## SENATE BILL NO. 2601

1 AN ACT TO CREATE THE MISSISSIPPI PINK ALERT SYSTEM ACT OF 2 2022; TO PROVIDE CERTAIN DEFINITIONS; TO PROVIDE THE CRITERIA TO REOUEST AN ACTIVATION FOR A PINK ALERT; TO PROVIDE THE CRITERIA 3 FOR ACTIVATION OF A PINK ALERT; TO PROVIDE CERTAIN DUTIES OF LOCAL 4 5 LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES AND THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY 6 RELATING TO THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE ACT; TO PROVIDE THE 7 PROCEDURE THAT LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES AND THE DEPARTMENT OF 8 PUBLIC SAFETY MUST FOLLOW WHEN A MISSING PERSON CASE DOES NOT MEET 9 THE PINK ALERT CRITERIA; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

SECTION 1. (1) This section shall be known and cited as the "Mississippi Pink Alert System Act of 2022."

13 (2) As used in this section, the following terms shall have 14 the meanings ascribed herein unless the context clearly requires 15 otherwise:

(a) "E911" means Enhanced Universal Emergency Number
Service or Enhanced 911 Service, which is a telephone exchange
communications service by which a Public Safety Answering Point
designated by the county or local communication district may
receive telephone calls dialed to the telephone number 911.

(b) "First responders" means state and local law
enforcement personnel, fire department personnel, emergency
medical personnel, emergency management personnel and public works
personnel who may be deployed to bioterrorism attacks, terrorist
attacks, catastrophic or natural disasters and emergencies.

(c) "Originating local law enforcement agency" means a
local police or sheriff's office that has jurisdiction over the
area where a person became missing.

29 The Bureau of Investigation of the Department of (3) (a) Public Safety shall implement a statewide "Pink Alert System" that 30 31 has the purpose of providing a tiered, rapid response system to 32 notify the public about missing endangered female children, who 33 are age thirteen (13) years to seventeen (17) years, who are suspected victims of sex trafficking. The initial response may be 34 35 local, statewide or national based on available information about 36 the missing person.

37 (b) A Pink Alert activation request may be made only by 38 a law enforcement agency, and the Bureau of Investigation of the 39 Department of Public Safety may only activate a Pink Alert after a 40 request is made.

41 (c) To activate a Pink Alert, all of the following42 criteria must be met:

43 (i) The missing female child, age thirteen (13)
44 years old to seventeen (17) years old, is believed to have been a
45 victim of sex trafficking;

48 (iii) The family, legal caregiver or custodian of 49 the missing person has submitted a missing person's report to the 50 local law enforcement agency in the jurisdiction where the person 51 became missing, with all waiting periods being waived; and

(iv) The law enforcement agency that has jurisdiction of where the person became missing reports the incident to the Bureau of Investigation of the Department of Public Safety through the Mississippi Highway Patrol Headquarters Communication Center.

(d) To initiate a request to activate a Pink Alert, the family, legal caregiver or custodian of the missing person must file immediately a report of the missing person with the local law enforcement agency where the person became missing that includes the following information:

62 (i) A description of the missing person including63 physical characteristics, clothing and photos, if available;

(ii) A description of the known circumstances
under which the person became missing including the time, place,
direction, possible destinations, whether the person was walking
or in a vehicle, and all other pertinent information concerning
where the person may have become missing; and

69 (iii) Updates on the missing person as new70 information becomes available.

S. B. No. 2601 **~ OFFICIAL ~** 22/SS36/R963 PAGE 3 (ens\kr) (e) The originating local law enforcement agency, after completing the investigation expeditiously and determining that the case meets the qualifying criteria prescribed in this section, shall:

(i) Waive any waiting periods for a missing person's report in order to galvanize the appropriate communities rapidly to assist in the search for and the safe recovery of the missing person in the case of a Pink Alert;

(ii) Notify the Mississippi Highway Patrol Headquarters Communication Center and electronically send to the center the completed Pink Alert forms and available photos, signed by the police chief, sheriff, commanding officer or his or her designee;

84 (iii) Enter the information into the National85 Crime Information Center (NCIC);

86 (iv) Using a tiered approach based on known 87 circumstances, initiate an alert bulletin to all local law 88 enforcement, E911 and first responder agencies to search the 89 immediate area;

90 (v) Activate secondary alert systems to residents,
91 businesses, and broadcast media in the immediate area;

92 (vi) Provide a twenty-four-hour phone number to 93 receive calls while continuing the investigation; and

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94 (vii) Update the family, legal caregiver or
95 custodian of the missing person as new information becomes
96 available.

