.
- 93 The executive director shall develop and implement a (5)
- 94 merit promotion system for all sworn law enforcement officers.
- 95 Promotion to higher rank shall be based on an individual's merit
- 96 and length of service. The executive director shall implement the
- 97 merit promotion system before July 1, 1995.
- 98 There is hereby created the Division of Parks and
- 99 Recreation within the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks.
- 100 The division shall be headed by an executive director who shall be

101	appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the
102	Senate in the same manner provided in this section for the
103	executive director of the department.
104	(7) The Division of Parks and Recreation shall take all
105	actions to conform with the legislative intent of Section 49-4-1
106	and may take any actions authorized for the department in Section
107	55-3-33(a), (b), (c), (d), (e), (f) and (g).
108	SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from
109	and after July 1, 2022.
