## SENATE BILL NO. 2537

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 45-13-15, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO REDUCE A VIOLATION OF THE ARTICLE THAT REGULATES THE SALE AND 3 STORAGE OF FIREWORKS FROM A FELONY TO A MISDEMEANOR; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 4 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 45-13-15, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6 7 amended as follows: 45-13-15. Any person, firm, partnership or corporation 8 9 violating any provision of this article shall be guilty of a \* \* \* 10 misdemeanor, and shall be punished by a fine not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) \* \* \* or imprisonment in the county 11 12 jail \* \* \* for a term not to exceed one (1) year, or both a fine and term of imprisonment. In addition to said criminal penalties, 13 14 any person, firm, partnership or corporation violating any provision of this article shall be responsible for any and all 15 injuries, deaths and property damage caused by or resulting from 16 17 illegal fireworks sold by such person, firm, partnership or corporation which is prohibited by this article within the State 18 19 of Mississippi, and any injured person or his legal G1/2 S. 20 representatives, shall have a right to bring a civil action against the dealer, distributor or manufacturer or person who sold 21 22 said fireworks, whether said dealer, distributor or manufacturer 23 or person be located in this state or not. Any dealer, 24 distributor or manufacturer or person located outside of this 25 state who shall sell fireworks in Mississippi shall make, 26 constitute and appoint the Secretary of State as their lawful 27 agent for service of process in any civil proceeding brought under 28 the provisions of this article, to recover all damages caused or 29 resulting from the sale of any fireworks prohibited by this 30 article.

31 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 32 and after July 1, 2022.
