SENATE BILL NO. 2812

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 45-2-1, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REVISE THE DEFINITION OF "CAUSE OF DEATH" UNDER THE LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS AND FIRE FIGHTERS DEATH BENEFITS TRUST FUND TO INCLUDE THE SAFEGUARDING AMERICA'S FIRST RESPONDERS ACT AND OTHER FEDERAL LAWS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 7 **SECTION 1.** This act shall be known and may be cited as the
- 8 "Law Enforcement and Firefighters Death Benefits Act of 2022."
- 9 **SECTION 2.** Section 45-2-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 10 amended as follows:
- 11 45-2-1. (1) Whenever used in this section, the term:
- 12 (a) "Covered individual" means a law enforcement
- 13 officer or firefighter, including volunteer firefighters, as
- 14 defined in this section when employed by an employer as defined in
- 15 this section; it does not include employees of independent
- 16 contractors.
- 17 (b) "Employer" means a state board, commission,
- 18 department, division, bureau or agency, or a county, municipality

- 19 or other political subdivision of the state, which employs,
- 20 appoints or otherwise engages the services of covered individuals.
- 21 (c) "Firefighter" means an individual who is trained
- 22 for the prevention and control of loss of life and property from
- 23 fire or other emergencies, who is assigned to firefighting
- 24 activity, and is required to respond to alarms and perform
- 25 emergency actions at the location of a fire, hazardous materials
- 26 or other emergency incident.
- 27 (d) "Law enforcement officer" means any lawfully sworn
- 28 officer or employee of the state or any political subdivision of
- 29 the state whose duties require the officer or employee to
- 30 investigate, pursue, apprehend, arrest, transport or maintain
- 31 custody of persons who are charged with, suspected of committing,
- 32 or convicted of a crime, whether the officer is on regular duty on
- 33 full-time status, an auxiliary or reserve officer, or is serving
- 34 on a temporary or part-time status.
- 35 (e) "Cause of death" means any cause of death that
- 36 would be covered under the Public Safety Officers' Benefits Act of
- 37 1976 or the Hometown Heroes Survivors Benefits Act of 2003,
- 38 generally codified at 42 USCS Chapter 46, or the Safeguarding
- 39 America's First Responders Act of 2020 (Public Law 116-157), or
- 40 any other provision of federal law providing benefits for line of
- 41 duty deaths of first responders.
- 42 (2) (a) The Department of Public Safety shall make a
- 43 payment, as provided in this section, in the amount of One Hundred

- 44 Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) when a covered individual, while
- 45 engaged in the performance of the person's official duties, dies
- 46 or receives accidental or intentional bodily injury that results
- 47 in the loss of the covered individual's life and such death is the
- 48 result of a covered cause of death, provided that the death is not
- 49 the result of suicide and that the bodily injury is not
- 50 intentionally self-inflicted.
- 51 (b) The payment provided for in this subsection shall
- 52 be made to the beneficiary who was designated in writing by the
- 53 covered individual, signed by the covered individual and delivered
- 54 to the employer during the covered individual's lifetime. If no
- 55 such designation is made, then the payment shall be made to the
- 56 surviving child or children and spouse in equal portions, and if
- 57 there is no surviving child or spouse, then to the parent or
- 58 parents. If a beneficiary is not designated and there is no
- 59 surviving child, spouse or parent, then the payment shall be made
- 60 to the covered individual's estate.
- 61 (c) The payment made in this subsection is in addition
- 62 to any workers' compensation or pension benefits and is exempt
- 63 from the claims and demands of creditors of the covered
- 64 individual.
- 65 (3) (a) There is established in the State Treasury a
- 66 special fund to be known as the Law Enforcement Officers and Fire
- 67 Fighters Death Benefits Trust Fund. The trust fund shall be
- 68 funded by an initial appropriation of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars

- 69 (\$200,000.00), and shall be comprised of any additional funds made
- 70 available by the Legislature or by donation, contribution, gift or
- 71 any other source.
- 72 (b) The State Treasurer shall invest the monies of the
- 73 trust fund in any of the investments authorized for the funds of
- 74 the Public Employees' Retirement System under Section 25-11-121,
- 75 and those investments shall be subject to the limitations
- 76 prescribed by Section 25-11-121.
- 77 (c) Unexpended amounts remaining in the trust fund at
- 78 the end of the state fiscal year shall not lapse into the State
- 79 General Fund, and any income earned on amounts in the trust fund
- 80 shall be deposited to the credit of the trust fund.
- 81 (4) The Department of Public Safety shall be responsible for
- 82 the management of the trust fund and the disbursement of death
- 83 benefits authorized under this section. The Department of Public
- 84 Safety shall adopt rules and regulations necessary to implement
- 85 and standardize the payment of death benefits under this section,
- 86 to administer the trust fund created by this section and to carry
- 87 out the purposes of this section.
- 88 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 89 and after its passage.