97 (a) After the Bureau of Investigation of the Department (4) 98 of Public Safety has been contacted by a local law enforcement 99 agency requesting a Pink Alert activation, the Criminal 100 Information Center shall consider before the activation of the Pink Alert procedures by the Pink Alert coordinator, or his or her 101 102 designee, the information contained in the initial Pink Alert 103 report form to ensure that it meets all criteria specified in 104 subsection (3) (c) of this section. Elements of the missing person case to be considered are: 105

106 (i) Threat of imminent harm or death to the
107 missing person because of age, health, mental or physical
108 disability, environmental or weather conditions;

(ii) Time of initial report in relation to the time of disappearance, including whether the disappearance is unexplained, involuntary or is under suspicious circumstances;

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(iii) Witness information;

113 (iv) Possible domestic dispute involving the 114 missing person; and

(v) Other facts that indicate the missing person is in danger of serious injury or death, including whether there is possible criminal intent toward the missing person or whether someone witnessed the disappearance.

S. B. No. 2601 ~ OFFICIAL ~ 22/SS36/R963 PAGE 5 (ens\kr) (b) Each case shall be reviewed on its own merits, and if there are extenuating circumstances, the required criteria in this section may be amended or expanded depending on the merits presented.

(c) Only the Pink Alert coordinator, or his or her designee, may authorize activation of a statewide Pink Alert and if an activation is authorized, the Criminal Information Center shall:

127 (i) Prepare an announcement concerning the missing128 person;

129 (ii) Contact the designated media stations to130 activate the alert; and

131 (iii) Request the Mississippi Department of132 Transportation to activate electronic signs, if appropriate.

(d) If the missing person is believed to be in a vehicle, the Pink Alert coordinator shall send information and available photos via emails and fax to the statewide communications systems, news media and other forms of public communication or electronic resources.

(5) (a) Following the initial alert, a Pink Alert
broadcast shall be updated by television and radio stations as
necessary until such time that an end of alert message is received
from the law enforcement agency that requested the initial Pink
Alert.

No. 2601 22/SS36/R963 PAGE 6 (ens\kr) (b) Local and statewide broadcast stations shall exercise their own independent discretions as to whether to repeat the required broadcasts prescribed in this section more frequently and shall determine the frequency in which the alert is re-broadcast following the initial alert.

(c) The Pink Alert termination notification shall be issued twenty-four (24) hours after the airing of the latest and most current information or when the case has been resolved and verification from the originating local law enforcement agency has been received by the Department of Public Safety.

(6) (a) If the circumstances of a person's disappearance do not meet the criteria for a Pink Alert to activate statewide communication systems, the Bureau of Investigation of the Department of Public Safety may offer an alternate form of mass notification as provided in this section.

(b) The alternate form of mass notification may be an email that includes a photograph and the Pink Alert initial reporting form that is sent through a statewide network of law enforcement and first responder agencies, news media offices and other forms of public communication.

(c) The email authorized in paragraph (b) of this subsection (6) shall contain information taken from the Pink Alert initial reporting form that is submitted by the originating local law enforcement agency.

171 "The (name of law enforcement agency) has requested the 172 following information be provided to the Mississippi 173 news media and law enforcement agencies: At the 174 present time, information being provided to the 175 Mississippi Department of Public Safety by the (name of law enforcement agency) does not meet the criteria to 176 activate a Pink Alert. It is left to the discretion of 177 178 each law enforcement agency and news department 179 receiving this email as to whether the attached 180 information, regarding the disappearance of this person 181 and/or the photograph of this person, will be released 182 to the public."

(e) If further investigation into the disappearance
produces evidence that may change the initial circumstances as
reported to local law enforcement, the Department of Public Safety
may reconsider activating a Pink Alert.

187 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 188 and after July 1, 2022.

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
