SENATE BILL NO. 2672

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 71-3-9, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REVISE THE EXCLUSIVE REMEDY PROVISION UNDER THE WORKERS'
- 3 COMPENSATION LAW TO EXEMPT GROSS NEGLIGENT CLAIMS WHERE THE INJURY
- 4 WAS SUBSTANTIALLY CERTAIN TO OCCUR; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 6 **SECTION 1.** This act shall be known and may be cited as the
- 7 "Wells Middleton Law."
- 8 **SECTION 2.** Section 71-3-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 9 amended as follows:
- 71-3-9. (1) Except as provided under subsection (2) of this
- 11 section, the liability of an employer to pay compensation shall be
- 12 exclusive and in place of all other liability of such employer to
- 13 the employee, his legal representative, husband or wife, parents,
- 14 dependents, next of kin, and anyone otherwise entitled to recover
- 15 damages at common law or otherwise from such employer on account
- 16 of such injury or death, except * * * as follows:
- 17 (a) If an employer fails to secure payment of

- 18 compensation as required by this chapter, an injured employee, or
- 19 his legal representative in case death results from the injury,

- 20 may elect to claim compensation under this chapter, or to maintain
- 21 an action at law for damages on account of such injury or death.
- 22 In such action the defendant may not plead as a defense that the
- 23 injury was caused by the negligence of a fellow servant, nor that
- 24 the employee assumed the risk of his employment, nor that the
- 25 injury was due to the contributory negligence of the
- 26 employee * * *; or
- 27 (b) When an injured employee, or his legal
- 28 representative in case death results from the injury, can
- 29 demonstrate that the employee's injury or death on the job was
- 30 caused by the employer's gross negligence where injury was
- 31 substantially certain to occur.
- 32 (2) An employer shall not be liable under this chapter to a
- 33 first responder, as defined in Section 25-15-403, if such first
- 34 responder elects to receive benefits under the "Mississippi First
- 35 Responders Health and Safety Act."
- 36 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 37 and after July 1, 2022.
