## SENATE BILL NO. 2803

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 25-3-25, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO INCREASE THE ANNUAL SALARIES OF SHERIFFS FOR COUNTIES WITH A CERTAIN POPULATION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 5 **SECTION 1.** Section 25-3-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 6 amended as follows:
- 7 25-3-25. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsections
- 8 (2) through (9), the salaries of sheriffs of the various counties
- 9 are fixed as full compensation for their services.
- 10 The annual salary for each sheriff shall be based upon the
- 11 total population of his county according to the latest federal
- 12 decennial census in the following categories and for the following
- 13 amounts; however, no sheriff shall be paid less than the salary
- 14 authorized under this section to be paid the sheriff based upon
- 15 the population of the county according to the most recent federal
- 16 decennial census:

- 17 (a) For counties with a total population of more than
- 18 two hundred thousand (200,000), a salary of One Hundred Sixty
- 19 Thousand Dollars (\$160,000.00).
- 20 (b) For counties with a total population of more than
- 21 one hundred fifty thousand (150,000) and not more than two hundred
- 22 thousand (200,000), a salary of One Hundred Twenty-five Thousand
- 23 Dollars (\$125,000.00).
- 24 (\*\*\*c) For counties with a total population of more
- 25 than one hundred thousand (100,000) and not more than one hundred
- 26 fifty thousand (150,000), a salary of Ninety-nine Thousand Dollars
- 27 (\$99,000.00).
- 28 ( \* \* \*d) For counties with a total population of more
- 29 than forty-five thousand (45,000) and not more than one hundred
- 30 thousand (100,000), a salary of Ninety Thousand Dollars
- 31 (\$90,000.00).
- (\* \* \*e) For counties with a total population of more
- 33 than thirty-four thousand (34,000) and not more than forty-five
- 34 thousand (45,000), a salary of Eighty-five Thousand Dollars
- 35 (\$85,000.00).
- 36 (\* \* \*f) For counties with a total population of more
- 37 than fifteen thousand (15,000) and not more than thirty-four
- 38 thousand (34,000), a salary of Eighty Thousand Dollars
- 39 (\$80,000.00).



40 ( * * *g) For counties with a total population of	of not
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- 41 more than fifteen thousand (15,000), a salary of Seventy-five
- 42 Thousand Dollars (\$75,000.00).
- 43 (2) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1)
- 44 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Leflore County, in
- 45 its discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the
- 46 county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars
- 47 (\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual
- 48 supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such
- 49 county for the following reasons:
- 50 (a) The Mississippi Department of Corrections operates
- 51 and maintains a restitution center within the county;
- 52 (b) The Mississippi Department of Corrections operates
- 53 and maintains a community work center within the county;
- 54 (c) There is a resident circuit court judge in the
- 55 county whose office is located at the Leflore County Courthouse;
- 56 (d) There is a resident chancery court judge in the
- 57 county whose office is located at the Leflore County Courthouse;
- 58 (e) The Magistrate for the Fourth Circuit Court
- 59 District is located in the county and maintains his office at the
- 60 Leflore County Courthouse;
- 61 (f) The Region VI Mental Health-Mental Retardation
- 62 Center, which serves a multicounty area, calls upon the sheriff to
- 63 provide security for out-of-town mental patients, as well as
- 64 patients from within the county;

65 (4	g) The	increased	activity	of	the	Child	Support
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- 66 Division of the Department of Human Services in enforcing in the
- 67 courts parental obligations has imposed additional duties on the
- 68 sheriff; and
- 69 (h) The dispatchers of the enhanced E-911 system in
- 70 place in Leflore County have been placed under the direction and
- 71 control of the sheriff.
- 72 (3) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1)
- 73 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Rankin County, in its
- 74 discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the
- 75 county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars
- 76 (\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual
- 77 supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such
- 78 county for the following reasons:
- 79 (a) The Mississippi Department of Corrections operates
- 80 and maintains the Central Mississippi Correctional Facility within
- 81 the county;
- 82 (b) The State Hospital is operated and maintained
- 83 within the county at Whitfield;
- 84 (c) Hudspeth Regional Center, a facility maintained for
- 85 the care and treatment of persons with an intellectual disability,
- 86 is located within the county;
- 87 (d) The Mississippi Law Enforcement Officers' Training
- 88 Academy is operated and maintained within the county;

89			(e) The	State	Fire	Academy	is	operated	and	maintained
90	within	the	county;							

- 91 (f) The Pearl River Valley Water Supply District,
- 92 ordinarily known as the "Reservoir District," is located within
- 93 the county;
- 94 (g) The Jackson-Medgar Wiley Evers International
- 95 Airport is located within the county;
- 96 (h) The patrolling of the state properties located
- 97 within the county has imposed additional duties on the sheriff;
- 98 and
- 99 (i) The sheriff, in addition to providing security to
- 100 the nearly one hundred thousand (100,000) residents of the county,
- 101 has the duty to investigate, solve and assist in the prosecution
- 102 of any misdemeanor or felony committed upon any state property
- 103 located in Rankin County.
- 104 (4) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1)
- 105 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Neshoba County shall
- 106 pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the county an amount
- 107 equal to Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00).
- 108 (5) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1)
- 109 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Tunica County, in its
- 110 discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the
- 111 county an amount equal to Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00),
- 112 payable beginning April 1, 1997.

113	(6) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1)
114	of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Hinds County shall
115	pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the county in an amount
116	equal to Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00). The Legislature
117	finds and declares that the annual supplement authorized by this
118	subsection is justified in such county for the following reasons:

- (a) Hinds County has the greatest population of any county, two hundred fifty-four thousand four hundred forty-one (254,441) by the 1990 census, being almost one hundred thousand
- 122 (100,000) more than the next most populous county;
- 123 (b) Hinds County is home to the State Capitol and the 124 seat of all state government offices;
- 125 (c) Hinds County is the third largest county in 126 geographic area, containing eight hundred seventy-five (875) 127 square miles;
- 128 (d) Hinds County is comprised of two (2) judicial
  129 districts, each having a courthouse and county office buildings;
- (e) There are four (4) resident circuit judges, four

  (4) resident chancery judges, and three (3) resident county judges

  in Hinds County, the most of any county, with the sheriff acting

  as chief executive officer and provider of bailiff services for

  all;
- 135 (f) The main offices for the clerk and most of the 136 judges and magistrates for the United States District Court for

137	the	Southern	District	of	Mississippi	are	located	within	the

- 138 county;
- 139 (g) The state's only urban university, Jackson State
- 140 University, is located within the county;
- 141 (h) The University of Mississippi Medical Center,
- 142 combining the medical school, dental school, nursing school and
- 143 hospital, is located within the county;
- 144 (i) Mississippi Veterans Memorial Stadium, the state's
- 145 largest sports arena, is located within the county;
- 146 (j) The Mississippi State Fairgrounds, including the
- 147 Coliseum and Trade Mart, are located within the county;
- 148 (k) Hinds County has the largest criminal population in
- 149 the state, such that the Hinds County Sheriff's Department
- 150 operates the largest county jail system in the state, housing
- 151 almost one thousand (1,000) inmates in three (3) separate
- 152 detention facilities;
- 153 (1) The Hinds County Sheriff's Department handles more
- 154 mental and drug and alcohol commitment cases than any other
- 155 sheriff's department in the state;
- 156 (m) The Mississippi Department of Corrections maintains
- 157 a restitution center within the county;
- 158 (n) The Mississippi Department of Corrections regularly
- 159 houses as many as one hundred (100) state convicts within the
- 160 Hinds County jail system; and



161	(o) The Hinds County Sheriff's Department is regularly
162	asked to provide security services not only at the Fairgrounds and
163	Memorial Stadium, but also for events at the Mississippi Museum of
164	Art and Jackson City Auditorium.

- 165 In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1) 166 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Wilkinson County, in 167 its discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars 168 169 (\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual 170 supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such 171 county because the Mississippi Department of Corrections contracts 172 for the private incarceration of state inmates at a private 173 correctional facility within the county.
- 174 In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1) of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Marshall County, in 175 176 its discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the 177 county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual 178 179 supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such 180 county because the Mississippi Department of Corrections contracts 181 for the private incarceration of state inmates at a private 182 correctional facility within the county.
- 183 In addition to the salary provided in subsection (1) of 184 this section, the Board of Supervisors of Greene County, in its discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the 185

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186	county	in	an	amount	not	to	exceed	Ten	Thousand	Dollars

- 187 (\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual
- supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such 188
- county for the following reasons: 189
- 190 The Mississippi Department of Corrections operates (a)
- 191 and maintains the South Mississippi Correctional Facility within
- 192 the county;
- In 1996, additional facilities to house another one 193
- 194 thousand four hundred sixteen (1,416) male offenders were
- constructed at the South Mississippi Correctional Facility within 195
- the county; and 196

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- 197 The patrolling of the state properties located
- 198 within the county has imposed additional duties on the sheriff
- 199 justifying additional compensation.
- 200 In addition to the salary provided in subsection (1) of
- 201 this section, the board of supervisors of any county, in its
- 202 discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the
- 203 county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars
- 204 (\$10,000.00). The amount of the supplement shall be spread on the
- 205 minutes of the board. The annual supplement authorized in this
- 206 subsection shall not be in addition to the annual supplements
- 207 authorized in subsections (2) through (9).
- 208 The salaries provided in this section shall be (11)
- 209 payable monthly on the first day of each calendar month by
- chancery clerk's warrant drawn on the general fund of the county; 210

- 211 however, the board of supervisors, by resolution duly adopted and
- 212 entered on its minutes, may provide that such salaries shall be
- 213 paid semimonthly on the first and fifteenth day of each month. If
- 214 a pay date falls on a weekend or legal holiday, salary payments
- 215 shall be made on the workday immediately preceding the weekend or
- 216 legal holiday.
- 217 (b) At least Ten Dollars (\$10.00) from each fee
- 218 collected and deposited into the county's general fund under the
- 219 provisions of paragraphs (a), (c) and (g) of subsection (1) of
- 220 Section 25-7-19 shall be used for the sheriffs' salaries
- 221 authorized in Section 25-3-25; as such Ten Dollar (\$10.00) amount
- 222 was authorized during the 2007 Regular Session in Chapter 331,
- 223 Laws of 2007, for the purpose of providing additional monies to
- 224 the counties for sheriffs' salaries.
- 225 (12) (a) All sheriffs, each year, shall attend twenty (20)
- 226 hours of continuing education courses in law enforcement. Such
- 227 courses shall be approved by the Mississippi Board on Law
- 228 Enforcement \* \* \* Officer Standards and Training. Such education
- 229 courses may be provided by an accredited law enforcement academy
- 230 or by the Mississippi Sheriffs' Association.
- 231 (b) The Mississippi Board on Law Enforcement Officer
- 232 Standards and Training shall reimburse each county for the
- 233 expenses incurred by sheriffs and deputy sheriffs for attendance
- 234 at any approved training programs as required by this subsection.

235 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 236 and after October 1, 2022.

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
